5:5: Examination Matters

- i) Proposed Re-evaluation Principle Vis-a-Vis the Part I and Part II System of Examinations

The matter regarding Proposed Re-evaluation Principle Vis-a-Vis the Part-I and Part-II System of Examinations (at Annexure-I) was placed before the 59th meeting of the Academic Council and the Council RESOLVED that for the Part-I there may only be scrutiny and for the Part-II examination there may be both scrutiny and re-evaluation and the result be declared on the basis of the higher of the two marks, that is Original and re-evaluated marks. The same Principle be followed for the P G Departments also for all the semesters.

The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.

Proposed Re-evaluation Principle vis-à-vis the Part I and Part II system of Examinations.

Under the annual system of examination a candidate could automatically move on to the next higher class without having to wait for the results of the examination written. Under this system, the results of the re-evaluation were required to be known only before such candidates could fill in their next examination forms, which was normally in Nov./Dec. Such being the system, the then re-evaluation principle was made liberal and open, since there was no risk, on this count, to the non-fulfilment of the minimum requirement of 180 teaching days.

However, since under the Part I and Part II examinations, a candidate is required to clear Part I examinations, before being admitted to the Part II course, the application of the same principle of re-evaluation is bound to create some legal complications, as it is not possible to bring out the re-evaluated results so fast for the University as to be able to ensure fulfilment of the minimal requirement of 180 teaching days. (It may be noted that a period of one month, from the date of publication of the concerned results, is required to be given for filling in of such forms).

In the face of such problems, the following modifications on re-evaluation are being proposed to the Academic Council for consideration and decision:

- 1) For the Part I Examinations, there may only be **SCRUTINY** and the University may do away with the provision of re-evaluation.
- 2) For the Part II Examinations, we may continue to have re-evaluation on the existing principle, with the limitation of only one re-examiner. The original marks and the marks of the re-examiner could be averaged for determination of the marks of re-evaluation.
- 3) Other conditions of re-evaluation at Annexure "A" may continue to be operative.

The above modifications are proposed only with the view to avoid legal complications as also to ensure expeditious disposal of such cases in the light of the newly changed system of examinations.

The above proposals are therefore submitted to the Academic Council for consideration and approval.

RE-EVALUATION RULES

1. A candidate may within 30 days of declaration of results apply for re-evaluation of not more than two papers paying a fee of Rs. 150/- (one hundred fifty) only per paper.
2. Provided further that no such request be entertained for practical papers:
3. All requests for re-evaluation shall be accompanied by:
 - i) A Demand Draft in favour of Controller of Examinations, NEHU or Nehu Challan for the amount prescribed above.
 - ii) The original mark-sheet issued by the University.
4. The application shall be screened by the Controller of Examinations and shall be sent to two examiners, other than the ones who have examined the script earlier, appointed by the Vice-Chancellor.
5. Average of the two closer marks awarded by the examiners shall be the marks awarded after re-evaluation.
6. The score after re-evaluation shall supersede the earlier score provided that a candidate who was declared pass initially shall not be declared unsuccessful as a result of re-evaluation and downward revision of marks shall be limited to pass level.
7. No retrospective benefit such as award of Gold Medal, Scholarship, Fellowship admission, promotion, etc., shall accrue to a candidate as a result of re-evaluation.
8. Re-evaluation shall not be a time-bound process but all effort will be made to ensure early declaration of result.
9. Candidates who secure more than or equal to 15% and less than or equal to 40%.
10. Candidates who secure less than or equal to 4/5th (80%) of the average percentage of marks obtained in the rest of the papers. To illustrate whereas under the old formula a candidate wishing to go for re-evaluation where he/she has secured 42% was to have secured 70% in the rest of the papers, now under the new formula a candidate with 42% marks in a paper can go for re-evaluation of a paper if she/he secures 56% in the rest of the papers. For ready reference please see the "Ready Reckoner" appended below.
11. A candidate shall be eligible for re-evaluation *only in two papers* in a particular year of examinations (as per existing provisions).
12. In addition to the modified provisions of re-evaluation the rate for scrutiny shall be Rs. 100/- per paper.
13. If the improvement in the re-evaluation is equal to or less than 5% over the original marks, the difference will be ignored and show as NO IMPROVEMENT over the original and the original marks shall be retained.

WORKING RULES FOR REPETITIONS/IMPROVEMENT/RE-EVALUATION :

Consequent upon the decision of the 50th meeting of the Academic Council held on 2nd and 3rd November, 95, the following working rules may be followed from the forthcoming examinations onwards :

I. REPETITIONS :

Repetitions in the failed subject(s) (those securing less than 30% in a particular paper(s)) will be available to all the new course candidates upto the permissible chances (i.e. 2+2 for the Pre-University and 3+2 for the Degree Courses) as already notified earlier.

II. IMPROVEMENT :

a) Improvement facility will be available to the new course candidates DURING THE CURRENCY of the course in partial modification of what have been notified earlier.

b) This facility will, however, be limited to those candidates securing less than 45% in the concerned paper(s).

c) This facility will also be available ONLY ONCE during the entire currency of the course within the permissible chances, that is, 2+2 for the Pre-University and 3+2 for the Degree courses.

d) The original marks of a candidate shall stand forfeited if he/she decides to go for improvement.

III. RE-EVALUATION :

Re-evaluation facility will be available to the following category of candidates :-

a) Candidates who secure more than or equal to 15% and less than or equal to 40%.

b) Candidates who secure less than or equal to 4/5th (80%) of the average percentage of marks obtained in the rest of the papers. To illustrate whereas under the old formula a candidate wishing to go for re-evaluation where he/she has

secured 42% was to have secured 70% in the rest of the papers, now under the new formula a candidate with 42% marks in a paper can go for re-evaluation of a paper if she/he secures 56% in the rest of the papers. For ready reference please see the "Ready Reckoner" appended below.

✓ c) A candidate shall be eligible for re-evaluation only in two papers in a particular year of examinations (as per existing provisions).

d) The re-evaluation fees shall stand revised to Rs.150/- per paper to meet atleast the cost of re-evaluation.

✓ e) In addition to the modified provisions of re-evaluation the existing provision of SCRUTINY shall stand.

✓ f) If the improvement in the re-evaluation is equal to or less than 5% over the original marks, the difference will be ignored and shown as "NO IMPROVEMENT" over the original and the original marks shall be retained.

5:5- EXAMINATION MATTERS

(i) Proposed Re-evaluation Principle vis-a-vis the Part -I and Part-II system of Examinations.

EC:99:98:5:5: (i): The Council considered the proposed Re-evaluation principle for the Under Graduate and Post Graduate Examinations and RESOLVED as follows:

1. Re-evaluation be allowed to the candidates who have failed in the Part-I examination to the extent of two Papers.
2. Provisional admissions to Part - II be allowed to failed candidates of the Part-I Examinations provided the candidates seek and are allowed re-evaluation of their papers.
3. Results be declared on the basis of the higher of the two marks, that is, the original and re-evaluated marks without forfeiture Clause.
4. Other conditions of re-evaluation will remain the same.
5. In view of the need of immediate implementation, the same may be implemented and reported to the next Academic Council.

(ii) Proposed fees structure for Diploma and Certificate Courses.

- (i) Setting up an Extension Centre of the Centre for Electronics Designs and Training.
