Students Welfare

The Office of the Dean Students' Welfare serves an important role in providing services to the student community and looks after its welfare. It issues identity cards and bus passes, student concessions on railways and sanctions study tour linked with academic programmes. The Dean Students' Welfare's Office with the Hostel Wardens allots hostel seats and manages the Hostels. The Office also advertises and coordinates the award of NEHU Scholarships, the NEHU Students Aid Fund and looks after the students cultural and co-curricular activities. It also conducts the election to the NEHU Students' Union, Shillong. The Dean Students' Welfare Office, though largely concerned with the Shillong Campus has links with the campuses at Aizawl, Lohima and SASRD at Medziphema, where teachers are appointed to coordinate student activities. Dr. David R. Sviemlieh continued to hold charge as Dean Students' Welfare.

During the period under Report, the Sports Department of the University in accordance with the Sports Calendar organised Inter College Sports and Games Tournament during the month of May and June, 1994 at Shillong, Kohima and Aizawl.

The Inter College Athletics Tournament was participated by various colleges of Shillong, Kohima and Mizoram. The tournament was inaugurated by the Minister of States, Sports, Meghalaya which was declared open in the Jawaharlal Nehru Sports Complex, Shillong.

The qualifying teams of each Zone participated in the Inter-Zonal tournament held at Aizawl.

Pre-Selection Trial Camps :

Following the Inter College Tournament, the Sports Department conducted Pre-Selection Trial Camps in the month of Sept, Oct and Nov '94 in the following disciplines for selection of teams to represent the University in the East Zone Inter University Tournament. The camp was conducted under the supervision of the Departmental Coaches assisted by the State Sports Association.

Coaching Programme

The departmental Coaches were assigned to impart Coaching in games in Schools, Colleges and deputed to assist the state team for participation in the National Tournaments. The Sports department has taken the initiative of deputing the Coaches to various Colleges in Shillong for taking up Coaching assignments which is on the anvil.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The programmes of National Service Scheme (NSS), continued to be implemented through colleges. Themes selected were with a view to promoting social consciousness, a sense of responsibility as well as of dignity and labour and inculcating discipline amongst the students. NSS activities were organised through two programmes viz., Regular activities and Special Camps. In addition student volunteers took part in Sadbhavana Divas for national integration, and World Environment Day Programmes. Other activities include population Education Camps, survey of School dropouts, Adult Education, Drug Abuse and AIDS awareness programmes. Relief work among victims of cyclones and landslides in Mizoram were also undertaken.

The NSS had the distinction of entering its 25th year of existence on the 24th September 1994, the Silver Jubilee Year Celebrations comprising of seminars, Construction of Parks etc. had been carried out throughout the year starting from September 1993. The year long programme culminated in a celebration on 24th September of all the NSS Units of Meghalaya, at the Lady Keane College, Shillong. Prizes in different fields of achievement were awarded, which included the best Programme Officer to Mr. R. Dubey, Lecturer from Synod College, best volunteer to Mr. Lamborlang Marbanlang of the Seno Khasi College, which also bagged the best NSS Unit. The celebrations were graced by our Vice-Chancellor, Dr. B. Pakem and the Minister of Education Dr. H. Lamin as chief Guests. In Mizoram, Social meetings marked the Jubilee celebrations programmes like tree plantation, Mass Programme for Functional Literacy, hygiene, sanitation, AIDS Awareness Campaigns were held and relief work was offered to the victims. A 10 days national integration camp was organised by the NSS Cell, NEHU for nine Universities at the Union Christian College, Barapani in January in which 150 NSS volunteers from nine Universities took part, the Camp was inaugurated by the Governor of Meghalaya, Shri. Madhukar Dique. A training-Cum-Workshop Programme on "University Talk AIDS" was held for days in October 1994 at the NEHU Campus. Participants comprised of College teachers from the states of the North Eastern Region. Similar workshops for volunteers were held by the NSS college Units of Meghalaya. The NSS Volunteers also participated in a National Integration Camp in October 1994 at Hyderabad.

For 1994-95, the total enrolment of volunteers in Meghalaya was 8000 in 21 colleges and one P.G. Unit. Altogether 34 Programme Officers who are Lecturers are taken from their respective Colleges to look after their Units. In Mizoram the total Volunteers strength is 10007, with 18 colleges having NSS Units with 33 Programme Officers looking after them.
