(1) Status Report on NERIST.

The Academic Council vide Resolution No.AC:57:98:5:8:(xiii) had deferred the consideration of recognition of the teachers of NERIST as Ph.D. Supervisors and resolved that the office may place a note on the status of NERIST.

Affiliation of NERIST was first considered by the Academic Council on the request of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India, on the 3rd March, 1990. Subsequently, the Academic Council in its 40th meeting held on 1st November, 1990 resolved to ratify the grant of affiliation to NERIST. The Academic Council in its 51st meeting held on 2nd and 3rd November, 1995 resolved to recognise NERIST as a Research Institute and also to recognise some of its teachers in the Department of Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Forestry as Supervisors for Ph.D. Programmes.

3. Occurance:- The Deans Committee shall meet normally
once in two months and at least five
times in a Calendar year.

FUNCTIONS

4. Functions of the Deans Committee will be as follows:

- (i)(a) Selection of candidates for the award of
Fellowship to students.
- (b) The Deans Committee will consider the panel of
experts to be invited for various endowment
lectures.
- (c) The Committee may consider proposals of various
Deptts. for the Visiting Fellowship/Visiting
Professorships.
- (ii) (a) Recommending applications for financial assistance
to teachers to participate in International/
National Conferences/Seminars/Symposiums/Workshop/
Trainings etc.
- (b) while processing such individual cases bunches of
applications may be presented for consideration of
the committee.
- (iii)(c) Considering matters arising from conduct of
examination, standard of results etc.

- (iv)(a) Considering general administrative matters relating to functioning of schools, Deptts., and Centres.
- (v) Such other matters as may be assigned to it by the Executive Council or may be referred to by the Vice-Chancellor.

Meetings

- 5.(i)(a) The meeting of the Committee shall be convened by the Chairman.
- (b) In case of urgency, the Vice-Chancellor may authorise the senior most Dean to preside the meeting of the Committee in his absence.

Quorum

6. The quorum of the Committee shall be three. Further, other important observations of the members on the function of the Deans Committee will be informed to the Academic Committee vide a separate covering letter drafted by the Chairman as such. The above draft Regulation will be send to the Academic Council for its perusal and necessary approval.

I am submitting the draft regulations on Deans' Committee as referred to this Committee by the Academic Council of the above reference. The Committee has the following observations:

- (a) The Committee felt that even if certain items are repeated from Ordinance OB-2 and considering that the draft regulations expands scope of certain provisions, for easy reading the comprehension, it would be better if the draft regulation is considered as a whole. The provisions in the regulation are in no way in contradiction with any of those of the existing Ordinance.
- (b) That the reference of the term "Deputation" in the Ordinance OB-2(3.(ii)) needs clarification in the light of Special Casual Leave provisions and the administrative practice in the University.
- (c) The Committee recommends that for practical reasons the Ordinance Provisions)BB-2(5) may be amended as quorum of three members.

The Executive Council had appointed a Committee to frame the Statutes and Ordinances Pertaining to Appointment, Powers and Functions of the Chief Proctor/Proctors.

The Committee in its meeting held on ~~22~~ 07.98 (Minute at Annexure'A') has recommended that (1) the Chief Proctor/Proctors need not necessarily be appointed from amongst the teachers alone and (2) that the Powers and Functions of the Chief Proctor/Proctors may be assigned to them by Vice-Chancellor through an Executive Order as laid down in the Statutes.

The Chairman welcomed all the members to the fourth meeting of the Committee.

The Committee deliberated on the Ordinance on the Maintenance of Discipline and Proper Conduct among the Students of the University (Ordinance OD-8) and approved the Ordinance framed by the Working Group with some modifications. The Ordinance as recommended by the Committee is placed at Annexure 'A'

The Committee also went through the amendments proposed to Statute 9 on the appointment, powers and functions of the Chief Proctor and Proctors and resolved to recommend that **the Proctor and Chief Proctors need not necessarily** be appointed only from among the teachers of the University as a situation may arise where the Chief Proctor and Proctors may have to be appointed from persons other than teachers of the University. Hence, the Committee suggested that the words 'from amongst the teachers of the University' appearing in the first para of Clause 1 of the proposed amendment of Statute 9 may be deleted.

Statute 9 of the existing as well as in the proposed amendment stipulates that the Proctors "shall exercise such powers as may be assigned by the Vice-Chancellor/Pro-Vice-Chancellor". Further to this most of the functions of the Proctors have been defined in Ordinance OA-8 relating to the Discipline of the Students. As such, the Committee is of the opinion that there need not be any ordinance on the Powers and Functions of the Proctors and the Vice-Chancellor may from time to time assign them duties and powers by an executive order as empowered by the Statutes.

The Inspection Team visited the Aizawl Law College on 17th July 1998 at 4 p.m. and inspected and found that the College needs the following essential conditions/requirements to be fulfilled.

- 1. The Principal is an M.A. in Pol. Sc, Ph. D(Pol.Sc) and LL.B from Guwahati University. Besides, he was serving in Judicial Department of Mizoram for 22 years and retired as Law Secretary. But as per the Bar Council provision the Principal of of law College has to be a Master of Law and must be appointed on a full time basis. Since he has al long experiences of serving in the Judicial Department of the Government of Mizoram, the Team feels|recommends that he may be considered to be permitted to continue as the Principal of the College till a suitable Person with required qualification is appointed:

1993 WITH THE SUPPORT OF THE PEOPLE OF Mizoram. It is a pioneering institution in the entire North Eastern Region in imparting legal education to the students. The College has so far produced 73 Law Graduates.

- (2) The Team recommends that two more qualified teachers as per the Bar Council provisions need to be appointed on priority basis. The Team is seeking relaxation on this count for two teachers (Sl No.4 and 6) who are having 7 and 6 years experience at BAR instead of the required 10 years as stipulated by the BAR Council for non LL.M degree-holders.
- (3) The Team recommends that the College authorities must take initiative to construct the building of the college at the earliest possible.
- (4) Qualified Full time Librarian must be immediately appointed to look after the Library Section of the Law College.
- (5) As per the available records, it appears that the Provisional Affiliation for three years w.e.f. 24th Dec, 1993 was granted to the College which expired on December, 1996. There is a lapse of 1 year and 7 months as on the Inspection Date of the present team which may be regularised by the University as the team feels. However, in this regard, the law college authorities have already paid Rs.5000/- for getting its reaffiliation on 12.11.97 Vide Bank Draft MTTB/40 " 389976" dated 20.10.97, as received and acknowledged by the C.D.C. NEHU, Vide notification No. CDC/C81/1026/dated 12.11.1997.
17. Recommendations: The Inspection Team strongly recommends the renewal of the Provisional Affiliation of the Aizawl Law College for 3 years subject to the fulfillment of the above mentioned conditions/requirements in larger interests of the College and law education in Mizoram.

- (i) Minimum qualifications prescribed for appointment of Lecturers, Readers and Professors reg.

The University Grants Commission, prescribed the qualifications for appointment as Lecturers, Readers and Professors in Universities/Colleges.

Now, the Commission vide its letter No.F.4-12/86 (NET), dt.18.5.98(Annexure-'A') has intimated that the subjects of Computer Applications and Electronic Sciences have also been included in the National Eligibility Test for J.R.F. award and Lecturership from June and December, 1995 onwards respectively. The qualification of NET or SLET (accredited by UGC) in the aforesaid two subjects is mandatory with effect from the date of declaration of results i.e. 29.11.95 for Computer application and 13.5.96 for Electronic Sciences. The Commission in the aforesaid letter has further stipulated that in case the University has already appointed such candidates (who don't possess NET or SLET (accredited by UGC) qualifications) as Lecturers on permanent basis after 29.11.95 and 13.5.96 in Computer Applications and Electronic Sciences respectively without the prior permission of UGC, the candidates have to clear the NET within two years time from the date of this letter or their services may be terminated.

On the above context, it may be stated that since, as of now, the departments of Computer Applications and Electronic Sciences do not exist in the University, apparently no action is warranted in the matter for time being. But however, the aforesaid qualification as prescribed by the UGC will have to be made effective as and when the above two disciplines come to exist in the University.

Hence, matter is hereby placed before the Council for consideration and approval.

As you are aware that the present minimum qualifications prescribed for appointment of Lecturers, Readers and Professors in Colleges and Universities have come into effect from 19th Sept., 1991 onwards. As and when changes are made in the policy matter this office has intimated the same to all the Universities/Service Commissions and Education Secretaries. In spite of our repeated reminders/circulars it has been observed that few election committees/recruitment bodies have not followed the rules strictly. In order to provide quality education and to avoid legal complications, this office expects your kind cooperation to implement the rules strictly.

As UGC has included the subjects Computer Application and Electronic Sciences in the National Level Eligibility Test for J.R.F. award and Lectureship from June and December, 1995 onwards respectively, NET (or) SLET (accredited by UGC) qualification is mandatory for these subjects also with effect from date of declaration of result i.e. 29.11.95 for Computer Application and 13.5.96 for Electronic Sciences. If NET/SLET qualified candidates are not available, the recruitment body may refer the case to Additional Secretary-I, UGC, New Delhi-2 for specific exemption with complete justification.

If the University has already appointed such candidates (who don't possess NET or SLET (accredited by UGC) qualification) as Lecturers on permanent basis after date 29.11.95 and 13.5.96 in Computer Science or Electronic Science respectively, without the prior permission of this office, the candidates has to clear the NET within two years time from the date of this letter or their services may be terminated.
