

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MINUTES OF THE EIGHTY-EIGHT MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

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The 88th meeting of the Executive Council was held on the 4th of November, 1995 at 2:00 P.M in the Conference Room, University Guest House, Hawkynroh, Shillong.

Item No. 1 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES :

- (i) Confirmation of the Minutes of the 87th meeting of the Executive Council held on 1.11.95.

No:EC: 88: 95:01: (i): The Minutes of the 87th meeting of the Executive Council were confirmed with the following modifications.

In the Executive Council's Resolution No:EC: 87: 95: 6:01(i) regarding the Rajiv Gandhi Chair for studies in Protective Discrimination constitution of the Search Committee the following paragraph may be added:

"In case Prof.H.K.Borpujari is not available then Prof. Barun De will act as the Chairman and accordingly if the other two members are not available then the other two names in the panel may be called upon to serve as members of the Selection Committee that is, Prof.M.M.Srinivas and Prof.Iqbal Narain.

In the Executive Council's Resolution No:EC: 87: 95: 6: 06: (iv) regarding the 'Recommendation of the Committee on the matter relating to benefits on transfer of service from other bodies/organisations' the following sentence may be added:

Programmes and RESOLVED that for the Orthopaedically handicapped they should have a minimum of 40% of Physical defect or deformity which causes an interference with the normal functioning of the bones, muscles and joints, and a similar criteria adopted from the Government of India Rules may be made for the Deaf, Dumb etc.

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- (ii) Admission criteria for admission to P.G. Departments

No: EC: 88: 95: 5: 1: (ii): The Council considered the admission criteria to the Post-Graduate Programmes and RESOLVED to approve the same as per Appendix-'III'.

No: EC: 88: 95: 5: 6: (i): The Council considered the grant of Provisional Affiliation to Sankardev College for Major in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology and Botany, and RESOLVED to approve the same.

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- (ii) Introduction of a Course on Environment as a compulsory subject at Under-Graduate and Post-Graduate levels.

No: EC: 88: 95: 5: 6: (ii): The Council considered the recommendations of the Academic Council with regard to the introduction of a course on Environment and RESOLVED that for the Post-Graduate Departments a separate course should be serviced by the individual departments with credits and as regards the Under-Graduate levels a course on Environmental Awareness may be framed in lieu of the General Foundation Course and a Committee consisting of the Dean, School of Humanities and Environmental Sciences as Chairman and other co-opted members be constituted for the purpose. The course structure and content for both the Post-Graduate and Under-Graduate levels should be finalised latest by 31.3.1996.

- (i) Affiliation cases approved by the Vice-Chancellor and ratified by the Academic Council.

No: EC: 88: 95: 5: 7: (i): The Council considered the Provisional Affiliation of the following colleges and RESOLVED to approve the same.

1. Synod College, Shillong - Introduction of Major in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany and Zoology.
2. Seng Khasi College, Shillong - Introduction of Major in English, Political Science, Khasi (Elect.), History, Philosophy and Education.
3. Govt. Aizawl College - Introduction of Major in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany, Zoology.
4. T. Romana College - Introduction B.A Pass in English, Economics, Education, History Political Science, Mizo (MIL) & Mizo (Elective)  
- Major - English, Eco, Education, History and Political Science.

- (i) Formula for scaling of marks between Major and non-Major Degree holders for considering admission to the Post-Graduate Programmes.

No: EC: 88: 95: 5: 8: (i): The Council considered the formula for scaling of marks between Major and Non-Major Degree holders for the purpose of admission into the P.G Departments and RESOLVED to accept the guidelines recommended and by the Committee and approved by the Academic Council and also that the formula for Non-Major NEHU students may be made applicable to Non-Major students of other Universities also.

- (ii) Identification of the allied and cognate subjects for constitution of the Board of Post-Graduate Studies.

No: EC: 88: 95: 5: 8: (ii): The Council considered the identification of allied and cognate subjects for constitution of the Board of Post-Graduate Studies and RESOLVED to accept the recommendation of the Academic Council.

- (iii) Eligibility criteria for admission into M.Sc. Forestry Programme.

No: EC: 88: 95: 5: 8: (iii): The Council considered the eligibility criteria for admission into the M.Sc Forestry Programme as recommended by the Academic Council and RESOLVED to include B.Sc with Botany/Forestry/Agriculture as one of the subjects alongwith Diploma in Forestry as a criteria for admission to the M.Sc Forestry programmes.

6:2-Appointment/Creation-upgradation of posts/Confirmation/Extension/Option/Transfer Release/Termination

(i) Re-employment of Teachers-

No:EC:88:95:6:2:(i): The Council considered the comments made by the Academic Council with regard to the re-employment of teachers and RESOLVED that teachers on retirement may be re-employed for a period of 2 years from the date of their retirement ~~by~~ against the post vacated by them.

6:3-Leave/Deputation-

(i) Sabbatical leave in respect of Prof. A.L.Verma,Physics Department,NEHU, Shillong for one year with effect from 1.7.96.

No:EC:88:95:6:3:(i): The Council considered the grant of sabbatical leave for a period of one year with effect from 1.7.96 to Prof.A.L.Verma and RESOLVED to approve the same. The Council also decided that the office should include a Clause on the requirement of executing a bond in the leave sanction order of all such cases.

(ii) Sanction of Sabbatical leave to Dr. R.Sachdeva,Head,Department of Linguistics now on deputation with Nagaland University.

No:EC:88:95:6:3:(ii): The Council considered the grant of Sabbatical leave for a period of one year with effect from 1.12.95 to Dr.R.Sachdeva and RESOLVED to approve the same.

(iii) Sabbatical leave to Dr.N.K.Chrungoo, Department of Botany,NEHU,Shillong.

No:EC:88:95:6:3:(iii): The Council considered the grant of Sabbatical leave for a period of one year with effect from 21.2.96 prefixing winter vacation to Dr.M.K. Chrungoo and RESOLVED to approve the same.

(i) Reservation of accommodation for SC/ST employees in NEHU

No:EC:88:95:6:7:(i): The Council considered the reservation of accommodation for SC/ST employees and RESOLVED that necessary amendments may be made in the Residence Allotment Rules to include the reservation as per Appendix-'V'.

(ii) Recovery of Licence fee from employee of Pachhunga University College.

No: EC: 88: 95: 6: 7: (ii): The Council considered the question of recovery of licence fee from the employees of the Pachhunga University College and RESOLVED that since the quarters being occupied belong to the Government of Mizoram, licence fee as per demand of the Government of Mizoram will have to be paid. However, a letter may go to the Government of Mizoram to waive off the Licence Fee.

Item No. 8 Items from the Chair.

No: EC: 88: 95: 8: (i): The Chairman informed that the Academic Council had recommended that students securing below 45% in a paper may be allowed to improve their marks by appearing for the paper again and the Council RESOLVED to approve the same.

No: EC: 88: 95: 8: (ii): The Chairman also informed the Council that the Academic Council in its last meeting had approved to modify the existing conditions for re-evaluation of Answer Scripts and the Council RESOLVED to approve the recommendations of the Academic Council.

No: EC: 88: 95: 8: (iii): The contents of a letter received from the NEHUTA regarding the re-employment issue was noted by the Council.

No: EC: 88: 95: 8: (iv): The Chairman informed the Council that an anonymous endowment of Rs. 50,000/- (Rupees fifty thousand) only has been received by the University and the Council RESOLVED to accept the Academic Council's recommendations and authorised the Vice-Chancellor to finalise matters as per the Academic Council's decision.

No: EC: 88: 95: 8: (v): The Chairman placed before the Council the Resolutions passed by the Academic Council in the matter of repatriation of the employees of the University from the erstwhile Nagaland Campus and also the setting up of Campuses at Tura and Jaintia Hills and RESOLVED to endorse the Resolution of the Academic Council. The Council, further RESOLVED:--

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- (i) to endorse the resolutions of the Academic Council taken at its 51st meeting held on 2 and 3 November 1995 and to express its concern about the growing uncertainty and indecisiveness regarding the placement of NEHU employees of its erstwhile campuses at Kohima and Medziphema
- (ii) to express its concern about the lack of decision regarding the setting up of a NEHU campus at Tura for want of necessary funds and resources from the Human Resource Development Ministry, the University Grants Commission and the Government of Meghalaya
- (iii) to place on records its sense of bafflement at the indecisiveness of the Government of Meghalaya in respect of the proposed site and requisite land of the College of Agriculture and School of Agricultural Science and Rural Development.
- (iv) to urge the Government of Meghalaya to make necessary land available to NEHU for its proposed campus at Jowai.
- (v) to request the Human Resource Development Ministry and the University Grants Commission to release necessary funds for giving salary and facilities to NEHU employees to be repatriated from its campuses in Nagaland as well as to start the proposed campuses at Tura and Jowai

The Council RESOLVED to request the Chief Rector i.e. the Governor of Meghalaya to kindly use his good offices to help the University get out of its present predicament by impressing upon the Human Resource Development Ministry, the University Grants Commission and the Government of Meghalaya to do all that is needful in this regard.

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No: EC: 88: 95: 8: (vi): The Chairman apprised the Council about the leakage of Confidential matters to the Press/outside Agencies and the Council RESOLVED that a Committee consisting of the following may be appointed to look into the matter and the Vice-Chancellor is authorised to take action on the same.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

1. The number of seats available for admission into each department will depend on infrastructural facilities available.
2. Only those candidates who have passed a Three year Degree Course in the relevant subject shall ordinarily be considered for admission to the Master Degree Course. However, subject to availability of seats upto ten percent of the seats may be assigned to students from other disciplines. The number of seats for other disciplines in the inter-disciplinary subjects, such as Education, Sociology, Anthropology may be increased upto fifty percent subject to availability of seats. It is also provided that if teaching of Honours in a subject has not been sufficiently developed within the jurisdiction of the University, or in any unit in particular, seats in the concerned Departments may be filled in a manner as may be decided by the University.
3. A Candidate with 50% marks in B.Ed. may also apply for Admission to M.A. Education Course only.
4. The distribution of authorised seats to the Post-Graduate Courses in the University shall be as follows:
  - (i) Open Category - 40%
  - (ii) Reserved for SC/ST candidates- 50%
  - (iii) Vice-Chancellor's Quota - 10%
    - (a) Students nominated by the Central Government
    - (b) Unrepresented Backward Areas
    - (c) Physically handicapped
    - (d) Outstanding Sportsmen/Sports-women
    - (e) Children of NEHU Employees
    - (f) Employees with All India Transfer Liability excluding Private Organisations.
    - (g) Donor Non-Resident Indians.

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Note: Applicants under(iii) above are required to submit necessary documents in support of their claims.

5. In determining interse priority from amongst those claiming to hail from backward area the level of Literacy obtaining in that area may be taken as the guiding factor. For outstanding sportsmen/Sports-women, the level of participation at the Inter-University, State or Nationals, within the last three years only shall be taken into account. Proficiency in performing Arts should be supported by suitable documents.
6. Departments will prepare consolidated list of all applicants or the total number of seats authorised by the University, 40% of the seats shall be filled by merit and shall include SC/ST students who by merit can figure in the open list. For the remaining 50% seats, a list of candidates belonging to SC/ST will be prepared and the seats will be filled up from those candidates in order of merit.
7. Any or all of the authorised seats under category(iii) above will stand converted to category(i) if unfilled.
8. Departments may, if they consider necessary, conduct written test/interview for admission to the Post-Graduate Programme in accordance with Ordinance OC-7. Performance of a candidate in the Under-Graduate Course together with eligibility test, if any, shall be taken into consideration while preparing the merit list of students. Weightage for eligibility test/interview shall, however, not exceed 50%.
9. In case of all internal students i.e. students who have graduated from Colleges affiliated to or maintained by the University, the percentage of marks obtained in the subject concerned shall be raised by 10 marks. In case of those candidates who have not offered the subject in the Honours no such weightage shall be given and their marks in the Honours subject without weightage shall be taken into account.

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10. All departments shall constitute Admission Committee and assign them specific responsibility, Students who have already obtained a Master's Degree from the University or any other University, will be considered for admission only if there is any vacancy after considering all eligible candidates seeking first Admission, in respect of such candidates too, the general criteria of marks obtained at Honours/Major level will be considered.
- 11(a) For the purpose of determining the Physical Handicap, they should have a minimum of 40% of Physical or deformity which causes an interference with the normal functioning of the bones, muscles and joints".
- 12(b) A similar provision will be made for the deaf, dumb etc.

RULES FOR ALLOTMENT OF RESIDENCE

EXISTING RULE

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Clause 5.

ALLOTMENT OF RESIDENCE:

Same or otherwise provided in these Rules, the allotment of residence shall be made by the Residence Allotment Committee after observance of the following :

(i) Allotment shall be made strictly according to the "Allotment Seniority" as per Appendix-II.

(ii) No residence of high type shall be allotted to an employees of the University than one is entitled to. However, if one request for a type lower than one's entitlement, one will be considered for allotment for that type of considering one's seniority in the University as per Appendix-II. Provided that if one is allotted a higher quarter may apply for a quarter of a type lower than one's entitlement it may be considered if it does not affect the interest of the employees in the lower cadre who are entitled to that quarter.

(iii) An employees, who is on approved absence may authorise a member of his family or another employee whose name shall be communicated to the administration before the allotment, to comply with the time limit prescribed for acceptance of allotment etc.

(iv) If any employees fails to accept the allotment of residence within fifteen days or fails to take possession of the residence after acceptance within one month from the date of receipt of the letter of allotment, the allotment shall stand automatically cancelled and shall be deemed to have been surrendered by the allottee.

(v) An employee after surrender of an allotted accommodation if entitlement may apply again for another accommodation. However, the allotment seniority of such an employee will be counted from the date of surrender or deemed surrender of the allotment.

ALLOTMENT OF RESIDENCE :
