5:5-Examination Matters-

- (iv) Order of the Gauhati High Court, Aizawl Bench under Civil Rule No.65/94(AB) regarding the case of Ms.L.V.Zodinpuii for condonation of late submission of her M.A(Education) Dissertation.

Miss L.V.Zodinpuii was admitted into M.A.Education Programme in Shillong Campus in May, 1989.

As per records Miss L.V.Zodinpuii appeared the 1st Semester Exam. held in September 1989 only in three courses and 1 course viz. EC 4 the candidate cleared in October 1990 (in the Repeat Exam). She completed the 2nd Semester Exam. in December 1989 and 3rd Semester held on July, 1990. Then she had asked for transfer to continue her IV Semester courses in Mizoram Campus and appeared the IV Semester Exam. held in December 1990 and cleared 2 courses keeping pending one course i.e. the Dissertation work. Clause 15 of DC 7 says "No candidate will be allowed to appear in any Course more than twice and no candidate shall be allowed to appear in any course beyond six Semesters of his/her first admission to the programme". L.V. Zodinpuii therefore should have submitted her Dissertation within December 1991, but after a lapse of 2 years only she has submitted her Dissertation i.e. on 19.8.1993 to the Head of the Department of Education, Mizoram Campus due to the unfortunate road accident in March, 1991.

On not being able to complete her M.A.Degree Dissertation within the prescribed period and on being communicated of the University's inability to consider her request for extension of time for submission of M.A.Education Dissertation beyond the prescribed six Semester Ms.Zodinpuii filed a Writ Petition before the Gauhati High Court, Aizawl Bench under Civil Rule No.65/94.

The Writ Petition was heard on 22.1.96 and the judgement as below was passed on 23.1.96.

Para 18: "For the reasons aforesaid, the impugned order dated 21.7.94 (Annexure I) is hereby quashed and set aside. Petitioner is directed to file a fresh representation before the respondent No.1 stating the entire backgrounds mentioned in this Writ Petition, particularly in paragraphs 6 and 7 of the petition within a period of two weeks from today. On representation being received, the respondent No.1 shall cause it to place before the Academic Council alongwith other documents including the recommendation dated 19.11.93 by Dr.R.S.Wangu, Supervisor (Annexure-II) of the Writ petition, within a period of one month from the date of receipt of the representation and the decision shall be taken on the same day. It is made clear, that if the petitioner is aggrieved by any decision that may

arrived at by the Academic Council, she is at liberty to approach this Court again".

In accordance with the Order of the High Court Ms. Zodinpuii has appealed to the Vice-Chancellor with the request that the matter may be considered by the Academic Council. (Ms. Zodinpuii letter at Annexure-III).

The Academic Council in its 52nd meeting held on 28th Feb., 1996 and as directed by the High Court deliberated upon the petition of Ms. Zodinpuii with special attention to para 6 and 7 of her Writ petition but however regretted its inability to allow extension of time to her for submission of her M.A. Dissertation in view of the provision of the Ordinance which do not permit extension of time beyond six Semester as stated explicitly in Clause 15 of Ordinance OC-7.

The Council in general stressed on compliance to the provision of the Ordinance and RESOLVED that a Committee consisting of the following members may look into the irregularities that occurred in the Department of Education, Mizoram Campus.

The Council further RESOLVED that the Department may look into the feasibility of introducing optional paper in lieu of Dissertation work and bring up the matter for consideration of the next meeting of the Academic Council.

The Academic Council's decision was also noted by the Executive Council in its 89th meeting held on 8.3.96 vide Resolution No: EC:89:96:2: (iii).

The Committee met on 1.6.96 looked into the documents presented by the Departments discussed the issue with the faculty of the Department and made its report as under:-

The Committee found that the Department of Education, Mizoram Campus had been forwarding M.A. Dissertation to office of the Controller of Examination for evaluation (Letter No. MC/Edn/13/94 dated May 31, 1994 from Dr. R.S. Wangu to the Controller of Examinations, with 19 names of the students from 1984 to 1991 (Annexure - A.) and they were accepted on the plea that the Department was under staffed. The Committee also found out that there were cases of late submission of such dissertations in the Department of Psychology, Mizoram Campus, Aizawl as well as (Letter of the Head, Department of Psychology to the Dean, School of Social Sciences dated 28.07.1990 and the decision of the University vide Letters No. F.25/SSS/MA/90-1967 dated 8.10.1990 and No. EX/PG/MS/Hd-Psy/86-87 dated 17.10.1990 (Annexure -B, C, D). The Campus Head, Department of Education, Mizoram Campus, pointed out the late submission of dissertation, while forwarding them to the Controller of Examinations with copies of his letters to Head, Department of Education and the Dean,

School of Education. The School Board in Education found the late submission of the Dissertation irregular. Still the dissertation was submitted to the Controller of Examinations office with negative resolution, and thus the dissertation was not accepted for evaluation. In the light of the above, the Committee arrived at the following conclusions:

1. The Departments of Education and Psychology in the Mizoram Campus have been under-staffed for many years. Keeping the ability of the faculty in the respective departments in mind, provision of M.A. Dissertation, which is time consuming, was an inadvisable practice.
2. The University system (such components as the BPGS in Education and Psychology, School Boards in Education and Social Sciences, the Offices of the Controller of Examinations and Pro-Vice-Chancellor, Aizawl.) did not take note of the violation of the University rules between 1984 to 1994.
3. The small number of faculty in the above Departments in the absence of an immediate support base from the University system worked under a heavy pressure and late submission of dissertation would be accepted as a fait-accompli.
4. It is desirable that the University System (i.e. BPGS, School Board and the Office of the Controller of Examinations and the Pro-Vice-Chancellor in the Mizoram Campus) be vigilant in the matters of examinations. However, it is imperative that a practice be evolved in which the Office of the Pro-Vice-Chancellor of the Campus plays an effective rôle of the Academic Head of the University in terms of academic administration.

The report of the Committee was placed before the 53rd Academic Council held on 3rd and 4th June, 1996 which RESOLVED to accept the recommendation of the Committee.

The matter is placed before the Executive Council for consideration.

With reference to the letter cited above regarding the dissertation submitted by Ms.L.V.Zodinpuui(Roll No.A-004) of the Department of Education,NEHU,Mizoram Campus,Aizawl (1989-90 Batch).I have to state the following.

i) Ms.L.V.Zodinpuui had been regularly working for her dissertation till she met the unfortunate road accident in Madras in March,1991 and was advised complete bed rest. Though she had recovered and had started working again,she had another spell of complete bed rest on advice of specialists from Medical College Guwahati. This had adversely effected the progress of her work. The Medical Certificate in support of these facts have already been attached with her request for extension of time. In spite of all these problems she has done her level best and completed her work.

ii) She is a very hard working student and has obtained more than 60% marks in the other theory papers.

iii) In the past also, for the reasons recorded in the files of the examination department at Shillong, the late submission of dissertation by the students from Mizoram Campus, has been condoned by the University and the result of the students has been declared. The case of Ms.L.V.Zodinpuui is more genuine,keeping in view her Medical grounds and therefore I request for a favourable consideration of her case.

Sir,

With reference to the above, I have the honour to submit this Representation in accordance with the direction given by the Hon'ble Gauhati High Court in its Judgement and Order mentioned above, and state the following :

1. That the facts and circumstances leading to late submission of my Dissertation on the Topic of "A Study of the Teenage Mizo Female Dropouts Between 13 to 19 Age Group From High Schools in Aizawl" have been clearly explained in my Writ Petition submitted to the Hon'ble Gauhati High Court which was registered as Civil Rule No: 65/94

2. That the reason for not submitting my said Dissertation within the stipulated period has been clearly given at paras 6 and 7 of my said Writ Petition which runs thus:

"6 That while the Petitioner was starting to work on her said Dissertation, she was referred to C.M.C. Hospital, Vellore, Madras in the month of February, 1991. Unfortunately, while coming back from Vellore, she met with a road accident on 5.3.91 near Madras, sustaining serioud injury of Pelvic bone fracture and Lumber disc prolapse. And after taking medical treatment in the Sri Balaji Hospital Madras, the Petitioner was discharged on 15.3.91 with the advice for complete bed rest. A copy of the Discharge Certificate from the 'Sri Balaji Hospital' dated 15.3.91 is annexed here to and marked as Annexure-IV.

2. That as the Petitioner could not recover from the bodily injury sustained as a result of the said accident even after many months, and as the actual internal ailment could not be detected at Aizawl Civil Hospital, the Petitioner was advised to have necessary medical check up and treatment from the Institute of Neurological Sciences, Dispur, Assam.

And after having undergone the said medical check up it was diagnosed that the Petitioner was having Lumber Disc Prolapse and Pelvic bone fracture. Accordingly she was advised "to avoid lifting heavy weights or stooping forwards, bending or stooping, to avoid travel over two wheelers, or on rough roads, to avoid prolonged sitting or standing, to sleep on a firm bed and to wear a lumber belt always except while sleeping or for toilet activities" and during all these period of about 9(nine) months with effect from 5.3.91 till 12.11.91 the Petitioner was debarred, due to her said ailment, from doing daily/routine works. However, inspite of all odds and difficultics against her, the Petitioner was determined to complete her Dissertation work within the stipulated period and did whatever she could. A copy of the finding report and advice of the Institute of Neurological Sciences dated 12.11.91 is annexed hereto and marked as Annexure-VI.

3. That though I had done my best to complete my said Dissertation within time, it was humanly impossible and accordingly I applied for extension of time. And after completing my said Dissertation, I submitted the same to the Department on 8.10.92 which was then forwarded to the Examination Section, NEHU for evaluation. However, as the same remained unattended and unexamined for a long time, I submitted an application dt. 19.11.93 to the Controller of Examinations praying for special mercy on medical and humanitabian grounds to examine my said Dissertation and to award me a Master Degree in Education. It may also be mentioned that Dr. R. S. Wangu, Reader and Faculty Supervisor had also recommended my case by writing his letter dt. 19.11.93 addressed to the Controller of Examination, NEHU wherein he had stated among other things that "in the past also, for reasons recered in the files of the Examination Department at Shillong, the lattersubmission of dissertation by students from Mizoram Campus, has been condoned by the University and the result of the students has been declared. The case of Ms. L. V. Zodinpuil is more genuine, keeping in view her Medical grounds and therefore I request for a favourable consideration of her case'. This fact has been clearly proved by the letter No. A. 20011/11/88/MC(DR) dated 17th August '95 alongwith its enclosure issued by the Deputy Registrar, NEHU, Mizoram Campus.

4. That inspite of several reminders and applications, my ase was not given a favourable consideration and finally it was rejected by the School Board, NEHU and the same was communicated

to me by letter No:EX/PG/Repeat/92-93/674 dt.21.7.94 by the Controller of Examinations.

5. That being highly aggrieved I had approached the Hon'ble Gauhati High Court by filling the aforesaid Writ Potition. And the same being disposed of finally by the said Judgement and order, dt.23.1.96, quashing the said impugned letter/Order.dt. 21.7.94, the Academic Council has been directed to give a fresh consideration of my case and to make a final decision thereon within a period of one month from receipt of this Representation. A copy of the said Judgement and Order dt.23.1.96 is enclosed herewith for your kind perusal and necessary compliance.

It is therefore most earnestly prayed that your benign Office may graciously be pleased to give a fresh consideration of my case in line with the Judgement and Order dt.23.1.96 passed by the Hon'ble Gauhati High Court in the said Civil Rule No:65/94(AB) and allow my said Dissertation to be examined and accordingly award me a Degree of Master of Arts in Education as may be warranted by the marks secured by me in all the 4(four) Semesters, And for this act of kindness I shall ever pray.

Dear Sir,

With reference to the letter cited above whereby I have been asked to explain the queries made by your goodself in your latter No.Ex/PG/Repeat/92-93/1431 dated April 26, 1994, I have to state the following.

1. I am the supervisor of the dissertation of Ms.L.V Zodinpuii and I know that her case was more genuine than the other cases considered by the B.P.G.S and the School Board and she deserved attention on Medical and humanitarian grounds, Therefore the petition sent vide No.MC/Edn-13/93 dated 19.11.93 was submitted with a request to reconsider her case on these grounds.

2. There have been instances in the department in the past where the dissertations submitted by students even after more than five years from the date of admission were processed by the examination department at Shillong and the result of the students was declared. A list of dissertatiopn with the date of their submission is enclosed for your ready reference.

3. The dissertations of M.Ed (two years) which has already been resolved to be equivalent to M.A (Education) were also forwarded beyond six semesters time and these were accepted for evaluation.

4. On my taking over as Head of the Department in Sept. 1988, on personal enquiry from the dealing officer of the examination department at Shillong. I was told that the late submission of dissertations from Mizoram Campus was being allowed as a special case due to the shortage of faculty members in the Department and due to other reasons recorded in the files of the examination Department. The strength of the faculty in the department has rather become more tight then after the exit of Dr. M.A Sudhir. The number of courses which was only six in M.E.d has increased up to sixteen since the 1985 session. Help was taken by the department from Guest teachers to share the teaching load but supervision of dissertations could not be given to them

5. There was thus a precedent of late acceptance of dissertations submitted by the students of this campus who were working under difficult conditions with lack of sufficient facilities. The dissertations were thus forwarded from time to time to the examination department and there has been no communication about the ineligibility of these students. The result of all of them has been declared by the University condoning the delay.

6. The dissertations submitted by the students have thus been forwarded by all the Heads of the department including the present Head, Dr. K. P. Nath. He had forwarded the dissertation of Mr. Lalbia-kchhunga much after the permitted time. Dr. Nath has himself continued supervising dissertations beyond the time limit and has even taken pains to deliver the late submitted dissertations of his students personally at Shillong. It was only when none of his old students were ready to submit their dissertation that he started writing about late submission.

Hope the enclosed list will help you in clarifying the points made by me in para (iii) of my letter MC/Edn-13/93, dated 19.11.93.

I write to appraise you the followings for favour of your sympathetic considerations and for the welfare of the following students of the department.

(i) that Miss Zoengpari and Miss.Lalzarliani were admitted into M.A. Psychology programme in April,1986.

(ii) Both of them have passed in all other courses for their M.A. except completing their dissertation, which is a compulsory requirement for partial fulfilment of the Degree of Master of Arts in Psychology of the University.

(iii) they were attached with Dr.A.N.Jaiswal, the then Reader and Head of the department, and their dissertation copies were accepted in the BPGS meeting, and both of them started working under the supervision of Dr.Jaiswal.

(v) Meanwhile Dr.A.N.Jaiswal was deputed as Deputy Director, NERC-ICSSR, Shillong-14 and he resumed the said charges on May,30/89, and till then the two students could not either submit their dissertations nor Dr.Jaiswal made alternative arrangement with any other teacher in the department for completing their pending dissertations. The students also did not inform the department for further action until recently.

(v) the said students represented their case to the Pro-Vice-Chancellor, NEHU, Mizoram Campus, Aizawl only on dated 23.5.90, which were after Official processing marked to the undersigned.

(vi) the students again started working, for successful completion of their disserteration, under the supervision of the undersigned as it was felt that the students would fail being awarded of their M.A. degrees without the dissertation. Therefore, the undersigned took initiative to help completing the unfinished work left by Dr.Jaiswal. Now the dissertations are ready to be submitted for evaluation.

Under the provisions regulating award of Master's Degree of the University, students are not Ordinarily permitted to persue their courses for more than six semesters duration.
