

iv) - Ph.D. Registration case of Ms. Haimanti Ghosh, Department of Economics under Old Ordinance.

Miss. Haimanti Ghosh, Ph.D. Scholar under Old Ordinance in the Department of Economics was provisionally registered on 18-11-93 and finally registered on 29-4-95 under the supervision of Dr. K. Bez. The date of submission falls due on 18-11-97.

Miss. Ghosh informed in her letter dated 12.3.96 (Annexure-A) that after the retirement of her supervisor, Dr. K. Bez, she has been placed under the supervision of Dr. Srivastava and due to some unavoidable reason she would like to apply for fresh registration under the new ordinance. The application of the scholar was forwarded by the Dean, School of Economics, Management and Information Sciences, with a comment that automatic switching over is not possible and the candidate should go through all the formalities which are required for registration under the New Ordinance. (Annexure-B).

The Dean, School of Economics, Management and Information Sciences was informed with a copy to the concerned Scholar, that her request cannot be considered, since the submission of the thesis is still within the stipulated period. (Annexure-C).

Again, the scholar has submitted an application dated 15.7.96 stating that there is none to guide her on the topic. (Annexure - D). The application of the Scholar was forwarded by the Dean of the School of Economics, Management and Information Sciences, with his comments which is placed at Annexure-E, and the request of the scholar has been placed by the Dean to the School Board of Economics, Management and Information Sciences held on 14.11.96 and the School Board vide Annexure-F, Resolved that the matter be placed to Vice-Chancellor to break deadlock under removal of difficulties as per provision of Ordinance Annexure (G).

Ms. Haimanti Ghose was registered for her Ph.D. (topic :
Econometric Analysis of Demand for Electricity in Meghalaya) in the
Department of Economics under the supervision of Prof. K. Bez, who
retired in December 1995.

The Final Registration No. of Ms. H. Ghose is 733 of 29.4.95.

Ms. Ghose wrote an application to Head, Department of
Economics requesting for change of supervisor.

The Department of Economics considered her application in DRC
meeting held on 8.3.96 where it was decided that since the Department
may not provide Ms. H. Ghose a supervisor on the topic of her regis-
tration, the DRC and the Head, Department of Economics would look
into the possibility of Ms. Haimanti Ghose pursuing her Ph.D. with
a fresh topic under the Old Ordinance.

Consequently Ms. Ghose applied for fresh registration under
New Ordinance, which was forwarded to the Registrar by the Dean,
SEMIS, letter No.F.11/SEMIS/Ph.D/Eco/196-11 dated 22.3.96.

Also kindly refer to the letter No.G.26-3/Acad/94/H.Ghose/
Econ/8154 dated 30.3.96, in which the Deputy Registrar (Acad) has
noted that since the submission of the thesis is still within the
stipulated period, the request of Ms. Ghose for fresh registration
under the New Ordinance is regretted.

With this background I have to put up the following points before you for your kind and compassionate consideration keeping the interest of the student in mind.

- I. Ms. Ghose was registered finally on 29.4.95 (with effect from 18.11.93) under the supervision of Prof. K. Bez.
- II. Prof. K. Bez retired in 1995 and the Department of Economics could not provide her with a new supervision on her topic of research registered under final registration.
- III. According to prevailing Ordinance on research, the final registration topic of Ph.D. cannot be changed.
- IV. No supervisor in the Department proposes to supervise her on her final topic of registration.
- V. As per letter No.G.26-3/Acad/94/H.Ghose/Econ/8154 dated 30.3.96, Ms. Ghose cannot obtain fresh registration under New Ordinance with a fresh topic.

Here is exactly a dead lock, She cannot pursue her old topic (which she is finally registered with) since there is none to supervise her. She cannot get fresh registration on new topic since the submission of her registered topic thesis is still within the stipulated period that end on 18.11.97.

Further more, there is no provision in the ordinance directing how can a registered Ph.D. student cancel his/her registration so that he/she is free to obtain a fresh registration if he/she desires to do so.

This is a very peculiar situation. In the interest of the student this deadlock must be broken and some definite decision is to be taken.

Sir, I request you to consider this matter compassionately and find a solution, That an appeal be made to you, is the resolution of our School Board.

I would suggest that a finally registered Ph.D. student may have a right to cancel his/her registration and a right to register with new topic of research, under special circumstances as the present one.

Sir, I hope you will do the needful to solve this problems referring to the clause of removal of difficulties in this regard.

In pursuance of resolution NO: A/C:42:94:5:01(iv) and EC 84:94:05:1(ii) adopted at the 49th meeting of the Academic Council and 85th meeting of the Executive Council meeting respectively, the department of Forestry, NEHU, Mizoram Campus is assigned temporarily to the School of Life Sciences consequent upon the non-operation of the School of Agricultural Sciences & Forestry under this University.

In this connection I have to request you that degree of M.Sc & Ph.D. in Forestry must be awarded from School of Agricultural Sciences & Forestry. It is essential because ICAR and Indian Council of Forestry research & Education do not consider M.Sc/Ph.D holder from general Science discipline in the appointment of Faculty staff and Scientists at entry point, and also at technical posts like Sr. Technical Assistant and extension Officer.

Moreover Agricultural scientist Recruitment Board (ASRB) conducts the examination for the recruitment of Scientists in Agroforestry and Forestry.

It is prudent to mention that, if the degree of M.Sc/Ph.D in Forestry is awarded from School of Life Sciences, than the Career of the students will be at stake and they may face difficulties in getting job/Promotions in department of Agriculture, Deptt. of Horticulture, department of Forest, Deptt. of Soil & Water Conservation etc. in the State Governments.

I therefore, request you to kindly take necessary steps for the award of degree under SASAF.

iii) M.A. Syllabus of Hindi.

The School Board of Humanities and Education in its meeting held on 20.10.97 resolved to approve the M.A. Syllabus (Third and Fourth semester) of Hindi Deptt. for the time being in view of the fact that the third semester courses are being currently taught. However suggestion from Prof. N. Malla, Prof. P. P. Gokulanathan and Prof. (Mrs) M. S. padma are as follows:

1. Relating to Hindi syllabus

In lieu of 'History of Sanskrit Literature' either an advance course in Hindi Linguistic and 'Social and Cultural History of India' can be introduced.

2. Course 302: Total marks to be indicated as 100 instead of 753. Course 303

It requires greater detail since it is not very clear as to whether:-

- i) all the students should study the same two topics.
- ii) the students is expected to write one essay, for example (Literature) as a whole or a specific aspect like 'Social problem discussed in Literature', 'Contribution of women towards Hindi Prose' etc., is to be elaborated. Detailed specifications are to be indicated.
- iii) The No.2 topic: The History of Hindi Literature is exactly the same as the main title of the courses 302 and 402.

Also, it may be noted that the reference and reading materials are to be indicated.

4. Course 403:

The course is titled as special study. Therefore the following issues may be made clear:

- i) Is it a group of optional papers?
- ii) or is it one common paper? Then, are the students required to study or write's (out of five indicated) according to their own choice? In such a case, how are they to be taught or guided?

Alternatively, is it that one out of five writers (as indicated in the course) is selected by the Department each year and a special study is made on that writer?

- iii) For each of the writers the specific works on which the students may be examined are to be spelt out.

5. Course 404:

The course No. 404 on History and Sanskrit appears as compulsory course. This may be replaced by some other more relevant course having direct bearing on the study of Hindi. The study of some other course relevant to the study of modern Indian Languages may be considered as an alternative.

6. The courses as put forth for 3rd and 4th semesters do not have any course on 'Environment'. It may be checked whether such a course is present in the syllabus for 1st. and 2nd. Semester.

The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.

iv) Modified Syllabus in M.Sc.(Forestry).

The School Board of Life Sciences in its meeting held on the 3rd November, 1997 considered and approved the modified Syllabus in M.Sc.(Forestry). The modified Syllabus is placed at Annexure-'A' for consideration of the Academic Council.

- (ii) Percentage of marks to be insisted upon in the qualifying examination for admission in the 3 year as well as 5 year law courses.

The Bar Council of India has issued a Circular incorporating a criteria for admitting students into the LL.B. Programme. The said Circular is reproduced below for kind information and consideration of the Council.

Copy of the circular No.Le(Cir)No.3/1997 dated 19th September, 1997 issued by the Secretary, Bar Council of India, 21 Rouse Avenue, Institutional Area, New Delhi-110002.

Subject:- Percentage of marks to be insisted upon in the qualifying examination for admission in the 3 year as well as 5 year law courses.

The following are the rules of the Bar Council of India in Part IV relating to the minimum qualifications prescribed by the Bar Council of India for admission in the three year as well as 5 year law courses:-

I. Rule 2(1) (a) In Part IV, Section-A (Re.5 year law course)

- (a) That at the time of joining the course of instruction in law for a degree in law, the person concerned has passed an examination 10+2 or 11+1 course of schooling recognised by the educational authority of Central or State Governments or possesses such academic qualifications which are considered equivalent to 10+2 or 11+1 courses by the Bar Council of India."

II. Rule 1(1) (a) In Part IV Section-B (3 year law course)

That at the time of joining the course of instruction in law for a degree in law, he is a graduate of a University or possesses such academic qualifications which are considered equivalent to a graduate's degree of a University by the Bar Council of India.

At the meeting of the Bar Council of India held on 10th and 11th February, 1996 it was resolved vide Resolution No.1/1996 that the following percentage of marks should be strictly insisted upon for admission in the 3 year as well as 5 year law courses:-

"If there is entrance test, the percentage should be 40 but if there is no entrance test, the percentage should be 45 for LL.B. admission."

All the Universities imparting Legal Education are directed to follow the above requirement strictly and also ask the colleges imparting LL.B. degree courses to follow the requirement with immediate effect.

Therefore, the NEHUSU being the sole recognised student body of the University would hereby place a request for inclusion of its nominee to the Academic Council.

We are aware, that as per Ordinance, our request is inconsistent. But due to the change circumstances and responsibilities assigned and expected of the NEHUSU, we request you to kindly address this issue at the next Academic Council meeting. Towards this end, we feel it is imperative that the existing Ordinance be suitably modified and altered to facilitate the inclusion of the NEHUSU's representative in the Academic Council.

The Union would like to reiterate that it does not object to the stipulation whereby only Academic meritorious students are designated to represent the students community. It would be highly conducive if you could kindly facilitate the join inclusion of both the meritorious students as well as the nominee of the NEHUSU, a students representative body that is recognised both by the authorities and has the mandate of the students in general.
