

The Chairman welcomed all the members of the Council especially the new members viz., Shri S.K. Dutta, Head, Department of Electronic Communication and Engineering, NEHU, Shillong and Prof. D.L. Kharmawphlang, Department of Cultural and Creative Studies, NEHU, Shillong.

Before taking up on the agenda items the Chairman of the Council informed the House that during the visit of the NAAC Team to North-Eastern Hill University, the NAAC Team is pleased to up-grade the University from Grade 'B' to Grade 'A'. The Chairman, as the Vice-Chancellor of the University, congratulated the efforts made by all in making this University achieve this great honour and achievement.

NO:AC:82:2009:5:1:(i): The Council deliberated on the amendment to Clause 6 (i) under Ordinance OC-7 of Regulation RC-5 and after a threadbare discussion on the matter the Council **RESOLVED** to approve the same with minor modification as per Annexure-I.

- (ii) **Ordinance OC-15 on University Academic Calendar.**

NO:AC:82:2009:5:1:(ii): The Council discussed the amendment to Ordinance OC-15 on University Academic Calendar as per the UGC Regulation, 2008

placed before the 81st meeting of the Council which entrusted the work to the Standing Committee on updating NEHU Ordinance and on submission of the Report by the Committee, the Council **RESOLVED** to refer back the matter to the same Committee.

(iii) Ordinance OC-10 on the Convocation under Act-5, (3&5) and 26(1)(d) of the NEHU Act, 1973 read with Statute 34 and 29(1).

NO:AC:82:2009:5:1:(iii): The Council discussed the adoption of UGC Regulation, 2008 for Grant of degrees and other awards by Universities as decided in the 81st meeting of the Council. For the purpose of this Regulation, the Council felt that Ordinance OC-10 be amended on the Convocation and **RESOLVED** to accept the amendments to Ordinances OC-10 as recommended by the Standing Committee on updating of Ordinances and Regulation as per Annexure-II with modifications.

(iv) UGC Regulation on minimum qualifications required for the appointment and Career Advancement of Teachers in Universities and Institutions affiliated to it (3rd amendment), Regulations 2009, and UGC minimum standards and procedure for the award of M.Phil/Ph.D Degree, Regulations 2009.

NO:AC:82:2009:5:1:(iv): The Council considered the UGC Regulation on minimum qualifications required for the appointment and Career Advancement of Teachers in Universities and Institutions affiliated to it (3rd amendment), Regulations 2009, and UGC minimum standards and procedure for the award of M.Phil/Ph.D Degree, Regulations 2009 and **RESOLVED** to accept the same. The Council **RESOLVED** that the course work shall not be required for the students already admitted. The Council further **RESOLVED** that a proposal be prepared by all Heads and Deans and submit to the Standing Committee on Ordinances and Regulations. The report of the Committee shall be placed before the next meeting of the Council for consideration. The Council also discussed the matter related to exemption of Khasi subject from the requirement of the

minimum eligibility condition of NET/SLET for recruitment and appointment of teachers as there are is there is NET/SLET in this subject. A letter to this effect be sent separately to the University Grants Commission. The exemption shall be effective from the day it is approved by the UGC.





Prof. D. Bhattacharjee and Prof. M.S. Bisht, the two faculty members of the Centre, informed that Prof. M.M. Singh, the Head, Centre for Science Education did not convene any meeting of faculty ignoring the requests from them for a meeting. They further said that he did not recognize them as faculty of the Centre. The members expressed their anguish and disapproval of the conduct of Prof. M.M. Singh after hearing the two faculty members of the Centre. Prof. M.M. Singh remained silent throughout the discussion on the matter relating to the non-submission of the annual report of the Centre. Members were of the opinion that the Annual Report 2008-09, which ultimately is placed in the Parliament, should contain the report about the activities of the faculty of the Centre.

It was **RESOLVED** that the faculty members would prepare individual reports of their activities during the period of the report and send it to the Editorial Board through Prof. D. Bhattacharjee. It was further **RESOLVED** that the matter regarding the non-submission of the report of the activities of Centre for inclusion in the Annual Report of the University be placed in the Executive Council for consideration.
