(iv) Proposed amendment to the Revised Ordinances on M.Phil and Ph.D Programmes.

Dr.R.K.Pathak, Head, Department of Anthropology has proposed the following amendments to the Revised Ordinances OC-4 and OC-5 on the Ph.D and M.Phil programmes respectively.

1. In Clause 1(3)(iv) of OC-4 regarding admission eligibility for the Ph.D programme, the words "recognised by ^{NERHU}" may be added so that the provision reads as follows:-

"Persons who have completed at least one year of research in a research laboratory/institute recognised by ^{NERHU}"

2. In both the ordinances, the word "his" and "he", may be replaced by the words "his/her" and "he/she" respectively.

In terms of clause 1(a) of Regulation OC-4/R-2, the School Board of Human and Environmental Sciences in its meeting held on the 5th May, 1995 considered the Report of the Inspection Committee in respect of the Anthropology Survey of India, Shillong and recommended that the Anthropology Survey of India may be granted recognition as a centre Laboratory. The Report of the Inspection Committee is placed at Annexure - 'A' before the Council for consideration.

REPORT OF THE INSPECTION TEAM TO CONSIDER RECOGNITION OF ANTHROPOLOGICAL SURVEY OF INDIA, NORTH-EAST REGIONAL OFFICE, SHILLONG, AS A RESEARCH CENTRE

An Inspection team consisting of the following members visited the office of A.S.I, Shillong on 20.03.95:

1. Professor A.K. Ghosh (Chairman)
2. Dr.R.K. Pathak, Reader (Member)
3. Dr.T.B. Subba, Reader (Member)

General Observations

1. The North East Regional Office of A.S.I was established in 1953 at Shillong and has been carrying out anthropological investigation among the people of Meghalaya, Assam, Manipur, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland and Mizoram.
2. The sanctioned staff strength of this Centre during 1993-94 was 79 of which 54 belonged to non-ministerial and 25 belonged to ministerial categories.
3. The total budget grant (Revenue) of this office during the year under report was 6.88 lakhs and 24.56 lakhs towards the Plan and Non-Plan sectors, respectively.
4. The office has at present the effective strength of 40 scientific and 6 technical personnels.
5. It has two field stations, one each in Manipur and Arunachal Pradesh.
6. The total number of books in the office's library is 283. Besides it receives 24 international and 24 national journals.

It has the following divisions at present:

- i) Physical Anthropology
- ii) Cultural Anthropology
- iii) Human Ecology
- iv) Linguistics
- v) Psychology
- vi) Statistics
- vii) Zonal Museum
- viii) Photo Laboratory

8. At present there are 10 national projects being carried out by this office of which 3 are in Physical Anthropology stream.

Specific Observations

1. This is the Regional Office which initiated anthropological research (including various subdiscipline and allied disciplines of Anthropology) in this part of the country since early 1950's, long before this University (NEHU) came into existence.

2. In this office all scientific and technical staff are academically qualified and competent to do research in anthropological and allied fields, and in fact they have been constantly carrying out rescraches in various States of this region.

3. It may also be noted that since A.S.I is an all India Central organisation and an apex body in anthropological research, the various offices located in different states in this country are already recognised by various Universities like, Calcutta University, Nagpur University, Mysore University, Panjab University, Gauhati University, etc.

4. It may also be noted that this University (NEHU) Department to a great extent has been depending on this Regional Office of A.S.I for laboratory equipment, books and journals, museum and research materials, etc. In fact, the Department of Anthropology is in constant academic interaction with this Regional Office of A.S.I.

5. From time to time this University department has been receiving donations in form of books, Photographs, etc. from this Regional Office of A.S.I.

6. As mentioned earlier, many of the Scientific and Technical Staffs of this Regional Office (A.S.I.) who are academically eligible to do Ph.D work are interested in pursuing their research interest with the Department of Anthropology, NEHU, and many of them infact are doing Ph.D in Gauhati University, Calcutta University etc. since we have not officially given recognition to this Regional Office of A.S.I.

7. It may also be noted that often this University has been inviting staff of A.S.I. Regional Office to act as External Examiners

both at Post-Graduate and Under-Graduate levels, as well as for evaluation of M.Phil and Ph.D theses.

Recommendation

Keeping the above in view, the Inspection Team is satisfied to recommend the Anthropological Survey of India North East Regional Office as worthy of recognising as a research centre by North Eastern Hill University, Shillong, and also recommends that their qualified staff may be allowed to join M.Phil and Ph.D programmes, as per University rules and regulations.

 ii) Subject :- Equation of the M.Ed Degree with M.A(Education) Degree.

The 42 nd Meeting of the Academic Council had resolved that two year M.Ed Degree could be treated as equivalent to a P.G.Degree provided the number of years spent from P.U. to the obtaining of the Degree and the papers approved at the M.Ed are equivalent. The School Board in Education was requested to look into the aspects and submit its recommendations.

The School Board of Education considered the matter in its meeting held on 24th April,1992 and recommended that the two year M.Ed and the M.A.(Education) Degree of this University be treated as equivalent, the number of years of studying and the number of courses studied being same.

The 44th Meeting of the A.C.,however, resolved as follows :-

" (ii) Equation of the M.Ed Degree with M.A. (Education) Degree - Request of Mrs Irene Zopari Sailo and the recommendation of the School Board(Education)

No : AC:44:92:5:05(ii): The Council considered the equation of M.Ed with the M.A. in Education Degree. After threadbare discussion the Council RESOLVED to refer the matter to the Equivalence Committee of the University".

The Equivalence Committee in its meeting on 24.5.95 considered the matter and it is of the view that as per provisions of Ordinance OC.9, the subject matter does not come within the functions of the Committee.Hence the matter is referred back to the Academic Council for decision.

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- ii) Enhancement of remuneration rates for P.G./M.Phil/Ph.D Examination works.

The General Secretary, NEHUTA has forwarded a proposed for enhancement of remuneration rates for various examination works pertaining to P.G., M.Phil and Ph.D. Exams. The proposal is placed as Annexure ..A.....

In this connections statement showing the existing rates of Under-Graduate and Post Graduate are placed as Annexure...B.....

The statement shows that the existing rates of P.G. Exams are higher than that of U.G. rates. It is apprehended that if the rates of P.G. Exams are only enhanced, similar proposals for enhancement of rates of Under-Graduate exams are likely to come. This might lead to a chain of enhancement of rates.

Therefore, it is submitted that P.G. Exam rates which have little link with U.G. Exam rates may only be considered. The proposal is submitted as Annexure.F. for consideration of the Council.

Dear Sri Masood,

Please refer to your D.O.letter NO.F.8-32/94-Desk(u) dated: 1.5.95 forwarding a copy of letter of even No. dated: 26.4.95 addressed to the Secretary, UGC in the matter of establishment of the Post Graduate (PG) Centre under NEHU at TURA in the Garo Hills. My comments on the different items contained in the aforesaid letter dated: 26.4.95 are as under:

1. Both the departments of Mathematics & Economics at Shillong Campus have expressed with justification their inability to spare any of the existing faculty members of their departments for the PG Centre at Tura since any transfer/ relocation of such ^{faculty} members will adversely affect the on-going courses at Shillong and hence will jeopardise the academic career of the students of these disciplines. I may, therefore, suggest that pending recruitment of the teaching staff for the disciplines at Tura, the faculty positions may be filled on contract basis.
2. Since NEHU employees of the erstwhile Nagaland Campus, Kohima and of the School of Agriculture & Rural Development (SASARD, Medziphema) will revert back to NEHU on 1.1.96 and are likely to be posted at TURA, steps may please be taken to acquire land, buildings and other infrastructure for all the departments belonging to erstwhile Nagaland Campus and SASARD well before the employees aforesaid are positioned in Tura. This will ensure the smooth functioning of all the departments and proper deployment of staff without loss of time. Further the same infrastructure that has been provided to NEHU Nagaland Campus and SASARD has to be provided to NEHU Tura Campus. If desired, the detailed estimates on the required infrastructure for the Tura Campus which will also include SASARD will be submitted by NEHU.
3. It will be possible for NEHU to meet the recurring expenditure in the maintenance of the Tura Centre with the proposed two disciplines in Mathematics & Economics out of the maintenance grant to be received from the UGC earmark for the purpose. We have yet to receive such grant as per your direction to UGC. However, the maintenance of the NEHU employees on their repatriation from Nagaland University may not be possible unless additional funds are released separately for the purpose by the UGC.
4. There is no scope to divert Plan funds of NEHU towards the development of the PG Centre at Tura since the allocation to NEHU Campuses at Shillong, Mizoram and the Pachhunga University College, Aizawl has already been made and utilised accordingly. As such, the allocation made to the erstwhile NEHU Kohima Campus and SASARD, Medziphema may be diverted towards the development of the Tura Centre for which orders may be issued immediately.
5. Other modalities in connection with the Tura PG Centre will be intimated on hearing from you on the above proposals.

Please refer to the above-mentioned letter and also to the discussion I had with the Vice-Chancellor and you. I discussed the matter with six of my colleagues who are in station (two are away at the moment). I also had the opportunity to visit Tura for a college inspection tour from 11th May to 13th May, '95; I utilised this occasion to discuss the above matter with some academic personalities there. The consensus that emerged from these discussions is the following:

- (1) We are certainly happy at the recognition given by the Ministry of H.R.D. to Mathematics as a fundamental discipline to be introduced in the Tura campus.
- (2) Our department is already understaffed. Only nine out of fourteen sanctioned posts have been filled. The departmental library, computer and other facilities have been oriented towards the specialisations of teachers working in Shillong campus. A few of my colleagues have applied for positions in other universities. In view of this it does not seem feasible to transfer/relocate teachers from Shillong campus to Tura campus.
- (3) It was strongly felt that undergraduate education in Sciences should be strengthened in Garo Hills. In order to do so a University College of Science imparting quality undergraduate education may be established there. Starting of such a college can take place side by side with the development of a postgraduate centre. A well-developed university college would have a substantial output of honours graduates in natural sciences and mathematics. These graduates would constitute the required input for the various science departments in the P.G. Campus in Tura (as well as in Shillong), and will make these departments viable.

Narasaraju, deptt. of Chemistry, NEHU and convener of Inspection Team visited the Don Bosco College, Tura on 12.5.95. The Team had a discussion with the Principal of the college on the scheme for introduction of Major courses in Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics, Botany & Zoology and inspected the laboratory of the college and found that the college had all the infrastructural requirements for the purpose. It is also found that the college is not fulfilling the required number of teachers in the campus as applied for. However, the Adl. D.P.I. who is also a member of the Team reported that the college will be brought under the District Grant in Aid Scheme very soon, where the required number of teachers for the different courses in the college will be sanctioned by the Government.

In view of the observances the team recommends for provisional affiliation for introduction of Major courses in the above-mentioned subjects for a period of 3 years.

Following the decision of the Academic Council No. AC:47:93:04:(i) held on 7.12.93 the Executive Council as per its resolution No.81:93:6:06(iii) decided to consider the promotion of Readers to the rank of Professor in the scale of Rs.4500-150-5700 provided the teacher concerned has 8 years teaching/research experience and fulfills other conditions as laid down the Merit Promotion scheme formulated by U.G.C. in 1983.

The decision of the Executive Council was also subject to the condition that the scheme will be subject to U.G.C.'s approval and in case the U.G.C. does not approve the same, the promottee teachers shall revert back and the excess salary paid shall be refunded/recovered.

The Executive Council in its 81st meeting held on 9.12.93 vide resolution No.81:93:6:06:(iii) resolved to consider the promotion of Readers to the post of Professor in the scale of Rs.4500-150-5700 provided the teacher concerned has 8 years teaching/research experience and fulfills other conditions laid down in the Guidelines for Merit Promotion Scheme formulated by UGC in 1983 and continued under the Fourth Pay revision.

The other criteria to be followed for such promotion are as follows :-

- (i) The applications of individual teachers will be referred to two external subject experts for assessment of the work of the teacher concerned.
- (ii) The evaluation reports of these experts will be placed in the Selection Committee. The teacher concerned will have to appear before the Selection Committee for personal interview. On the recommendation of the Selection Committee promotion may be made by the University.

Further, the above scheme of promotion will be subject to U.G.C.'S approval and in case the UGC does not approve the same, the promotee teachers shall revert back and the excess salary paid shall be refunded/re-covered.

In view of the above, the eligible/interested teachers may submit their application in triplicate in the prescribed form (enclosed) alongwith the copies of publications, book, reviews, research work etc. in three sets. The application may be routed through the Head of the Department/Centre or the Dean of the School as the case may be.

At the time of submission of the application for the said promotion, it may be noted that every teacher is required to give an undertaking in the prescribed proforma (enclosed).

A teacher who already derived benefit under the Merit promotion Scheme, need not apply as the matter relating to double benefit once under M.F.S. and again under the present scheme is yet to be decided upon. Further, the question of inter-seniority and the other usual privileges to which a Professor is entitled are yet to be decided by the University.

It may kindly be recalled that at the time of revision of pay scales of teachers in Universities and Colleges w.e.f.1.1.86, it was resolved by the Commission that more posts of Professors and Readers will be created in the Universities and Colleges to broaden the channel of open selection and the U.G.C. would also evolve suitable criteria for the purpose accordingly.
