M.Phil Course in Sociology-Paper on
Tribal Societies/Environmental Psychology.

The Academic Council in its 53rd meeting held on 3rd and 4th June, 1996 resolved that the M.Phil paper of the Department of Sociology on Tribal Societies be sent back to the School Board for review with the suggestion that the term "Tribal Societies" be changed.

The Dean, School of Social Sciences has now forwarded the M.Phil courses on Tribal Societies without changing the term "Tribal Societies". Further papers on perspective in Sociological Research(M.Phil) and also on Environmental Psychology(M.Phil) are also submitted. These are now placed in part IV of the agenda (54th meeting) at page 5:6:8:(1) to 5:6:8(5).

The same is placed before the Council for consideration.

(viii) Perspectives in Sociological Research (M.Phil)*

This is a compulsory course for the students pursuing M.Phil course in Sociology. The course is designed keeping in mind that an M.Phil student has already done courses on Sociological Theory (200 marks) and Research Methodology (200 marks) at the M.A. level. Consequently, the present course intends to help the student in consolidating his knowledge by combining the inputs given earlier in the form of four separate courses.

CONSTITUTIONGOVERNING BODY OF THE GREATER MAWLAI COLLEGE
MAWLAI SHILLONG-8

PREAMBLE: + Whereas at a general meeting of the Greater Mawlai Welfare Association held on July 29, 1993 at Mawlai Shillong in the District of East Khasi Hills, Meghalaya; it was unanimously resolved to establish, manage and develop a college at Mawlai, to be known as the Greater Mawlai College (GMC). The Provision of this constitution are framed under the enabling provision of the constitution of the Greater Mawlai Welfare Association (GMWA) to meet the aims and objective of the said Association.

1. SHORT TITLE
EXTENT
APPLICATION

1.1 :- The name of the college shall be the Greater Mawlai College" to be precisely known as the GMC

&
COMMENCEMENT

1.2 :- The redistred office of the college shall be situated at Mawlai, Shillong 793008 in the District of East Khasi Hills of Meghalaya.

1.3 :- It shall function and extend its operation to the jurisdiction of Mawlai Town and its contiguous area in particular and the state of Meghalaya in General.

2. AIMS &
OBJECTS

The aims and objectives of the college in particular is:-

(i) To provide scope and full facilities of higher college education to the students.

(ii) To promote encourage and improve physical and mental development of students community.

(iii) To adopt means and take such measure as are conducive for the development of healthy, progressive and creative cultural and educational life and to uphold high ideals as worthy citizens of the country.

(iv) To finance and establish library with reading rooms including students hostels and dormitory for the welfare of the students.

(v) To grant or constitute scholarships and stipends for meritorious and economically backward students in all streams of education or such accocations.

(vi) To acquire ~~fund~~ movable and immovable properties and assers, by purchase leases, gift or otherwise.

(vii) To receive funds as to be provided by the sponsoring body that is the Greater Mawlai Welfare Association (GMWA), or contribution donation or otherwise and to receive grants in-aids, loan and advance or other financial assistance or deposite from the state Government, Central Government, Companies Corporations, Firms, Trusts, Individuals and other bodies for the purpose of the development of the educational programmes and activities of the college.

(viii) To invest the fund of the college not immediately required and in such a manner as may be decided by the Governing Body from time to time and

(ix) Generally to do all such work as may appear to be incidental and condusive to the attainment of the above aims and objects or any of them, or consequential upon the exercise of its function or discharge of its duties and responsibilities.

3. DEFINITIONS :- In this constitution unless the context otherwise requires:-

- (i) "Sponsoring Body" means the Greater Mawlai Welfare Association-(G.M.W.A.)
- (ii) "Aims and Objective" means the aims and objectives herein above specified under Articles 2, of this constitution.
- (iii) "College" means the Greater Mawlai College(GMC)
- (iv) "Constitution" means the constitution of the Governing Body of the Greater Mawlai College(GMC)
- (v) "Employee" means the teachers and every other employee under the Greater Mawlai College.
- (vi) "Governing Body" means the Governing Body of the College
- (vii) "Ordinance" Means the ordinance of the North Eastern Hill University(NEHU)
- (viii) "President" means the president of the Governing Body.
- (ix) "Principal" means the principal of the GMC
- (x) "Members"(s) means the member or member of the Governing Body of the Greater Mawlai College.
- (xi) "Secretary" means the Secretary of the GB of the GMC.
- (xii) "Syllabus" means the syllabus of the Greater Mawlai College as proscribed by the NEHU from time to time.
- (xiii) "Teaching Staff" means the lecturer, the tutors including the Principal and the Vice Principal of the Greater Mawlai College.
- (xiv) "Treasurer" means the treasurer of the GMC.
- (xv) "University" means the North Eastern Hill University
- (xvi) "Year" means the Financial year commencing from 1st April and ending on the 31st March of each subsequent Calander year.

4. ADMINISTRATION
MANAGEMENT
&
COMPOSITION OF
THE GOVERNING
BODY

4.1 :- The Management, Administration and control shall vest in the Governing Body which shall consist of the president, the Secretary, Treasurer with other members as nominated and appointed by the Greater Mawlai College Welfare Association.

4.2 The following shall constitute the Governing Body

- a) President-To nominated and appointed by the GMWA
- b) Secretary-To be nominated and appointed by the GMWA.
- c) Treasurer-To be nominated and appointed by the GMWA.
- d) Adviser-To be nominated and appointed by the GMWA.
- e) Principal-To be nominated and appointed by the GMWA.
- f) Vice Principal-To be nominated and appointed by the GMWA.
- g) Members-(i) Teaching Staff/Representatives two person to be elected/nominated from amongst the teacher of the college.
(ii) Parents & Guardian representatives one person to be nominated from amongst the parents Guardian of the college.
(iii) Nominated, Members:-Two person to be nominated/elected by the

University and State Government.

- (iv) Remaining Members:-Four members to be nominated/ elected by the Greater Mawlai College Welfare Association.

4.3 :-TENURE AND TERM OF OFFICE OF THE GOVERNING BODY:

The tenure and term of office of the Governing Body shall be for a period of three years, from the date immediately following the date of the last constitution or re-constitution of the Governing Body as the case may be.

Provided that Indian emergent circumstances, the term and tenure of the Governing Body shall be extended by a further period of 6 months at a time by the Governing Body to be passed at a special meeting to be convened for the purpose and approved by the Greater Mawlai Welfare Association.

- 4.4 :-THE TERM AND TENURE OF OFFICE BEARERS-The term and Tenure of the office bearers Viz:-President, Secretary, Treasurer and members of the Governing Body shall be 3 (Three) years. They shall however be eligible for- renomination/re-election/re-appointment at the expiry of his /her/their respective term/tenure as shall be decided by the sponsoring Body/Government/University.

- 4.5 :-In case of any vacancy in the Governing Body by death, resignation or otherwise it shall be filled up by fresh nomination/election appointment, as the case may be, but the term and tenure of newly nominated/elected/appointed office bearer or the member as the case may be, shall be limited to the unexpired portion of the term and tenure of the outgoing office bearer or member.

- 4.6 :-Any member including the office bearer shall have the right to resign or relinquish the charges of the President's office or secretary, Treasurer or the member of the Governing Body without assigning any reason thereof.

Provided that the resignation or relinquishment of the charge of the office of the President /etc shall become effective specifically considered and approved by the sponsoring Body/Government/NEHU, with due information the secretary of the Governing Body.

- 4.7.-Any office bearer or member who fails to attend 3 consecutive meeting of the Governing Body without giving any sufficient and valid reason shall be removed by a resolution taken in this regard in a joint meeting of the Governing Body and the Sponsoring Body specially, convened for the purpose. The vacancy so occurred shall be caused to be filled up in a manner consistent with a provision of article 4.5 above.

5. DISQUALIFICATION- OF OFFICE BEARERS & MEMBERS The office of the President, the Secretary, including members nominated/appointed/elected by the Sponsoring Body except those nominated/appointed/elected by the NEHU or Government shall be ipso facto vacated if the sponsoring Body so decided in its meeting specially convened for the purpose for reasons as follows:-

- (a) He/She found to be of unsound mind by a court of competent Jurisdiction.
- (b) He/She is adjudged as insolvent, or in a state of moral turpitude and sentenced in respect thereof to imprisonment.
- (c) He/She is convicted by a court of law of any offense involving moral turpitude and sentenced in respect thereof to imprisonment.
- (d) In the opinion of the Sponsoring Body, continuance of such office bearer/member as the case may be exposed the college to disrepute or cause embarrassment before a public eye.

6. FUNCTION (i) To meet at least once in every 3 months commencing from the date of assumption of office by the constituted or the re-constituted G.B. as the case may be.

POWER OF THE GOVERNING BODY

- (ii) To consider, examine and pass the annual/financial statement of the college.
- (iii) To authorise expenditure beyond the delegated power of the President/or Secretary/or of the Principal
- (iv) To manage the day to day affairs of the college.
- (v) All matters arising at the meeting of the G.B. shall be decided by a majority of votes unless such decision(s) is/are arrived at unanimously.
- (vi) To read and confirm the proceedings of the previous meeting of the Governing Body.
- (vii) To cause the accounts of the college funds to be properly maintained to take such steps as may be deemed necessary and consistent with the provision of the constitution.
- (viii) To discuss all matters relating to the interest of the college and to take such action as may be considered necessary and appropriate.

any matters which is beyond the powers and functions of the G.B. either in the administrative/financial sphere may be referred to the Governing Body with its recommendation which may be decided upon by a joint meeting of the G.B. and E.C. of the Sponsoring Body.

- (ix) To control and administer the funds including the subsidiary funds of the college in accordance with the aim and objectives specified in this constitution lying within the delegated powers given to the G.B.

JORUM
OF THE
MEETING

7.1:-1/3 of the members of the G.B. shall form the Quorum. In case of equality of votes, the President shall have a second casting vote, Vote by proxy shall not be permitted.

7.2:-If there are no Quorum, within 1/2 hr of the appointed date and time, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same day of the week following at the same time, unless the President decided and declares otherwise.

No Quorum shall be necessary for such an adjourned meeting and no fresh items will be added to the agenda of the adjourned meeting.

7.3:-A requisitioned meeting may be called on a written requisition signed by 1/3 of the members of the G.B. for a specific issue or purpose.

8 FUNCTION
DUTIES AND
POWERS OF
THE
PRESIDENT

8.1:-The president shall be the Executive head of the G.B. and shall exercise all powers consistent with the function within the provisions of the constitution, He shall therefore be responsible for general supervision over the affairs of the college;

8.2:-The president shall preside over all meetings of the G.B. and during his absence members present shall elect one of the member to preside over such meeting who shall have the right and power exercised by the President.

The President may recommend the disciplinary action against any official (s) or employee(s) of the college to be decided upon by a joint special sitting of the G.B. and E.C. of the Sponsoring Body.

9. FUNCTION/
DUTIES AND
POWERS
OF THE
SECRETARY

Subject to the general control of the G.B. and President it shall be the duty of the secretary:-

(i) To conduct official correspondence of the college and sign all letters, execute documents or deeds of contract and assignment together with the President.

(ii) To enter into the minute book of the meeting of the proceeding of the G.B. or such special or emergent meeting as may be called upon or convened from time to time.

(iii) To release subscriptions donations or contribution and to arrange or cause to be arranged to collect all receipts and dues of the college and to issue necessary receipts thereof.

(iv) To cause maintenance of the book of accounts and all relevant record and registers in accordance with the provision of such rules and regulation as may be set forth by the G.B.

(v) To place before the President all communication received and all other matters which require personal attention of the president.

(vi) To circulate the proceedings of the meetings of the G.B. and E.C.

(vi) To circulate the proceeding of the meeting of the G.B. among all members and also to cause to be adopt such proceedings or resolution by circulation with prior consent/approval of the president.

(vii) To do such other acts and deeds as may be required under the constitution or as may be directed by the G.B.

(viii) To exercise general control over all matters pertaining to the activities and programme of the college

(ix) To prepare the annual financial statement of the college.

(x) To authenticate the record entries of receipts and expenditure and reconcile the balance as shown by the cash book with the bank pass book and the accounts and records maintained by the treasurer.

(xi) To authorise the Treasurer to receive money, accruing to the college and disburse payment under his authority or as may be delegated by the President and the G.B.

10. FUNCTION/
DUTIES AND
POWERS
OF THE
TREASURER

The Sponsoring Body shall nominate/ appoint/elect any of its members as a Treasurer.

(i) The Treasurer shall hold the office for a period of 3(Three) Years from the date of assuming the Office

Such nomination/ appointment/ election shall be eligible for re-nominated/re-appointment/re-election for further term/tenure.

(ii) The Treasurer shall maintain separate subsidiary cash book/records and register. All receipt and disbursement shall duly be recorded in the cash book and remittance book.

He shall maintain guard file and the bank pass book and cheque shall be kept in the proper and safe custody by himself.

He shall be responsible personally for safe custody of the college funds including cash and bank balances and investments/deposits.

(iii) The Treasurer shall render necessary assistance to the secretary to frame financial statement of the College. He shall carry out such further duties and responsibilities as may be delegated by the governing Body.

11. CONSTITUTION OF THE COLLEGE FUND/ MAINTAINANCE OF THE CURPUS/ ACCOUNTS AND AUDITS

11.1:- The College shall constitute and maintain a college fund. The minimum curpus of such fund shall be decided by the G.B. as per the direction of the Sponsoring Body from time to time. Provided that the minimum curpus so prescribed shall in no case be reduced. Provided further that where the curpus is unavoidably required to be reduced, adequate reason to that effect shall be recorded and passed by a special meeting of the Governing Body and the E.C. of the Sponsoring Body.

11.2:- There shall be credited thereto :- (a) Any grant in aids sanctioned by the Government. (b) Any other sum due to contributions, subscriptions, donations, endowments, gifts and the like made to the College.

11.3 :- The accounts of the College including subsidiary accounts and relevant records and register shall be maintained as may be prescribed from time to time. The said accounts shall correspond to the financial year as being adopted by the Government.

11.4:- The Bank account shall be operated upon by Cheques signed jointly by the Secretary and the Treasurer or by such authority as may be assigned by the G.B.

The Secretary shall be the controlling drawing and disbursing authority. All transactions shall be made under his signature.

11.5 :- In addition to the college fund specified to clause-I above the G.B. may be authorised the maintenance and operation of any other specific subsidiary fund such as :- (a) Income accruing to the college fund, by way of fees, charges etc and (b) Library fund, games and sports funds, exam and students funds, and such other welfare funds as may be considered necessary. The operation of such subsidiary funds shall be conducted through such person or authority as may be authorised by the G.B. from time to time.

11.6:- The Governing Body at a meeting shall appoint auditor(s) to carry out examination of accounts and records and register of the college and all subsidiary accounts in that behalf. Generally the audit shall cover a period of financial year. The appointment of auditor(s) shall be for a fixed tenure and the auditor(s) so appointed shall submit his/their report including the certificate of financial statement, showing income and expenditure and balance sheet to the secretary and where considered necessary to the President separately.

The president or Secretary as the case may be shall cause the said audit report with the annual accounts to be placed before special meeting of the Governing Body and the E.C. of the G.B. convened for the purpose. All steps shall be taken to dispose of facts and findings of the auditor(s) as EXPEDITIOUSLY as possible where considered necessary. Suitable amount of Audit fees may be charged to the college fund.

11.7 :- The Principal or such designated officer may be sanctioned to meet petty and sundry expense. The amount of impress may be decided by the G.B. from time to time. It shall be the personal responsibility of the Principal/authorised officer to render correct and factual accounts of all supporting vouchers. The impress may be recouped from time to time but at least once at the end of each month.

12. APPLICATION
OF THE COLLEGE
FUND

The income including the income from property and assets of the college shall be applied solely towards a promotion of the aims and objectives as set forth under article-2 of the constitution and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred by the way of dividend bonus or otherwise by the way of profit to any member of the G.B. or the Sponsoring Body.

Provided that nothing herein shall prevent the payment of remuneration to the college officer or employees or such other persons in consideration of the services rendered to the college.

13. CONSTITUTION/
APPOINTMENT OF
COMITTEES AND
SUB-COMMITTEES

13-1:- The G.B. shall, where considered necessary, constitute/appoint committee or sub-committee to go into such aspects as may arise from time to time specifying the terms of reference including tenure of such committees.

13.2 :- Each committee or sub-committee shall be headed by a chairman, who shall be nominated from amongst the members of the G.B. The Chairman shall, however have the power to co-opt one expert member other than members of the G.B.

The Committees or sub-committees so appointed/constituted shall submit its report to the secretary and where it consider necessary to the President, and the report thereof shall be henceforth and tabled at the meeting to be specially convened for the purpose. Provided that the G.B. shall have absolute power to accept/reject or modify the recommendation of the findings of the committee or sub-committee.

14. POWERS TO MAKE
BYE-LAWS/RULES AND
REGULATIONS

14.1 :- For the purpose of the proper and efficient administration of the college the G.B. shall have the powers to frame such bye-laws, rules or regulations as may be considered necessary. The bye-laws, rules or regulations shall be without any prejudice to the provisions of the constitution and shall relate to any on the following matters or subjects:-

(i) The manner in which education may be regulated.

(ii) Terms and conditions of service of the employees

(iii) Delegation of Financial and excretionary powers of the President, Secretary and any other office bearers.

(iv) Delegation of powers to the official of college including Principal.

(v) Code of conduct for the employer and disciplinary matters.

(vi) Service benefits including pay, allowances of the said employees.

(vii) Provident fund, gratuity and other welfare measures.

(viii) Rules and proceedings for monitoring the college.

(ix) Matters relating to the conduct of meetings and business thereof.

15. PROTECTION
FOR ACTION
TAKEN IN
GOOD FAITH

No Suit, prosecution or other legal proceedings shall be laid against the President, Secretary or other office bearers, or members of the G.B. for anything done or intended to be done in pursuance of the constitution, or the rules, regulations and bye-laws framed thereunder, provided that such action has/have been so taken in good faith.

Provided that where such matters come up, it shall be dealt within the name and seal of the college and all expenses in connection therewith or incidental thereof shall be chargeable to the College Fund.

16. REMOVAL
OF DIFFICULTIES
AND
MODIFICATION
OF THE
CONSTITUTION

16.1:- If any difficulty arise in giving effect to the provision of the constitution, the G.B. shall take appropriate/suitable action not inconsistent with the provision in the constitution, and remove such difficulty by relaxation, of the operation of any such provision in the constitution or the bye-laws, rules and regulations framed thereunder for dealing with the case in a just and equitable manner.

16.2:- The Provision in the Articles of the constitution shall be amendable by a majority vote of $\frac{2}{3}$ rds of the prescribed combined strength of the sponsoring Body and the G.B.

The motion or motions for amendments of Articles of the constitution, shall be moved not less than by 3 members who shall sign the motion(s) and forwarded to the President with clear 7 days in advance. The motion(s) shall then be discussed at a special meeting to be convened for the purpose.

17. COMMON
SEAL

The college and the Governing Body shall have a common seal which shall be kept under the custody of the custodian. The seal shall be affixed to such instruments, deeds and documents as may be required from time to time.

18. WINDING UP OR DISSOLUTION OF THE COLLEGE.

18. WINDING UP OR DISSOLUTION OF THE COLLEGE.

In the event of the college not being functioning or when its function have been abandoned, it shall be decided by a special meeting of the G.B. and the Genl. meeting of the G.B. specially convened for the purpose that the college, shall be wound up or dissolved.

Provided that there shall be present not less than 3/4th of the combined strength of the members of the G.B & the General meeting of the Sponsoring Body and that appropriate resolution to that effect have been adopted with not less than 3/4th of the members so present.

Provided also that all necessary steps shall be taken for the disposal and settlement of the assets and properties & liabilities in accordance with the decision of the special meeting.

18.2:- If upon the dissolution or winding up of a College there shall remain after due satisfaction of the liabilities and claims against the college, properties or assets whesoever, the same shall not be paid or distributed amongst the members or any of them But shall be disposed of in such a manner as may be determined.

Provided that such disposal shall ordinarily be carried out by a transfer of the assets and properties including the banks and cashballances, to such educational, social or cultural institutions or organisations either wholly to one of them or by distribution in suitable proportion to all of them.

Provided that disposal so carried in accordance with those present shall be duely recorded and proceedings kept in saft custody, by such person(s) as may be assigned by the speicial meeting.

19. INTERPRETATION.

Where any doubts arises as to the interpretation of any article of the constitution, it shall be referred to a special meeting of the members of the G.B. and the E.C. of the S.B. for decision.

INTRODUCTORY PART OF THE PROJECT

A newly opened College would perhaps needs some introduction to others outside its precincts especially the University with whom it is seeking affiliation. Before touching on the Project Report, it would not be out of place to briefly state how and why the Greater Mawlai College has been brought into existence. We are stating the reasons in the following lines.

The township of Mawlai which forms parts of the Greater Shillong at its western frontier comprises a vast area within its bounds, touching the vicinity of Mawlai Mauroh on the Northern side, Jaiaw on the East and Lower Mawprem on the South. Despite its vast expanse of territorial limits and sizeable population, it has been going without any institution of higher learning for a very long long time. In almost every local Meeting(s) conveyed from time to time over the years, speakers after speakers have kept alive this important issue and voiced their serious expression of concern about this need that is conspicuously lacking. Years rolled by and at last the long-harboured desire of seeing a College opened at Mawlai has turned into a reality. It has been made a possible after the Greater Mawlai Welfare Association took the initiative and assumed the role of sponsoring the Project.

Enthusied with a spirit of dedication to the cause and strong determination, its office-bearers and members worked hard in publishing and enlisting the general approval and support of the local people. The satisfying result of their endeavour is the establishment of the Greater Mawlai College which has been formally declared opened on the 4th day of September, 1993 by the Chief Minister of Meghalaya in the presence of the Vice-Chancellor of the North-Eastern Hill University and other distinguished guests.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE COLLEGE

The aims and objectives of the Greater Mawlai College briefly stated are to cater to the needs of the students community residing not only in the township of Mawlai but also of the adjacent area/areas and places lying beyond its outer fringes like Mawlai Mauroh, Mawta'ar village, Mawlai Mawiong village etc. The sponsors and administrators of this college are very hopeful that it would be of real service to the present and future general of ardent pursuers of ~~higher~~ ^{higher} knowledge. Now being the only the post-matric institution situated in this far flung western end of Shillong, it could eventually help easing the problem of admission seekers hailing from the above & other places.

The College is at present functioning with only the Evening Section in the P.U. level & the Degree level (Genl) with every high hope of proceeding to Degree level (Major) not only in the Arts stream but also in the Commerce and Science Stream in future.

(xi) NEHU REPRESENTATIVES IN THE GOVERNING BODY OF ALL AFFILIATED COLLEGES

As per Statute 33(I)(i) of the NEHU Act- Every College/Institution shall have a regular Governing Body consisting of not more than 15 members. Out of the 15 members there shall be two NEHU Representatives and three representatives of College teaching staff of whom the Principal of the College shall be one.

All the Affiliated Colleges under NEHU usually submit the list of Governing Body members of their College through the Respective State Govt. with a request to nominate two NEHU Representatives in the Governing Body of their College for a period of two/three years. And as per Academic Council Resolution No. AC: 41: 91: 03(ii) Director, College Dev. Council/Vice-Chancellor use to suggest two NEHU faculty members to act as NEHU Representatives in the Governing Body of Affiliated Colleges. As per the Vice-Chancellor's orders relating to the above subject matter is always placed before the Deans' Committee through the Deputy Registrar(Acad.) NEHU.

After the approval of the Deans' Committee the Department concerned issued the notification. But in the month of July 1995 the Vice-Chancellor gave the order vide File No. CDC/B.O/94-95 that the matter should be placed first before the Academic Council and Executive Council for their approval.

There are few affiliated Colleges which call themselves purely Private Institution/Minority Colleges viz. St. Edmund's College, St. Anthony's College, St. Mary's College and Shillong Law College, as per Executive Council Minutes of the 83rd meeting No: EC: 83: 94: 6: 07: (i) The Council considered the request of the minority Colleges as well as the legal opinion in the matter and RESOLVED that statues quo be maintained.
