The Academic Council in its 80th meeting held on 3.10.2008 vide Resolution No:AC:80:2008:5:1(ii) considered the Enhancement of minimum number of teachers required for grant of provisional/affiliation to B.com programme (amendment to RB-2, Under OB-6). The Council Resolved to incorporate in Clause (v) of RB-2 the wording 'at least five teachers for each subject as per Annexure I.'

The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.

ON MINIMUM STAFFING REQUIREMENT
(Under Ordinance OB-6)

1. Subject to the provision as laid down in the Regulations concerning the duties of the teachers and minimum number of classes per week, the minimum staffing requirement of a College shall be as prescribed below.
 - (i) No College shall be granted affiliation if it fails to satisfy such minimum requirement.
 - (ii) Three year degree Course, Science (General). At least four teachers for each subject.
 - (iii) Three year degree course, Science (Honours). At least five teachers for each subject.
 - (iv) Three year degree course (per Programme) Arts/Commerce (General). At least three teachers for each subject.
 - (v) Three year degree course, (per programmes). (Honours) Arts/Commerce for each subject. At least five teachers for each subject.

NOTE: However in a College where English is taught only as a compulsory subject there shall be at least four teachers. But in a college where English/MIL is also taught as Honours subject there shall be at least five teachers in each subject.

Principal: A principal of a college shall be a whole time officer, preferably with administrative experience. The age of retirement and qualifications for the post will be as per UGC norms.

Provided that in special cases of outstanding merit and or administrative ability, the length of experience may be relaxed upto five years. His minimum age will be 35 years and will not exceed in any case beyond 62 years.

3. **Lecturer:** As per UGC norms.


The Committee discussed and deliberated on the issue of declaring Centre for Science Education as vocational Centre.

University had notified certain Centres/ Department as non-vacational vide notification No. F.12-1/Estt-II/85-1302 dated 09/12/1985 in which at serial No. 4 Centre for School Science and Mathematics was also listed. Regulation RA-9 on Centres of Studies lists Unit for Science Education under the Centre for Supportive Learning Systems. However, Academic Council reorganised these Centres. Accordingly, Centre for Science Education (CSE) has now been placed under School of Physical Sciences.


The matter of declaring Centres as vocational came up before Academic Council in November 2000. Academic Council vide Resolution No. AC:64:2000:5:8 (ix) reiterated the above notification dated 09/12/1985 declaring the Centres as non-vacational.

The Committee considered the functions of Centres as laid down in Ordinance OA-11 clause (3) and also the activities of the CSE as included in the Annual Reports of the University for the periods 2004-05, 2005-06 and 2006-07. Ordinance OA-11 clause (3) does not provide for regular courses nor the CSE is running any regular courses. Since the Executive Council in its meeting held on 14/02/1984 resolved to approve some Centres as non-vacational on the ground "... they do not enrol students nor hold regular classes", the Committee is of the opinion that the CSE may continue to be treated as non-vacational.

However, the Committee would like to bring to the notice of Academic Council that 'teachers of the University are allowed a period of vacation'. Since teachers attached/ placed in CSE may also be governed by the same service conditions, this may introduce an element of contradiction. Academic Council may like to consider this.

(Under Ordinance on Professional Courses : OC-16)

3. Lateral entry

A) For being eligible to seek lateral entry to B. Tech degree programme at the second year/third semester level, a candidate must have passed the diploma in Engineering in the relevant branch with a minimum of 60% marks in aggregate from any recognized institution through a minimum of three years of institutional study after Class 10/SSLC Examination.

B) Selection of candidates will be based on an entrance test and the merit ranking in this test shall be the basis for admission.

C) Extent of lateral entry shall be up to a maximum of 5% of the sanctioned seats as given in Clause 2(A), which shall be supernumerary.

4. Duration & programme structure

A) The courses shall be of 4(four) academic years. Each academic year shall consist of 2(two) semesters. Each semester shall have a minimum of 90 working days inclusive of semester examination.

B) The programme shall consist of courses as detailed in the syllabus approved by the academic council.

3. Duration & programme structure

A) The courses shall be of 4(four) academic years. Each academic year shall consist of 2(two) semesters. Each semester shall have a minimum of 90 working days inclusive of semester examination.

4. Examination

G) A student must attend a minimum of 75% classes in each course during a semester to be eligible to appear in the end semester examinations.

5. Examination

A) A candidate shall apply for admission to end-semester examination to the Dean of the School through Head of a Department who shall certify that all dues, including examination fee, have been paid.

B) Each subject taken by a student in a semester shall consist of the following:

- i) Sessional examination (Theory and/or Practical)
- ii) End semester examination (Theory and/or Practical)

C) For the purpose of determining the marks obtained by a student in any paper of the programme, the weightage assigned to sessional work and end semester examination shall be in the ratio of 2:3.

F) A student must attend a minimum of 75% classes in each course during a semester to be eligible to appear in the end semester examinations.

G) The Dean of the School may consider and decide, on request from the candidate through the Head of a Department, for condonation of shortage of attendance up to 5%. Condonation of any shortage more than 5% and less than 15%

attendance up to 5%. Condonation of any shortage more than 5% and less than 15% may be recommended by the Head of Department & Dean of the School to the Vice-Chancellor with full justification. The decision of the Vice-Chancellor shall be final.

I) A candidate falling short of the required attendance in a paper in a semester shall not be permitted to sit for the end semester examination of that paper.

J) A candidate failing sessionals in any paper shall not be permitted to appear at the end semester examination of that paper.

K) Ordinarily a student should complete the entire programme during the period of eight semesters. However, a student may be allowed to participate in the academic programme up to a maximum of 12 consecutive semesters.

L) A student may repeat examination of a paper along with regular examinations of the concerned semester by paying the prescribed fee.

M) A student shall be allowed to continue the studies till the end of 4th semester irrespective of the number of failures in earlier semesters. But she/he will not be promoted to 5th semester unless she/he has cleared at least 50% of courses up to 4th semester, failing which her/his name shall be struck off the rolls.

N) A student satisfying clause 5 – F) to I) above will be allowed to sit for the end semester examination on payment of the prescribed fees separately for each semester examination in which the candidate desires to appear.

5. Evaluation

Evaluation for each paper shall be done on the basis of performance in continuous sessional assessment and end-semester examination.

H) A candidate falling short of the required attendance in a paper in a semester shall not be permitted to sit for the end semester examination of that paper.

I) Ordinarily a student admitted to the first/third (lateral entry) semester should complete the entire programme during the period of eight/six (lateral entry) semesters. However, a student may be allowed to participate in the academic programme up to a maximum of twelve/ten (lateral entry) consecutive semesters.

J) Students who fail to appear or secure grade point 0 in a paper may repeat examination in that paper along with regular examinations of the concerned semester by paying the prescribed fee. No student shall however be allowed to appear more than three times in a paper including the regular one, but within the maximum period described in clause 5 (I).

6. Grading

The grade points and the corresponding description, percentage of marks and the division shall be as follows:

6. Award of degree/class

A) Candidate (a) securing 50% marks in aggregate and (b) who has cleared all papers shall qualify for the award of a degree.

B) Candidates securing a minimum of 65% marks in aggregate shall qualify for a 1st class and those securing 50% marks and above but below 65% marks shall qualify for a 2nd class.

7. Grade Cards

A) After the results of a semester are declared, Grade Cards will be issued to each candidate which will contain the list of papers for that semester and the grades obtained by the candidate.

B) The Grade Point Average (GPA) for each semester will be calculated only for those students who have passed all the papers of that semester. GPA will be calculated as follows:

$$GPA = \frac{\sum_1^n (C_i \cdot GP_i)}{\sum_1^n (C_i)}$$

where C_i is the number of credits of a paper, GP_i is the grade point scored in that paper and n is the total number of papers in a particular semester.

C) On successful completion of the programme, the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) will be calculated as follows:

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum_1^N (C_i \cdot GP_i)}{\sum_1^N (C_i)}$$

where N is the total number of papers for the B.Tech. programme.

8. Award of Degree/Division

A) B.Tech. degree shall be awarded on the basis of evaluation of a candidate out of a total of 8000 marks and in order to qualify for the award of B.Tech. degree a student shall have to earn 236 credits. To earn credits assigned to a course, a candidate shall have to secure in that course at least grade point 4 in the seven-scale grading system as per clause 6.

B) Successful candidates shall be awarded B. Tech. degree under the following classifications:

(i) **First Division:** Those who obtain CGPA in the range of 6 to 9.

(ii) **Second Division:** Those who obtain CGPA in the range of 5 and below 6.

(iii) **Pass:** Those who obtain CGPA in the range of 4 and below 5.

C) For the purpose of calculating % of marks equivalent to the CGPA secured by a student who has successfully completed B.Tech. programme of NEHU, the following conversion formulae shall be used:

$$\% \text{ of marks} = 10 * CGPA + 5, \quad \text{applicable up to CGPA 8.5}$$

$$\% \text{ of marks} = 20 * CGPA - 80, \quad \text{applicable above CGPA 8.5 and up to CGPA 9}$$
