Dear Sir,

In the matter of sessional evaluation this Department has for a long time followed the following practice:

Students are given three tests for each course and the test marks obtained in two of the three tests are counted towards the final score. This practice is in conformity with the relevant Ordinance(RC-5,OC-7:5(4)(v) and also takes care of contingencies such as a student not being able to take a test owing to illness etc.

In a recent communication, the Dean, School of Humanities and Education has decreed that the Ordinance has to be interpreted thus: Three test must be given and taken by every student and the marks of all the three tests must count towards the final score. As the matter **concerns** the interest of students, the Department feels that it should be raised in the Academic Council so that a uniform policy for the University as a whole may be decided on. Until an Academic Council decision, the Department proposes to follow its usual practice of giving three tests and counting the marks of the two best.
