(ii) Resignation of Shri Rokamlova,
Deputy Registrar, NEHU Mizoram Campus,
Aizawl.

Sri Rokamlova, Principal, Aizawl College, Aizawl on deputation with NEHU as O.S.D. which was subsequently re-designated as Deputy Registrar Mizoram Campus wef 23. .91 has tendered resignation and has been accepted by the Government of Mizoram wef. 4.1.1994. He was relieved from the office of the Deputy Registrar, Mizoram Campus Aizawl wef. 16.2.84. The term of his deputation period of ^{one} year in the first instance expired on 22.9.82. The period of extension upto 4.1.84 is yet to be regularised by the Government of Mizoram.

Dr. Sudhir Kumar, Reader in Education, NEHU, Mizoram Campus has taken over the charge of Deputy Registrar NEHU, Mizoram Campus Aizawl wef. 1.3.84 in addition to his normal duties.

Item No. 3 RATIFICATION OF ACTION TAKEN BY THE
VICE-CHANCELLOR :

- (i) Grant of leave beyond the study leave
 granted to Shri N.K.Sinha, Lecturer,
 Department of Geography, Pachhunga
 University College, Aizawl -

Shri N.K.Sinha, Lecturer, Department of Geography, Pachhunga University College, Aizawl, was granted study leave for a period of one year with effect from 28th September, 1982 by this University to pursue M.Phil Degree on the subject - Policies of Development of Politics Geographical Analysis of Mizoram. However, the M.Phil topic was revised and he had to change the topic of his M.Phil dissertation to "Agricultural Development Policies in Mizoram" which called for additional collection of materials. As such, Shri Sinha had to spend two months 9 days more beyond the one year study leave granted to him. Since the teacher was on study leave in terms of the Ordinance governing leave to teachers the period beyond one year has been treated as study leave for which the Vice-Chancellor, NEHU, has also approved. The teacher has been advised to submit his leave application for the period of over-stay (i.e, 2 months 9 days) beyond the study leave already granted to him.

The matter is placed before the Executive Council for ratification.

- (ii) - Grant of Study Leave to Dr. (Mrs) H. Ila, Reader, Deptt. of Chemistry for the period of 20 (twenty) months w.e.f. 16th August, 84 to 15th April, 1986.

Dr. (Mrs.) H. Ila, Reader, Deptt. of Chemistry, requested study leave for the period of 20 (twenty) months, with effect from 16th August, 1984 to 15th April, 1986, so as to enable her to accept the award of Alexander Humboldt Fellowship at Germany. Her application was forwarded by the University agreeing to the stipulation that she will be granted necessary study leave in case she is selected. The Deans' Committee which met on 10th May, 1984 considered her request for the study leave for the above noted period and recommends granting of study leave to the Executive Council. The application has been duly recommended and forwarded by the Head of the Deptt.

The Deptt. of Chemistry has two professors and four readers (six in all) and all of them are in position. Thus, the stipulations of Ordinance that at any given time 20% of teachers can only be on leave is fulfilled. The teacher has joined the University in 1st May, 1978 and has six years of continuous service to her credit.

The above matter is therefore placed before the Executive Council for ratification.

(ii) Amendment of Ordinance on Service
Conditions of Teachers -

Instances have come to the notice of the University that teachers are claiming/are being paid honorarium for taking classes in Departments other than their own. The University has a School system of which inter-departmental and inter-school collaboration is an integral part. Thus, a teacher who takes classes in any Department within the School or outside the School, will only be performing the duty assigned to him which forms part of his normal duties and, therefore, no honorarium can be claimed for taking such classes.

In the light of above, the provision of the Ordinance on Service Conditions may be made specific to have the following proviso under relevant Clause. The existing Clause, proposed amendment and Clause after amendment is given in Annexure - 2 for the consideration of the Executive Council.

- (i) To consider creation of the post of
Director of Publications in NEHU -

It has been more than a year now since the NEHU Publications came into existence with the objective of undertaking printing of text books under the Foundation Course. The Department has already published 7 text books and has undertaken production of two regular publications, viz., the NEHU News (monthly) and the NEHU Journal of Social Sciences & Humanities (quarterly). There are now 6 text books in the press and 10 more will be sent for printing soon. Moreover, the University is considering publication of several monographs concerning socio-cultural and economic aspects of the north-eastern region.

In view of the ever increasing work load, the Publication Cell requires to be headed by a full-time Director of Publications. Since inception, Prof. J.B.Bhattacharjee of the History Department has been shouldering the responsibilities of the Publication Department as the Honorary Professor-In-Charge and he now wants to be relieved of this additional work in order to be able to devote his time to his own assignment as Professor of History.

The Executive Council may, therefore, consider the creation of the post of Director of Publications, NEHU in the scale of pay of Rs 1500 - 2000 p.m. or in the Professor's scale.

The Executive Council may also consider the case of Shri M.C.Gabriel, (3-6-19 West Marredpally, Secunderabad- 26, AP) who has applied for the post of the Director of Publications, NEHU. He expects a salary around Rs 2,200/- in the Professor's scale and wants to have a quarter, if available. Shri Gabriel is also desirous to start a Department of Communication Programme in the University covering Journalism, techniques of writing and spoken English and creative writing courses for which he claims to have experience. He expects a fixed allowance for this additional work, if and when allotted to him.

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From the enclosed Bio-Data (Annexure - 3) of Shri Gabriel, it appears that he will attain 58 years on 8th August, 1984. An M.A. in History of Osmania University, Shri Gabriel served as a Lecturer in various institutions and as Editor in three leading publishing houses of the country, in which capacity he must have acquired profound knowledge in the subject of book production and distribution. In view of his age, he may, perhaps, be appointed on contract basis for two years to begin with and on a fixed salary.

The matter is submitted for the consideration of the Executive Council.

- (iii) Permanent absorption of Shri W.B.Khongwir, as Office Superintendent (since re-designated as Section Officer) in this University with effect from 1st August, 1982 -

Shri W.B.Khongwir, former Superintendent, Office of the Deputy Director, Backward Classes Welfare, Shillong, has been on deputation to this University with effect from 1st February, 1975(FN) for utilisation of his services as Office Superintendent. The case of his permanent absorption in this University has been taken up with his parent Department several times and finally it has been proposed that Shri Khongwir be permanently absorbed in this University with effect from 1st August, 1982(FN). Shri Khongwir has also given his consent for permanent absorption in this University.

As desired by the Vice-Chancellor, the case is put up to the Executive Council for consideration.

- (iv) Release of Dr. P.O. Alexander, Reader Department of Geology, NEHU, Kohima, Nagaland.

Dr. P.O. Alexander, Reader, Department of Geology, NEHU, Kohima, requested the Vice-Chancellor, vide his letter dated 24.4.84, to be released from his post w.e.f. 8.5.84. The Vice-Chancellor had agreed to release him on humanitarian grounds, and Dr. Alexander has since left the Campus.

Further, Dr. Alexander has requested one month's salary as compensation for the one month's salary he had to forfeit due to inadequate notice period in his parent department at the time of his leaving. This has been approved by Vice-Chancellor and correspondence with his parent department has been initiated for finalising his substantive pay and allowances admissible in the post held before joining NEHU.

Dr. Alexander has requested for a basic salary of Rs.1650/- p.m. and not Rs. 1480/- plus Rs. 180/- as personal allowance.

The letter dated 30th April 1984 received from Dr. Alexander is placed at Appendix-

Dear Sir,

Your telegram dated 27th April, 1984 has been received by me. With reverence to the same, I wish to point out the following:

1. On the basic salary of Rs. 1660.00, I was offered the appointment by NEHU only telegraphically. No letter of regular appointment followed neither the terms of appointment specified neither the terms and conditions of services and my acceptance have been exchanged. Further, the appointment as per your order is purely on Probation for a period of one year (F.18-98/Estt.II/84-1784).
2. The statute para 27 is not applicable to me as I am only on probation with lien on my permanent post at my parent University. To this day, NEHU has not deducted any contributory P.F. nor paid to my C.P.F. account at University of Saugar which I will continue to pay from my income. This only proves that I am not a permanent employee of NEHU. AS such the notice given by me on 14.4.1984 is legally adequate for my being relieved and three months notice desired by NEHU is uncalled for.

Coming to the points of promises and agreement not fulfilled by NEHU and for which I have been reminding the honourable authorities please note the following:

- i) A telegram by which I was offered a basic salary of Rs. 1660/- has not been fulfilled till this day. After reporting on duty on 11th Feb. 84 and protracted reminders only, NEHU sent an appointment letter stating my basic salary fixed at Rs. 1480.00 + Rs. 180.00 as a personal allowance. There is world of difference for an employee between these two contrasting terms: one informed telegraphically and the other sent more than one month after the employee joined NEHU in good faith. On this count alone (violation of given promise by NEHU), I am justified in resigning without any notice whatsoever.

Contd....

ii) In the post advertised, NEHU promised free furnished accommodation. In spite of my two and half months stay I do not see any hope of a decent accommodation for my family in the immediate or the near future. On this count, again NEHU has violated the agreement in letter and spirit of the advertised terms of appointment. What more, even after knowing that I was to come with my family, fully aware that there is no family accommodation available at Kohima, it was NEHU's duty to inform me not to bring my family. By God's grace sense prevailed and I myself changed my plan and preferred to come alone. I dread to think the problems and hardships that my family would have faced had we come together (like few others who are already facing). This again is a sufficient reason for me to resign. If NEHU is not in a position to fulfil what it says, it will be far better that they don't give any promise to people who take up the challenge of coming from far-off places to help build academic institutions.

iii) I am sure you would like to consider the relationship of the employer and the employee before giving me relieving order with immediate effect as can be authorised by the executive council under NEHU statutes, for consideration of which I giving the following points:

* I have completed all the courses for the first semester of teaching in Petrology and parts of mineralogy. These I have done as a special duty towards the students by taking several hours during the day. I did this as I was fully aware that I would not be in Kohima during 1st week of May to August 1984 and so was NEHU.

** Even before my joining, NEHU was fully aware that I was to leave for USA under the UGC sponsored Indo-US fellowship programme (for example my letter dated 1.11.83 and several others). Infact NEHU vide their letters (NEHU/VCF-82/83-203 Nov.30,83 and -238, Jan 84) not only expressed their happiness in sponsoring me but also wrote to the UGC.

This is a convincing proof that NEHU was fully aware of my non-availability for teaching during May-August 1984. If I wanted to be dishonest and if I had no concern for the department and the students, I could have sent my resignation from USA. By declaring my intentions of not returning to Kohima after my visit to USA, I have just been honest and there by I have given sufficient notice to NEHU to make alternative arrangements for which NEHU should be obliged.

*** In two of his letters (for example NEHU/VCF-18-1/84-238), the honourable V.C. asked me to join as early as possible. I expressed my problem of surrendering one month's salary to my parent university if I came as early as Feb.15. NEHU promised me that they would be seriously considering compensating my one month's salary in such an event. And when I have come and been here for three months, till this day NEHU has been most inconsiderate in not compensating my one month's salary. It will not be out of place to mention that for me its a very big amount and suffience to cause economic and mental pressure. It is very strange that instead of giving me my dues NEHU is taking pleasure in harrasing me by quoting statues irrelevant to my terms of appointment which is on probation.

**** No one would have taken this unfortunate and drastic desision causing me monetary loss, returning to the parent department back again on lecturer's post, delay or even perhaps sacrificing Indo/US fellowship programme and physical and mental torment. Obviously, there are strong reasons for my resignation which I shall write upon after leaving Nagaland.

In view of the afore said, I again make my last plea to NEHU administration to grace me with relieving order without further delay. It would be greatly appreciated if instead of causing harrasment to me all my dues (one month's salary, a basic salary, of Rs. 1660/- and my joining T.A., which is not paid so far) are paid at your earliest.

The College of Agriculture established on 29th May, 1978 has the following teaching and supporting staff placed at Annexure - 'A'. The Principal, College of Agriculture has intimated that due to increased number of students year after year and in the absence of adequate staff in the Finance & Accounts Section and Academic Cell of the College, two Professor-in-charge has been engaged in each of the above Section to look after the works in addition to their normal duties, and has requested and proposed an Honorarium of Rs 250/- to each of the Professor-in-charge.

In view of the above, it may be considered if a post of Vice-Principal, College of Agriculture could be created and appointed in the Reader's scale of pay Rs 1200 - 1900/- plus Rs 200/- as special pay to assist the Principal in the day to day function for the smooth running of the College.

I seek this opportunity of placing a few facts for your kind and sympathetic consideration.

I joined my duties as Controller of Examinations in the grade of Rs. 1500-2000/- in the forenoon of 3rd April '84 after retaining my lien as Deputy Registrar in H.P. University, Shimla. On the basis of LFC submitted by me, my pay has been fixed at Rs. 1680.00 p.m. probably under F.R. 22(C).

Reproduced below are the emoluments that I was drawing and that I will be drawing.

While at H.P.U., the rate of C.P.F. was 10% of Pay+DP+DA and thus a sum of Rs. 260.00 p.m. was being deducted from my salary. The University was subscribing equivalent amount and thereafter 10% interest.

NEHU rules provide for $8\frac{1}{3}\%$ of Pay+DP only. This will result into a recurring loss of Rs. 200.00 p.m. approximately.

While at Shimla I was staying in a house allotted by the University and I was paying a total rent of Rs. 115.00 p.m. plus Rs. 400.00 which was my entitlement of house rent. Since I have not been allotted any residential accommodation here for want of same, I have no alternative but to have a house on rent and I have not been able to locate any house for less than Rs. 1000.00 p.m. against which I will be reimbursed Rs. 160.00 p.m. approximately.

Sir, it may kindly be recalled that at the time of interview I had requested for protection of my salary by indicating the same on the form I was asked to fill up.

I shall feel extremely grateful if I am relieved of my financial hardship. Had the loss been of negligible amount I would not have wasted your precious time but would have continued to do my duties, with all sincerity and earnestness at my command, without it.

REQUEST FOR STUDY LEAVE FROM
DR. R.L. WALLI, READER, DEPTT.
OF POLITICAL SCIENCE.

Dr. R.L. Walli, Reader, Deptt. of Political Science has submitted an application for grant of study leave for a period of three years beginning from March 85. He has stated that he will utilise the period of study leave to work on a project concerning a topic within the field of international relations. He has further requested the University that the study leave to be granted to him for the three year period may be on full salary.

Dr. Walli joined the university in Feb., 75 and has a little over nine years of continuous service to his credit. He is thus eligible to avail study leave. Further, the deptt. of Political Science has one professor and three readers and all of them are in position. The stipulation of the Ordinance that at any given time 20% of teachers (for this purpose, professors and readers have to be taken as one unit) can only be on leave may be taken as fulfilled, since the deptt. has a strength of only four teachers at professors/readers' level.

The application of Dr. Walli has duly been recommended by the School Board and also by the Head of the Deptt. The Ordinance on Study Leave stipulates that a teacher can get full pay in the first year, half pay in the second year and no pay thereafter. So there is no provision in the Ordinance for drawing full salary for the entire period of three years as requested by the teacher.

The matter is placed before the Executive Council for their consideration.

(iii) Extension of Study leave of Dr. D.T. Khathing,
Lecturer, Deptt. of Physics, NEHU.

Dr. D.T. Khathing, Lecturer, Deptt. of Physics, was granted Study leave for a period of 2 (two) years with effect from 15.2.82 to 14.2.84 for undergoing further studies at the Atomic Energy Research Establishment, Harwell, U.K. under the National Overseas Scholarship awarded by the Govt. of India.

The above leave was duly extended for a further period of 2 (two) months with effect from 15.2.84 to 14.4.84 and the above extension is yet to be ratified by the Executive Council.

Dr. Khathing has once again requested for extension of his study leave will be end of July 1984 to enable him to complete his work on a new 'X' Ray System. The Head of the Department has duly recommended extension of the study leave.

Clause 10 (vi) (a) of the Ordinance provides that study leave may be granted on full pay for the first year half pay on the Second year and no pay there after.
