

6:6: - Service conditions and financial benefits.

- i) Addition of Clause 3(iii) to Regulation RE-6 on terms and conditions of service of teachers elected/nominated/to Parliament/State Legislature/District Council.

On the above subject, the Executive Council in its 106th meeting vide resolution NO:EC:106:2000:8(iv) considered the Report of the Committee appointed by it vide resolution No:105:99:6:5:(iii) to look into the amendment of Regulation Re-6, and resolved that the Report alongwith the latest guidelines from the UGC be placed before the Academic Council, as per Annexure-I, II and III respectively.

Accordingly the matter was placed before the 63rd meeting of the Academic Council and the Council RESOLVED that pending further Guidelines from the University Grants Commission Statusquo as on November, 1997 may be maintained.

The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.

The Committee elected Prof.M S Sangma as the Chairman.

The Committee considered the Representation made by some of the teachers of the University in connection with the addition of Clause 3 (iii) to Regulation Re-6 which allows a teacher of the University to be a member of the Parliament, Legislative Assembly and District Council for a maximum period of ten years during their entire service career. The Committee examined the original Regulation in letter and spirit and observed the following :

The original Regulation allows a teacher to be a member of Parliament/Legislative Assambly/District Council without taking Extra Ordinary Leave provided he is involved in teaching and other academic activities in the Department. He has an option either to take Extra Ordinary Leave or not to take Extra Ordinary Leave. However, if he is appointed to an executive post, it is mandatory on his part to take Extra Ordinary Leave.

The Committee therefore recommends that a teacher while being a member of either of these bodies does not take Extra Ordinary Leave and continues to involve himself in his normal duties as a teacher there may not be any restriction in terms of the number of years for which a teacher may be a member of such bodies. However, in case he takes Extra Ordinary Leave while being a member or he is required to take Extra Ordinary Leave while he is in executive post, the period of Extra Ordinary Leave, so allowed, should not exceed ten years in his entire career as a teacher in this University.

The Programme of Action on National Policy on Education under Para 7 (iv) on page 74 states as under:

".....Teachers who are elected/nominated to Parliament or State Legislature will be required to take leave of absence during their term as Member. However, in this process they will not belosing their seniority or increments."

The above provision in the "Programme of Action"(NEP) is brought to the notice of the University for appropriate action and guidance.

We shall be grateful if the action taken in this regard is intimated to the UGC at an early date.

CHANCELLOR, NEHU, SHILLONG.

The question whether a teacher who is elected or nominated to the Parliament or State Legislature may be allowed to continue teaching work without being obliged to resign his teaching position or to take long leave from the University or college concerned and the procedure to be followed by the Universities in this respect, have been under consideration of the University Grants Commission.

The University Grants Commission had referred this question earlier for advice to its Advisory Committee of Vice-Chancellors and the Commission after consideration the advice of the Committee of Vice-Chancellors had expressed the view that "the teachers who are either elected or nominated to the Parliament/State Legislatures may not be required to resign their academic position or to take long leave during the tenure of their membership. In order that the teaching work may not suffer, the University may consider prescribing the minimum number of days that such teachers should be available for their academic teaching and the research work in the University, such teachers should not hold any administrative position/responsibilities in the University or College during the period they are members of Parliament/Legislature."

The Government of India have agreed with the views of the Commission. I am writing to bring the above advice of the Commission to the notice of the University. This may also kindly be brought to the notice of the Colleges affiliated to your University.

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6.6- Service Condition / Financial & Other Benefits.

- (i) Addition of Clause 3 (iii) to Regulation RE-6 on terms and conditions of service of teachers elected/ nominated to Parliament / State Legislature/ District Council.

EC:107:2000:6:6:(i): The Council considered the addition of Clause 3 (iii) to Regulation RE-6 on terms and conditions of service of teachers elected / nominated to parliament / State Legislature / District Council and RESOLVED that status quo as on November, 1997 be maintained. However, the University may also write to University Grants Commission about the latest guidelines on the matter.

- (ii) Guideline for appointment of Non-NET qualified candidates to the post of Lecturers in Colleges.

EC:107:2000:6:6:(ii): The Council considered the guideline for appointment of Non-NET qualified candidates to the post of lecturers in the Colleges and RESOLVED that the NET qualification be relaxed upto 2002.

- (iii) Remuneration for additional duties done by Shri Debashish Dey, STA, RSIC.

EC:107:2000:6:6:(iii): The Council considered the remuneration for performing the duties of a higher position for a period ceiling 45 days and RESOLVED that a monthly remuneration as indicated below may be granted.

1. For looking after the post of LDC and equivalent	-	Rs. 300/-
2. For looking after the post of UDC and equivalent	-	Rs. 400/-
3. For looking after the post of Assistant and equivalent	-	Rs. 500/-
4. For looking after the post of S.O. and equivalent	-	Rs. 650/-
5. For looking after the post of Asstt. Registrar and equivalent	-	Rs. 800/-
6. For looking after the post of Deputy Registrar and equivalent	-	Rs.1000/-

The case of Shri Debashish Dey may be regulated as above.

- (iv) Overtime allowance to the drivers posted in Examination Department.

EC:107:2000:6:6:(iv): The Council considered the grant of Overtime allowance beyond the maximum limit of 100 hours per month to the drivers of Examination Department for the months of February to July when the examinations and declaration of results are conducted and RESOLVED that the maximum bar of 100 hours may be relaxed as a very special case.
