2. Darlalpuui a Drama by Lalchungnunga and Sangi Inleng by Lalthangfala Sailo were also reviewed. It was pointed out that there have been some historical inconsistencies and suppression of historical facts. However, it was clarified that such suppression of actual historical contexts have been very common in Drama and fiction. The Board, nonetheless, expresses its desire that authors in future may kindly be cautious in using contexts having historical perspectives if the literature are to be included as one of the texts.

3. A particular section from Thu Hla Ril, a literacy Criticism compiled by Dr. Laltluangliana Khiangte, received critical evaluation from one of the members. It was decided that Dr. Laltluangliana Khiangte may kindly review the specific portion.

IV. Appointment of Examiners for Papers IV and VIII of the Honours Course, both English papers, was also discussed. It was decided to bring the matter to the Controller of Examinations by insisting that Examiners may be appointed only from the list approved by the BUGS in Mizo in its meeting on April 20, 1995, and not from outside the list.

1) Scaling formula between the Major and Non-Major Degree holders etc.

With effect from 1996 admissions the University had worked out a scaling formula between the Major and Non-Major Degree holders for determining the interse priority for purpose of admission to the P.G. Programmes.

In the process of implementation of the scaling formula, among others, the following querries have been received, for which administrative decisions have been made for overcoming the situations but it is felt necessary for the Academic Council to take conscious decisions on these for future practice.

a) The existing practice of 10% weightage to NEHU candidates is applicable only to the Major/Honours passed candidates. It makes no mention of the general candidates who through the scaling method may come within the zone of consideration for admission to the P.G. programmes. The Academic Council, may therefore, like to make a conscious principle decision that the 10% weightage applicable to NEHU candidates is admissible to all candidates passing out from NEHU, irrespective of the stream, course, class/division.

b) Querries have also been received as to what would be the cut-off points(marks) for purpose of admission. The scaling formula, being applied, hinges on the premise that any candidate who has passed Degree Course, irrespective of whether it is Major, General or Honours is admissible to P.G. Programmes in principle. The Academic Council may like to take a conscious decision that in principle any of these categories of candidates is eligible for admission to the P.G. programmes or otherwise.

c) Further querries have been made as to the stage when the reservation policy of the University should be applied. The reservation policy of the University for admission should perhaps be applied when merit list of the applications received for admission after suitable scaling and suitable weightage to the NEHU candidates are made. The Academic Council may like to take a conscious decision on the subject for clarity.

d) Again some querries have been made, particularly from the Departments having a large number. of applicants from Major/Honours stream itself, whether it is incumbent on them to apply the scaling formula for consideration of the rest of the candidates.

It is felt that since it is a policy decision of the University to consider such applicants for purpose of admission, irrespective of any prevailing condition, it should be incumbent on each department to apply the scaling method before final admissions are finalised. The Academic Council may, therefore, make a conscious decision that the system is not judged as desirable or optional system but as a system which is mandatory.

- e) The rush for admissions this year resulted in a great number of even First Class candidates from NEHU not getting admission into the P.G. Programmes leading to much discontentment. As the problems are expected to be more acute and critical in the coming years, it is felt necessary for the University to consider raising the NEHU weightage from 10 to 15.
- f) For the candidates applying under Unrepresented Backward Areas, the University has been taking the level of literacy obtaining in that area for determining the interse priority among such applicants. The words 'level of literacy obtaining in that area' being rather undefined and ambiguous, for clarity the University may consider taking the literacy level of the concerned Block as the index point, to be issued by the concerned Deputy Commissioner of the Place.
- g) Students nominated by the Central Government is another category of candidates eligible under V.C's quota, which is undefined and ambiguous. It is suggested for clarity that the nominating authority for such cases be the Ministry of Human Resource Development. We've been receiving nominations from Member of Parliament, which if unhindered are likely to create complications in due course.
- h) For consideration of employees with All India Transfer Liability excluding Private Organisations under V.C's quota, it may be defined whether it is for employees or children of employees. For this category too only nominations from the Central Ministry for personnel may be considered.

The Academic Council may consider the above proposals for decision and inclusion in the Admission Prospectus for 1997.

1) Opening of School for Studies of Spiritual and Moral Values. -----

Sometime in 1985 on the proposal of the North East India Christian Council, the Academic Council in its 25th meeting held on 17.12.85 while considering the proposal felt that a Centre for Comparative Religion may be established with its basic thrust on Christianity. The Council also constituted a Committee under the Chairmanship of Prof.M. Miri with Prof.B.Pakem and Shri H.W.T. Syiem as member to look into the matter.

The Report of the Committee was placed before the Academic Council in its 27th meeting held on 30.8.86. The Council resolved to establish a School of spiritual and moral values in the University with two Departments, namely Department of Christian Studies and Department of Traditional Religions.

The decision of the Academic Council was thereafter placed before the Executive Council in its 53rd meeting held on 4.9.86. However, the Council felt that more indepth study may be made and a Committee may be constituted for the purpose. It authorised the Vice-Chancellor and the Pro-Vice-Chancellor, Nagaland Campus to constitute a Committee.

## DEPARTMENT OF CHRISTIANITY

IN THE

NORTH EASTERN HILL UNIVERSITY, SHILLONG

## INTRODUCTION

The discussion for the possibility of establishing a Department of Christianity has been going on in the North East India Christian Council for the last six years (since 1979). The first formal contact was made with the Vice-Chancellor of NEHU on October 15, 1985 and a verbal proposal was presented to him by the Expert Committee appointed and authorised by the North East India Christian Council. The Vice-Chancellor accepted it with an open and enthusiastic gesture. He further suggested to the Committee to work out details of the Objectives so that he would take up this matter with the Academic Council of the University for necessary action. In pursuance of this, the Expert Committee submits this paper.

Indian Universities normally do not have departments of religion because India is a secular country. However, academic study of Hindu religion is being pursued in the Department of Philosophy in many universities in India. Studies of Hinduism, Sikhism and Islam are offered in some universities as in Banaras Hindu University, Punjab University, Aligarh Muslim University and Osmania University. Madurai Kamraj University has recently instituted a Chair on Saiva Siddhanta (a Hindu religious system). No scope has so far been opened for an interdisciplinary academic study on Christianity

or Christian Theology in any Indian University. The Senate of Serampore College which is recognised as a University status in granting degrees guaranteed by a Royal Charter (1827 and 1845, rev. 1951) and the Bengal Act No. IV of 1918, is the only institution where an academic study of Christianity and Christian Theology can be done on a professional and ministerial level.

The University of Mysore instituted a Department of Christianity from the academic year 1981-82. It is now possible to earn an officially recognised degree in Christianity at the University of Mysore. Tamilnadu Christian Council is now negotiating with the Madurai Kamaraj University to institute a Chair in Christianity. It is only right to say that the present negotiation of the North East India Christian Council with NEHU is a step-forward in the life of the Church in North East India.

#### INSTITUTION OF A DEPARTMENT OF CHRISTIANITY AT NEHU

To initiate the programme, the appropriate University authorities be approached to institute a Department of Christianity and get the main objectives (will become as statutes eventually) approved for this purpose. The aim is to have a full fledged Department in the University. Initially this may be established at the post-graduate level of degree courses leading to M.A., M.Phil., and Ph.D. The under-graduate B.A. degree course (both pass and honours) may also be introduced in some selected Colleges, for example, Union Christian College, Barapni, Patkai Christian College, Dimapur; Synod College, Shillong etc.

## THE MAIN OBJECTIVES OF THE DEPARTMENT

1. To study Christianity with comparative study of other Indian religions. Extra-departmental courses on Christianity may be offered to students of other disciplines as well;
2. To promote academic study of Christianity in all its various branches, viz. the Bible (with relevant classical languages like Greek, Hebrew etc.), Christian Theology, History of Christianity (with special reference to India and North East India), practical theology and ministry including life experiences, religions and philosophy etc;
3. To study tribal cultures and religions of North East India in the context of Christian studies;
4. To conduct of Christian studies;
5. To hold seminars, symposia, etc. and to promote academic activities as contribution to deeper understanding of the different branches of Christianity;
6. To promote understanding and harmony between religious communities of our country;
7. To have meaningful and understanding dialogue with other branches of studies at the University;
8. To provide facilities for academic research in Christian studies with a view to achieving sound academic excellence;
9. To develop a departmental library which is equipped with upto date Christian publications as well as photostat copies films, etc. of important manuscripts, documents and rare materials.
10. To collect historical and literary source materials and up-to-date references for conducting research work as in different aspects of Christianity.
11. To arrange for a suitable number of scholarships for students in this Department; and
12. Professional training in Christian Ministry in the Churches will be the concern of the Theological College or Seminary unless it is otherwise decided by mutual consent of the churches concerned, but this does not mean that ordinary students are barred from admission will depend on the choice of the sending Churches; and as such academic relationship

be maintained with the Senate of Serampore College and its affiliated Colleges in North East India.

OFFICERS, PROFESSORS, READERS, LECTURERS ETC.

The personnel of the Department will be as per University Rules and Statutes as in other Department of the University. However, advice may be sought from the authorities of the Churches in North East India regarding the appointments of such personnel, keeping in view that the Department is established with suggestion of the North East India Christian Council.

(i) Establishment of Department of Christianity\_

No: AC: 25: 85: 05: 6: (i): The Council considered the possibilities of establishing a Chair/Centres/Department of Christianity in the University and felt that a Centre for Comparative Religion may be established with its basic thrust on the studies on Christianity in relation to the North-Eastern region. The Council therefore, RESOLVED to constitute a Committee with Prof. B. Pakem as one of its members to collect information on the structure, functions and programmes of such Centres or Departments in other Universities.

The Council further RESOLVED that it may be included in the VIIth Plan Proposals of the University.

The Report of the Committee appointed by the Academic Council to go into the question of Establishing a Department of Christian Studies in the University.

A meeting of the Committee constituted by the Academic Council to go into the question of setting up a Department of Christianity in the University was held at 11:30 a.m. on the 7th June, 1986. The following were present :

1. Mr.H.W.T.Syiem,
2. Prof.B.Pakem
3. Prof.M.Miri - Chairman

A report on the deliberations of the Committee follows:

(i) The Study of Religion has somehow been generally neglected by Indian Universities. Barring in a very few Universities there are no academic departments for religious studies as such, and this, in view of the extraordinary for importance of religion in our individual, social, and political life, is, to say the least, rather surprising. This University is thus in a position to take a lead in this very important area. This can be done by establishing a School of Religious Studies as part of the School system of the University.

(ii) Action in this regard should, however, be taken cautiously and in several steps spanning over possibly two to three Five Year Plan periods.

(iii) To begin with, as part of the 7th Five Year Plan the University may think of establishing a Department of Christian Studies. The justification for this is as follows:

- (a) The vast majority of the people residing in the area under the jurisdiction of NEHU Profess the Christian Religion. There is a great deal of enthusiasm among educated people of the area to learn more about their religion considering the great living tradition of continuous academic Scholarship extending over several centuries that has come into the understanding of Christianity.

Contd/.../-

- (b) There is only one University in the country (Mysore University) which has a full-fledged Department of Christian Studies.
- (c) An objective, dispassionate study of the religion such as only a University has the necessary framework to provide, is essential in view of our national goal of secularism.
- (iv) In the next phase of the development of the proposed School of Religious Studies the University may contemplate starting:
- (a) a Department of Buddhist Studies and
- (b) a Department for the study of tribal religions.
- (a) A very important, though somewhat neglected section of the people of the north east are followers of both sects of the Buddhist religion, i.e., Mahayana and Hinayana. There is also, in our country, a general need for a more comprehensive understanding of Buddhism, a product of this country and its tradition, Here again the University can assume a leading role.
- (b) Although the religions of our tribes have been studied by Anthropologists, they have hardly been taken seriously as religions i.e., as vehicles of moral and spiritual enlightenment. It is one of the prime responsibilities of NEHU, given its location and its constitutional objectives, to promote the study of tribal religions, qua religions and not merely as phenomena having merely social or psychological significance. A Department for the study of tribal religions will, therefore, be most appropriate.
- (v) The School may eventually be completed by the establishment of a Department of Hinduism and a Department of Islamic Studies.

The Committee preferred the idea of a School of Religious Studies, to that of a single Department of Christianity or any other religion, primarily because the kind of interaction that is necessary and the academic attention that needs to be paid to the phenomenon of religion in our country will be best provided within a school system with full fledged Departments under it.

The Committee also recommends that a Committee of Experts may be set up by the University to make detailed suggestions a concerning the proposal.

EC:55:87:01B(iv) : The Council considered the Report of the Committee constituted vide Resolution No:EC:53:36:05:6(ii), and RESOLVED to approve the recommendations as indicated below:

1. To establish a School of Spiritual and Moral Values initially with a Department of Christian Studies and a Departmental of Traditional Religions which is considered relevant and timely. However, the implementation may proceed cautiously.
2. The School should aim at academic studies.
3. In the School, the teachers and other members should be persons of good character with spiritual and moral standing.
4. The University may frame courses and syllabi through an expert Committee. In so doing, reference may be made to the Mysore University and the Benaras Hindu University where such religious studies have been introduced.
5. The courses may be started initially at the M.Phil level. However, with a view to produce man+power for degree level teaching, the courses at Post-Graduate (M.A) level may also be started.

It further decided as under :-

The School shall be dedicated to a thorough academic study of Spiritualism and Moral Values.

Spiritualism :- By Spiritualism we imply a belief in the transcendent reality which underlies the structure as well as the time course of all observable phenomena and which is the origin and repository of all that exists,. It gives us a view of Man and Life and Nature. Larger than seeing them as mere pieces of physical matter. It helps us to discover the non-matter as powerful prime movers in the family of man. These are love, compassion, sacrifice, brotherhood, tolerance and awarencess of beauty. The awareness of this spiritual dimension is the common underpinning of all.

religions and brings us all together, in the grand confluence and religio (binding together again). The statements of formal aspects of the rituals in religion which distinguish and establish groups are properly the subjects of worthy religious institutions which alone are competent for that task and will not be touched upon in the School. The comparative aspects whenever touched upon will not be delivered along with any personal value judgements. That is, it will not be stated that a given religious view is more right or wrong, better or worse than others but the subject will be treated with reverence, as statements of different aspects of transcendental reality which all together make up Man's weltanschauung. The meaning of spiritualism is expressed in relatively modern times by a spiritually oriented writers like Paul (Valery (1,2) as well as a humanists like V Bertrand Russell (3).

Moral Values: The above leads directly not only to a vision of beauty and transcendence of the world evoked by music, dances poetry and art, in short to esthetic experience, but also leads us to respect for life, for love, for nature, It leads us to right belief, right intention and right conduct, that is ethics. It dissects out for us to what we ought to do, from what we do. In the rld of foree and destruction and hatred this acquisition is the guiding star and is the common base in Man's nature. upon which our being must come to roost again and again. The School will do well to define these, in all possible ways, by theory, by testimony and by experiment, if possible. Nothing shall be done by the School against the ideal of secularism and national integration as enshrined in the Indian nationhood and the constitution of India. The 'School' as the name implies will give shelter to all views. Beginning will be made by (a) Christian Studies, (b) Study of Traditional religions of India.

The Inspection Team visited the College on 16.6.94 and the Inspection Report reached CDC office on the 8th of October, 1996 at 4 p.m. As per the recommendation made by the Inspection Team it recommends for provisional affiliation for a period of 5 (five) years within which time the college should construct its own college building and provide a reasonably equipped library with facilities for study of Law and legal education. In pursuance of your above wuoted Memo and the subject matter the inspection team comprising of 1. Mr.H.Ahmed, Principal Shillong Law College, 2. Mrs.Minati, Sarma, Lecturer, Shillong Law College and 3.Mr.R.Kharpor, Additional D.P.I., Meghalaya, Shillong visited the KHAD-AR-DALOI Law College, Jowai, on 16.6.94 for inspection as requested by N.E.H.U.

On arrival at Jowai, the inspection team was received in the Circuit Hourse by the Chairman and the Executive members of the society for the study of Law, Jaintia Hills District, and also the President and members of the governing body of the Khad-ar-Daloi Laww College, Jowai. The inspection team was apprised of the fact that the Jaintia Hills District of Meghalaya is educationally a backward area. The leading Citizen of Jowai with a view to impart legal education to the people in general and educated people in particular, formed a society for the study of Law. The aim of this society is to acquaint the people with the legal literacy which could establish the rule of law in the region. The society was doing a useful social service to the poor in the fields of litemation, and in the year 1996 decided to establish a Law College at Jowai under the name and title "KHAD-AR-DALOI" Law College, and a governing body was constituted for doing the needful and managing the College. The College was functioning since 1986 and is now seeking affiliation of the N.E.H.U.

The inspection team was shown a plot of land measuring about 13½ acres donated by the Jaintia Hills District Council, Jowai, for the Law College. This plot of land is situated near to the Jowai Government College and the area is developing.

The inspection team thereafter met the members of the Governing body of Khad-Ar-Daloi Law College, Jowai in the Law College premises. The Office of the Law College, the class room and the library room have been lodged temporarily in the Government High School building free of rents for the use of the Law College in the evening, when the School is not having any class. This is a temporary arrangement until the Law College authorities are able to construct their own College buildings in their own land. The inspection team inspected the class rooms and the library. The class room and the office room for the Law College is found to be adequate. The books shown in the library are kept in 4 almira of the library. The library is taken care by the voluntary service of a lady librarian. However the inspection team found the library to be not adequate to serve the college.

The inspection team examine the financial position of the college, and found that the college has Rs.3,00,000/= (Rupees three lacks) only as fixed deposit for building fund under the Certificate No.005234 dated 1.7.92 in the Jowai Branch of the Meghalaya Co-operative Apex Bank, and another amount of Rs.55,119.75p. in the S/B.Account No.185 (D) in the said bank. The source of income for the college is based on the donations from public, and fees collected from students at the rate of Rs.50/=. The inspection team was assured by the governing body and the members of the society for study of law, Jowai, that adequate amounts of money would be readily available once the Law College gets its affiliation.

College has 10 lecturers and the Principal Mr. D.D.V. Ladia, who has a LL.M., Degree to his credit, and is a full time employ of the College, and all lecturers are part time. The lecturers are all practising lawyers, some of whom are also practising in Shillong. All the lecturers are serving the Law College voluntarily with out any remunerations.

The Law College has 59 students in the Preliminary class, 20 students in the Intermediate and 20 students in the Final year class i.e., total 99 students.

REMARKS: With the facilities as available at present the affiliation of the college to the University may not be found favour with the Bar Council of India, who has taken a very strict views regarding affiliation of Law Colleges. However, considering the enthusiasm of the people of the Jowai District for eradication of legal illiteracy, and their ardent desire for rule of law and reaching justice in the door steps of the people of the locality the question of affiliation of the college deserves special consideration. Therefore, the inspection team recommends the college for its affiliation provisionally for a period of 5 years within which time the college should construct their own college building, and providing a reasonably equipped library with facilities for study of law and legal education.

The affiliation for the college may be made subject to a review after 5 years.

CONSTITUTION OF KHADAR DALOI LAW  
COLLEGE : JOWAIARTICLE : I

(a) Name of the College: - The name of the College shall be "Khadar Daloi Law College" hereinafter referred to for the sake of brevity, as the "College".

(b) Address and Head Officer: - Khadar Daloi Law College, Jowai, Jaintia Hills, Meghalaya.

(c) Ownership and Management: - The College is run owned and managed by the Society for the suity of Law, Jowai, Jaintia Hills, Meghalaya.

(d) Date of establishment: - The First Day of the month of August, '96

(e) Area of Operation: - The State of Meghalaya & other neighbouring States of North Eastern India.

ARTICLE:-2. Aims and Objects: - The Aims and Objects of the College shall be :-

(a) To impart Law education among those from the State of Meghalaya who possess the requisite qualification for the admission into the college.

(b) To print and publish books, periodicals, journals, Newspapers.

(c) To undertake and organise & facilitate research study and educational Course, conferences, seminars and lectures in matters relating to law education in particulars and education in general in all respects and ramifications:-

(d) To Co-ordinate with approval institutions and bodies in furtherance of the cause of law education and other secular education and culture.

(e) To enter into any arrangement with the institutions, University, University grants Commission and persons or bodies an obtain from any Government authority, institutions, University University Grants Commission, persons and bodies such grants, rights and privileges as the College may think desirable for the furtherance of the cause for which it stands.

(f) To issue appeals and make applications for money and funds in furtherance of the said objects, and accept gifts donations subscriptions in cash or in securities and any property movable or immovable.

(g) To invest and deal with funds and money and other properties and assets of the College.

(h) To acquire and purchase or otherwise own or take on lease or hire temporarily or permanently and movable or immovable property necessary or convenient for the furtherance of the aims and objects of the college and to manage all the properties which the college may hold, to sell or dispose of or to enter any contract with a view to requiring or disposing of any property or assets of the college.

(i) To include any other object or objects which may help in furtherance of the aims and objects which the college stands.

(j) To erect, establish, construct, alter, improve or reconstruct any building or work of the college as may from time to time be necessary & expedient to promote the objects of the College.

(k) To do or cause to be done all such lawful things as are in accordance with the spirit and principles of the objects of the college or which are conducive to the pursuit and attainment of the aims and objects of the purpose.

ARTICLES 3:- The fund of the College; the fund of the college shall be raised through:-

(a) Donation, (b) Grant-In-Aid from (i) Government (ii) Public Bodies (iii) Institutions (iv) persons (c) Fees realised from the students.

The Governing Body:- The Governing Body of the college shall be elected by the general body of the Society for a period of three years or constituted as per rules of the Universities or the Government.

ARTICLES -5: OFFICE Bearers of the Governing Body:- (a) The Governing body shall consist of the following:- (i) President (ii) Vice-President (iii) Secretary, (iv) Joint Secretary (v) Treasurer and (vi) Ten other members of whom two shall be nominated by the University, one by Government, three by the teaching staff and four others to be elected by the Government general body of the Society for the study of law.

ARTICLE :-6: Duties of the Office bearers:- (a) President:- The President shall (i) Preside over the meetings of the Governing Body and those of the general Body if any. (ii) Exercise general supervision of the activities of the College, (iii) Execute in the name of the college contributes deeds and documents along with the Secretary (iv) Delegate those functions as decided by the Governing Body to the Vice-President.

(b) Vice-President:- The Vice-President shall (i) assist the President in the discharge of his duties. (ii) Discharge the duties of the President during this absence of the latter.

(iii) Discharge the functions as delegated to him, the Governing body or the president of the Governing Body.

(d) Secretary:- The principal of the college shall be appointed as the Secretary of the Governing body by the Society for the study of Law. The Secretary shall:- (i) Be in charge of all correspondence and carry out the aims and objects of the college. (ii) Maintain and keep all the important papers, documents, deeds & registers of the college. (iii) Record the proceedings of all the meetings of the Governing body as well as the general body if any, and sign them jointly with the president of the governing of the Body (iv) The Custodian of the Seals and keys of the college (v) Supervise the day to day administration of the college and the employees of the college shall work under his supervision (vi) Shall delegate those functions as decided by the governing body to the Joint Secretary if and when appointed. (vii) Sign along with the President all deeds, documents in the name of the college (viii) Institute or contest any suit or case in the name of the college with due approval of the Governing Body. (ix) Have the powers to keep in hand an amount of money as decided by the governing body for meeting day to day expenditure of the college. Any source exceeding the specified amount money may be held for a period not exceeding seven days including Bank Holidays. (x) Operate the Bank Account of the college and sign, endorse negotiate & otherwise deal with the accounts funds or (xi) Shall maintain the accounts and the cash books of the college and make payments.

(xii) Shall prepare statements of receipts & expenditure & the same to the annual meeting of the Governing Body.

Article 6:- The Joint Secretary shall (i) assist the Secretary in the discharge of his duties (ii) Perform all duties & functions of the Secretary in the absence of the latter.

(e) Treasurer:- The Treasurer shall (i) Maintain the accounts and the Cash Book (ii) Make payments through the Secretary (iii) Prepare statements and receipts, and expenditures and submit the same to the secretary, to be submitted to the Governing Body.

ARTICLE -7:- The governing body, its meetings and their powers & functions:- (a) Annual General Meetings:- Every year General Meeting of the Governing Body shall be held to transact the following business: (i) To consider and approve the audited accounts of the college.

(ii) To advertise and appoint teaching and non-teaching staff of the college and to fix their salaries and

(iii) To fix the rates of fees to be realised from the students.

(iv) To consider & approve the reports presented by the Secretary on behalf of the governing body

ARTICLE      Notice and Quorum :-

(a) Seven days of notice shall be necessary to call the Annual General Meetings, the Special Meetings Requisitioned Meetings shall be called on the Notice of fifteen days (b) five members present in the Meeting of the governing body shall form the Quorum, if not otherwise as per rules of the university and the Government.

ARTICLES: 9:- The Accounts of the college shall be audited by qualified auditors to be appointed by the General Body of the Society for the study of law and duly approved by the Registrar of the Society.

ARTICLES : 10:- Property of the College:- All property of college moveable or immoveable whether existing at the time of registration of the college or later acquired shall vest in the governing body, and the society for the study of law being its trustee, all documents relating thereto and effecting such property shall be taken and shall stand and be deemed to stand in the name of the governing body which will act as the representatives of the Society for the study of law. All documents relating to the property of the college shall be fixed executed for and in the presence and his absence of the Secretary.

ARTICLE; 11:- Bank Account:- The college shall have its bank account with the Meghalaya Co-operative Apex Bank, Jowai Branch to be operated by the Secretary of the Governing Body.

ARTICLES: 12:- Emblem, Motto, and colour. The College shall have its own (a) Emblem (b) Motto (c) Colour to be decided upon the Governing Body and duly approved by the Society.

NEHU NOTES

ARTICLE :13:-Suit for and against the College - The College shall sue and be sued in the name of the president and the Society or any office bearer duly approved or appointed by the Governing Body.

ARTICLE : 14:- Winding up the College:- The college shall not be wound up except by a resolution passed by three-fourth of the members of the Governing Body in a meeting duly convened for the purpose. If upon the winding of the College, there remaining after the satisfaction of the debts and liabilities if any property whatsoever, the same shall not be paid up to or distributed among the members of the Governing Body but shall be given to some other college to be determined by the vote of not less than three-fourth of the members present.

ARTICLES: 15:-Amendments:-Amendments to any provision of the constitution shall be taken up by the Governing Body and shall be affected by the majority not less than two-third of the members present and voting in the Governing Body Meeting.

As per notification No.CDC/A.90-91-96/2441-48 dated 24.4.96 from the Director, College Development Council, an Inspection team consisting of the following persons had been constituted for inspection of NERIST, Itanagar to look into the feasibility of extension of affiliation of NERIST to NEHU, Shillong beyond the academic session 1995-96.

The Convener contacted the other members and planned the visit of the team starting from 5th July to NERIST. However, Shri. S.D.Phukan, Technical Adviser, NEX has retired and nobody else was available in his place. The convener, in consultation with the Director, CDD, requested Prof.R.S.Tripathi, Dean, School of Life Sciences to be a member of the Team. Therefore the new team members visited the NERIST on 6th July, 1996 and made the following recommendations/ observations in connection with extension of affiliation of NERIST with NEHU.

The Committee members visited the laboratories, library, workshops and other facilities, and had gone through the teaching, technical and other staff strength, of the Institute for running various programmes for which the Institute has sought for extension of affiliation with NEHU beyond 1995-96.

The NERIST project was approved by the MHRD, New Delhi in 1985 with a provision to run various courses in engineering and technology, and applied science streams at base, diploma and degree levels. Although NERIST is conceived as an engineering institute with a power to award its own degrees and diplomas under the Act of Parliament, it may take some time for MHRD to accord the autonomous status to NERIST. In view of good infrastructure facilities, faculty strength in different department, laboratories and other facilities, the Committee recommends the extension of affiliation of NERIST to NEHU beyond academic session 1995-96 for three years or till NERIST is given autonomous status, whichever is earlier, in the following branches :

1. As per provision of NEHU Act and Statutes, there is a provision of NEHU Representation on the Board of Management, Academic Committee, Selection Committees for the post of faculty members, librarian and other positions and NERIST has agreed to take up the issue of incorporation of NEHU representatives on these bodies at appropriate levels. This is also agreed upon by the Director of NERIST as per letter No. DIR/06/96/302 dated 30.06.96.
2. NERIST has submitted the syllabi for base, diploma and degree modules in different disciplines which were duly approved by the Academic Committee, Board of Management and AICTE for placing the same in the appropriate bodies of NEHU.
3. NERIST has also provided a copy of admission policy of NERIST at different levels for placing in the appropriate bodies of NEHU.
4. The first inspection team in 1990 had suggested that NEHU should make provisions in its Academic Ordinance to have the Director and other Professors of NERIST as members of Academic Council. The Committee reiterates that these provisions should be made.
5. The staff members in the cell created by NEHU should interact more frequently with the NERIST authorities for NERIST work.

Please find enclosed herewith, the draft Ordinance on the Dean Students' Welfare as drafted by the Committee constituted by you. While submitting the same the Committee would like to place the following for your kind consideration:

1. That, while going through the existing provisions in the NEHU Ordinance it was noted that not only there was no ordinance on the Dean Students' Welfare but clear links were also missing between the provisions under OD.4 of the NEHU Ordinance.
2. That, there were found mentions of the Dean Students' Welfare in certain sections of OD.4 while there was a conspicuous absence of the Dean Students' Welfare from certain important sections of the same viz., in regard to the Wardens and Prefects.
3. That, there was a need to look into the Powers and Functions of the Dean Students Welfare in the light of past experiences over several years as well as in the light of increasing responsibility with respect to NEHU Campuses outside Shillong.
4. That for a smooth and efficiently coordinated functioning of the office of the Dean Students Welfare over the existing campuses and any new campuses which might ever come up in other areas under NEHU in future it was thought prudent by the Committee to suggest suitable amendments in the provisions of OD.4.
5. That in view of the increasing work and responsibility of the office of the Dean Students Welfare the Committee thought that the Dean Students Welfare could get assistance in various campuses by Assistant Dean(s) of Students' Welfare.
6. That in view of the above the Committee has unanimously drawn the present draft submitted to you as the report of the Committee. However, the proposed amendments in OD.4 will be put up to you in due course of time as the same are under preparation in the proper format.

ON THE POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF THE DEAN  
STUDENTS WELFARE

(Under Statute 8(5) of the NEHU Act 1973)

**Objective :** In accordance with the provisions in the NEHU Act and Statutes the Dean Students' Welfare shall be concerned with such welfare activities both curricular and cocurricular activities in the University which will help in the all round development of the personality of the students of NEHU. He shall be concerned with all such and other related activities in the University in various stages of planning, policy formulation, co-ordination, and execution in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance and the rules and regulations.

The Dean Student's Welfare (referred to as DSW hereafter) shall be located and shall function from the NEHU headquarters at Shillong.

The DSW shall be assisted in his work by the Assistant Dean of Students Welfare (referred to as Asstt. DSW hereafter) located in each Campus of NEHU.

The DSW shall assist the Vice-Chancellor in the formulation and implementation of various policies related to the welfare of the students - both day scholars and those residing in the Halls of Residence, approved hostels, and approved lodges in all the campuses of the University. The functions of the DSW shall be as follows :-

1. The DSW shall lay down the policies and procedures of the admissions to the various Post-Graduate courses, research programmes, and other full-time and part-time courses as prescribed by the University on the advice of the Vice-Chancellor.
2. The DSW shall advise the Vice-Chancellor on matters relating to the admission of students under the categories other than the 'Open category'
3. The DSW shall co-ordinate the admission process in the University.
4. The DSW shall coordinate the admission of student in various halls of residence, approved hostels, and approved lodges of University.

5. The DSW shall advise the Vice-Chancellor on the appointment of the Asstt.DSWs in the campuses and the Wardens to the Halls of residence, approved hostels, and approved lodges of the University.
6. The DSW shall assist the Vice-Chancellor in supervising and controlling the residence of all students by co-ordinating the activities of the Wardens.
7. The DSW shall deal with the matters of management, overall discipline, and conditions of living in the halls of residence, approved hostels, and approved lodges of the University.
8. The DSW shall advise the University in the matters of organisations and development of student bodies.
9. The DSW shall coordinate the activities of the different bodies concerning student welfare.
10. The DSW shall arrange for and coordinate the elections of the Office bearers and other representatives of the NEHU Student Union and other student bodies in the campuses as per the rules of the University.
11. The DSW shall advise the University on the nomination of student representatives on various authorities of the University.
12. The DSW shall supervise/or organise the co-curricular and sports activities of the students in the campuses with the assistance of the Asstt. DSW.
13. The DSW shall control and regulate the funds for the cultural and sports activities of the NEHU students union and other student-bodies in the campuses of the University. He shall forward the accounts of expenditure sanctioned by him for these purposes received from the NEHU students union and other students bodies as mentioned in the above to the University. Such accounts shall be certified by the body receiving it from the University.
14. The DSW shall sanction the travel concession to the students and shall sanction the educational tours/excurssion of the students.
15. The DSW shall supervise and/or organise the career guidance and other counselling facilities for the welfare of the students.
16. The DSW shall supervise and/or organise such programmes and activities which shall strengthen the students-teaching faculty, students administration, student society relationships.
17. The DSW shall undertake such other duties and responsibilities relating to the welfare of the students as may be given by the Vice-Chancellor from time to time.

## 1) Allotment of fund out of the Unassigned Grant.

The allocation made under the scheme of UGC Unassigned grant for the quantum of financial assistance to the faculty members is based on the following criteria:-

	<u>Faculty strength</u>	<u>UGC support</u>
(a)	Upto 100	Rs.5.00 lakhs
(b)	101 to 300	Rs.7.00 lakhs
(c)	above 300	Rs.10.00 lakhs.

The percentage of allocation for the purpose of Travel grant is upto 30% of the allocation i.e. 30% out of the amount of Rs.7.00 lakhs as per (b) above, according to the faculty position of this University.

For the information of the Committee, it may be stated that the allotment of funds to teachers on deputation to National/International/Seminars/Symposium/Conference/Workshops from the Unassigned Grant was utilised on the basis of the applicant who is found eligible as per the criteria of the Regulations for attending Conference/Seminars etc. and mostly the benefit of availing financial assistance goes only to those teachers whose applications comes before the month of July and August, while those teachers whose application comes after this period miss the opportunity of availing financial assistance as the fund is already exhausted by the end of June-July every year.

A statement showing the number of teachers who had applied for Financial Assistance during the first half(April-Sept.) and Second half(Sept.-March) of the year, for the last three years may be seen at Annexure - 'A'.

While examining the matter, the 78th.Deans' Committee held on 20.8.96(Annexure-'B') decided to place the matter to the Academic Council to formulate ways and means for the allocation of grants in half-yearly basis i.e. April to September and October to March instead of quarterly allotment.

Hence the matter is placed before the Academic Council for decision.

ITEM II.

The Committee confirmed the Minutes of the 77th meeting of the Deans' Committee with a slight modification on Item 6. Item from the Chair 03.

While examining the allotment of funds to teachers on deputation to national/International Seminars/Conferences/Workshops from the un-assigned grants the Committee decided to place the matter to A.C. to formulate ways and means for the allocation of grants in half yearly basis i.e. April to September and October to March, instead of quarterly allotment as mentioned in the minutes of the 77th meeting of the Deans' Committee.
