The Committee, after a prolonged deliberation on the subject, resolved to recommend to the EC as follows :

1. The Committee resolved to recommend that the University may follow CGHS pattern in deciding entitlements of its employees regarding accommodation during hospitalisation. However, in order to enable the University to follow CGHS pattern the following rates of compulsory monthly contribution will have to be levied from all entitled class of University employees as :

Pay (in Rs)	Monthly contribution (Rs)
Upto 3,000	15
From 3,001 to 6,000	40
From 6,001 to 10,000	70
From 10,001 to 15,000	100
From 15,001 and above	150

3. NEHU may also adopt the "Free Diet" facilities as given below :

4. For specialised treatments the University may follow the accommodation rates as applicable from time to time and charged by government hospitals/private nursing hospitals recognised by the University.

EC:111:2001:5:1:(iii): The Council considered the remuneration payable to Teaching and Non-Teaching staff engaged in the examination works and RESOLVED to approve the same as per Annexure 'A'. The Council however, desired that a Committee be appointed to go into the budgeting and expenditure of the Examination Department without breaking the confidentiality of the department.

- (iv) Review of the provisions for admission to MAM.Sc./ M.Com. Programme.

EC:111:2001:5:1:(iv): The Council considered the recommendations of the Academic Council on the new admission policy to the PG programmes and RESOLVED that the distribution of seats be as follows:

- (i) Open Category – 40%
- (ii) SC/ST Candidates – 50% (other things being equal preference will be given to domiciles of Meghalaya.
- (iii) University Quota – 7%
- (iv) Physically challenged – 3%
- (v) The weightage to be given to graduates from NEHU affiliated Colleges and graduates who are from Universities other than NEHU but who are domiciles of Meghalaya will be 10%.
