- iv) Violation of Ordinance for M Phil/Ph D programme in the Department of Philosophy.

The Council vide its resolution No:EC:105:99:5:1(viii) has considered the recommendation of the Committee appointed by the Academic Council to look into the allegation of violation of the M Phil/Ph D Ordinances in the Department of Philosophy and has RESOLVED to accept the recommendations of the Committee and the Academic Council that the matter be treated as closed. The Council has further considered the request of Prof N Malla to forward a complaint from him to the Visitor and RESOLVED that since the complaint relates to the decision and conduct of the Academic Council and also the findings of the Inquiry Committee his complaint may first be placed before the Academic Council for its views, Meanwhile a copy of his complaints may also be sent to the Inquiry Committee for its comments.

In this connection, as desired by the Council, the views of the Academic Council is placed at Annexure-'A' for favour of perusal.

The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.

AC:64:2000:6:7:(ii): The Council also took up for discussion the representation by Professor Malla addressed to the Visitor. The representation was earlier considered by the Executive Council which had decided that since the matter pertained to the Academic Council it should be referred back to the latter.

The Council considered the representation in detail and made the following comments:

No comments on points 1 and 2 of the representation.

The allegations made at points 3,4,5,6,9,10,11,12 are the same as the allegations which Professor Malla had repeatedly brought to the Academic Council and the Enquiry Committee constituted to enquire into these allegations found them to be entirely baseless.

Point 8 of the representation is a serious and deliberate misinterpretation of the Academic Council resolution. The Academic Council expressed its unhappiness not about the fact that allegations of violation of Ordinances etc. of the University were brought to its notice, but about the fact that Prof. Malla had repeatedly brought groundless allegations of such violation to the highest Academic body of the University.

On point 13 of the representation the Council unanimously expressed its faith in the fairness of the Chairman of the Council, and reiterated its acceptance of the Enquiry Committee Report.

The Council RESOLVED that Professor Malla's representation may be returned to the Executive Council for necessary action.
