TIME BARRED TA/DA CLAIMS  
OF THE RSIC OFFICIALS/

The officials listed at Annexure 'A' who had drawn TA/DA advances submitted the <sup>final</sup> claims after a lapse of more than one year. The Finance Department could not entertain the bills of the official concerned as they failed to prefer the claims within a period of one year. Reminders were served to the concerned officials directing them to refund the advance so drawn and failing which the same will be recovered from their salary bills. Their response, attributing to the delay, are appended against their names.

According to Govt. of India orders No.F.5(16)-E IV (B) 67 dated 18th October, 1967 :-

(2) Disposal of belated claims :- If the T.A. claim is not preferred by the administrative authority concerned for payment within one year from the date of its becoming due, it shall not be paid unless the reasons for delay are investigated in details by the authority competent to sanction and if the investigation shows that the claim could not be preferred in time due to administrative delay without adequate and cogent reasons, suitable action may be taken against the officer(s) concerned so that delay do not recur in future.

The reasons attributed by the officials are placed before the Council for consideration of condoning the delay in submission of the time-barred T.A claims.
