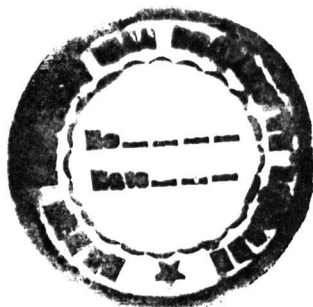
The extremely interesting ethnic people of the entire region are as varied and charming. The human landscape presents a widely diverse pattern as found in a colourful mosaic.

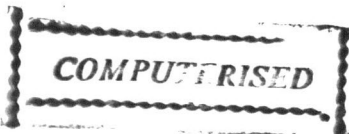
