- (ix) Technical resignation tendered by Dr.S.Satpathy,Reader,Department of English.

The Executive Council vide resolution No.EC:93:97:3:(iv) held on 15.7.97,approved the grant of lien to Dr.S.Satpathy,Reader,Department of English,NEHU, Shillong, for a period of 2 years,w.e.f. 1.4.97 to enable him to take up an assignment as Reader at Delhi University,in which his application was duly forwarded by NEHU.

Consequent upon the confirmation of his service at Delhi University,w.e.f 2.4.1997 vide ANNEXURE-I, Dr.S.Satpathy in his letter dated 14.2.2000 ANNEXURE-II, tendered his resignation from the post of Reader,Deptt. of English,NEHU,Shillong w.e.f.2.4.97 and has requested to transfer his service to Delhi University.

Dr.S.Satpathy was released from NEHU retaining lien for 1 year w.e.f. 31.3.97(A.N).Since he was confirmed at Delhi University,w.e.f. 2.4.97, the two days period i.e. 31.3.97 and 1.4.97 is being regularised and granted Earned Leave,Since Dr.Satpathy has no dues outstanding,the technical resignation tendered by him w.e.f. 2.4.97, has been accepted by the Vice-Chancellor.

(ix) TIME BARRED TA/DA  
CLAIMS OF THE BSIC OFFICIALS.

The officials listed at Annexure 'A' who had drawn TA/DA advances submitted the final claims after a lapse of more than one year. The Finance Department could not entertained the bills ~~with~~ of the official concerned as they failed to prefer the claims within a period of one year. Reminders were served to the concerned officials directing them to refund the advance so drawn failing which the same will be recovered from their salary bills. Their response, attributing to the delay are appended against their names, *at Annexure 'A'*

According to Govt. of India orders No.F.5(16)  
-E IV (B)67 dated 18th October, 1967 :-

(2) Disposal of belated claims :- If the T.A claim is not preferred by the administrative authority concerned for payment within one year from the date of its becoming due, it shall not be paid unless the reasons for delay are investigated in details by the authority competent to sanction and if the investigations shows that the claim could not be preferred in time due to administrative delay without adequate and cogent reasons, suitable action may be taken against the officer(s) concerned so that delay do not recur in future.

The reasons attributed by the officials are placed before the Council for consideration of condoning the delay in submission of the time-barred T.A claims.


The Committee elected Prof. MS Sangma as the Chairman.


The Committee considered the Representation made by some of the teachers of the University in connection with the addition of Clause 3 (iii) to Regulation RE-6 which allows a teacher of the University to be a member of the Parliament, Legislative Assembly and District Council for a maximum period of ten years during their entire service career. The Committee examined the original Regulation in letter and spirit and observed the following :


The original Regulation allows a teacher to be a member of Parliament/ Legislative Assembly/District Council without taking Extra Ordinary Leave provided he is involved in teaching and other academic activities in the Department. He has an option either to take Extra Ordinary Leave or not to take Extra Ordinary Leave. However, if he is appointed to an executive post, it is mandatory on his part to take Extra Ordinary Leave.

The Committee therefore recommends that a teacher while being a member of either of these bodies does not take Extra Ordinary Leave and continues to involve himself in his normal duties as a teacher there may not be any restriction in terms of the number of years for which a teacher may be a member of such bodies. However, in case he takes Extra Ordinary Leave while being a member or he is required to take Extra Ordinary Leave while he is in executive post, the period of Extra Ordinary Leave, so allowed, should not exceed ten years in his entire career as a teacher in this University.
