The Vice-Chancellor informed the Council about the sad demise of Dr. Chandran D.S. Devanesen, founder Vice-Chancellor of this University. The Council members observed two minutes silence in memory of the departed soul.

Item No. 1 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE 32ND MEETING
OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL HELD ON 4TH DECEMBER, 1982 -

EC:33:83:01: RESOLVED that the Minutes of the 32nd Meeting of the Executive held on 4th December, 1982, be approved with the following observation:

- (a) to request the Convener of the Sports Committee to convene the meeting as early as possible

and to submit the report; and

- (b) that some Items arising out of the last Minutes be referred as "Matters arising out of the Minutes" under a separate heading, under No. 1.2.

Item No.2 REPORTING ITEMS:

EC:33:83:02(1)(2)(3): The Council noted the following matters taken by the Vice-Chancellor in:

- (i) nominating (a) Dr. (Mrs) Helen Giri, Reader, Department of History and (b) Dr. P.S. Ramakrishnan, Professor, Department of Botany, as representatives of the University to the Governing Body of Lady Keane Girls' College.

- (ii) granting study leave for a period of one year with effect from 1st February, 1983, to Shri Kamal Kishore Das, Professional Assistant, Library Department, NEHU to enable him to persecute his studies in M. Lib. Sc. Course in the Aligarh Muslim University.

- (iii) granting extension of study leave for a period of three months and 19 days with effect from 4th July, 1982 to 20th October, 1982 to Shri P.K. Mitra, Professional Assistant, Library Department, NEHU, to enable him to complete the final M.Lib. Sc. Examination at the University of Burdwan.

Item No. 3 RATIFICATION OF ACTION TAKEN BY THE VICE-CHANCELLOR:

EC:33:83:03(1-10) The Council ratified the following actions taken by the Vice-Chancellor in:

- (i) granting study leave for a period of three years

with effect from 21st December, 1982 to Shri C. Thanthianga, Lecturer, in Zoology, Pachhunga University College, Aizawl.

(ii) granting study leave to Shri B.K. Sharma, Lecturer, Department of Zoology, for a period from 7th February, 1983 to 31st October, 1983 and also payment of a sum of Rs.7,000/- as a loan to Dr. Sharma to enable him to meet the travel expenses for going to Vienna, as per Govt. of India's Rules.

(iii) granting of payment of House Rent Allowance/ City Compensatory Allowance to Shri S.L. Mambaniang, Lecturer, Department of Mathematics for a period of two years with effect from September, 1980.

(iv) granting payment of House Rent Allowance/City Compensatory Allowance for a period of six months with effect from October, 1982 to Shri A.C. Mahapatra, Lecturer, Department of Geography as per Clause 10(vi)(b) of the Ordinance Regulating Leave to Teachers.

The Council also decided that when a teacher goes on leave he may be allowed to retain the house.

(v) granting of payment of Rs. 5,000/- to the Executive Secretary of the SUNCOM -82 as the Institutional Membership Fee in connection with the International symposium on "Problems of Development of the Under-Privileged Communities in the Third World Countries" held on October 2-8, 1982.

(vi) granting of study leave for a period of one year with effect from 1st February 1983 to

Dr. Surjit Singh, Lecturer, Department of Physics.

(vii) accepting the resignation tendered by Dr. J.P. Shrivastava, Reader, Department of Education, Mizoram Campus, NEHU, Aizawl with effect from 1st November, 1982.

(viii) granting of extra-ordinary leave to Shri C.P. Tewari, Reader-Incharge, Department of Continuing Education, for a period of two years with effect from 20th June, 1982 which will supersede the earlier decision of the Executive Council adopted at its 30th Meeting held on 24th May, 1982.

(ix) granting of extra-ordinary leave for a period of two years with effect from 1st June, 1982 to Dr. Asit Banerjee, Reader, Department of Economics.

The Council RESOLVED that the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in granting extra-ordinary leave to Dr. Banerjee, instead of Lien as adopted it at its 30th meeting, be superseded by this decision.

(x) granting of Earned Leave for fifteen days combined with extra -ordinary leave for a period of two years with effect from 30th March, 1983 to Dr. Sandeep Chawla, Lecturer, Department of History, to enable him to take up a new assignment in Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi.

Item No. 4 DEFERRED ITEMS:

4:1: Introduction of provision similar to those of the CCS (Pension Rules, 1972) regarding the effect of Departmental/judicial proceedings on the Retirement Benefits, etc.-

contd...5/-

EC:33:83:04 (1) The Council considered the letter received from the University Grants Commission for incorporating Provisions of CCS (Pension Rules, 1972) in the NEHU Retirement Benefit Rules and RESOLVED to accept the suggestions of the University Grants Commission. The Council also RESOLVED that the provisions be made applicable to the employees holding non-pensionable posts. (App. 2)

Item No. 5 ACADEMIC MATTERS :

5:1: Participation to the 13th Commonwealth Universities Congress to be held at the University of Birmingham, August , 1983 -

EC:33:83:05(1): The Council RESOLVED to approve of the participation of the Vice-Chancellor in the 13th Commonwealth Universities Congress to be held at the University of Birmingham in the month of August, 1983 and that necessary expenses to be incurred by the Vice-Chancellor be borne by the University.

The Council also accepted the suggestion that the Vice-Chancellor may also attend the 11th International Anthropological and Exological Conference to be held at Vancouver in continuation to the above Congress subject to the availability of funds.

5:2 To consider the revised Ordinances on the Master of Philosophy and the Doctor of Philosophy Programme-

EC:33:83:05(2): The Council RESOLVED to approve the Ordinance on the Master of Philosophy and the Doctor of Philosophy Programme as recommended by the Academic Council. It was however, pointed out ^{that} Clause 7 of Ordinance 12 and Clause 4 (i) of Ordinance 13 may be looked into by the Academic Council and if they consider necessary, suitable amendments may be suggested.

The Council also RESOLVED that the revised Ordinances be made applicable to the students who may get enrolled in the year 1983 and onwards.

5:3: Amendment of Ordinance relating to the Board of Under-Graduate Studies - Clause 2 -

EC:33:83:05(3): The Council considered the proposed amendments of Clause 2 of Ordinance relating to the Board of Under-Graduate Studies where it was proposed that the term of membership of college teachers be extended for one more year, i.e., three years and RESOLVED to approve the same.

Item No.6 ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS :

6:1: Transfer of Services of Dr. B.K. Tandon, Reader, Department of Commerce, Nagaland Campus, from his parent University, Banaras Hindu University.

EC;33:83:06(1): The Council approved the transfer of services of Dr. B.K. Tandon, Reader, Department of Commerce, Nagaland Campus from his parent University, Banaras Hindu University and that he be absorbed permanently in the services of this University with effect from 2nd March, 1981, as per Govt. of India's Rules.

6:2: Revision of Overtime Allowance of Chauffeurs of Staff Cars:-

EC:33:83:06(2): The Council approved the revision of overtime Allowance to the Chauffeurs of Staff Cars as communicated to this University by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India.

The Council also RESOLVED that the revision of Overtime Allowance be made applicable also to the Drivers and that this will take effect from 23rd December, 1982.

6:3: Rules for forwarding of applications for outside posts and grant of extra ordinary leave for holding of posts outside the University, etc., etc.-

EC:33:83:06(3) The Chairman gave the the background for placing the matter before the Executive Council for its review.

contd... 7/-

Our Ordinance provides that only 20 % of the staff may be avail leave at any point of time. In this context when applications are forwarded liberally, the number of person wanting lien exceeds this limit. Moreover, when a person goes on leave for one year, he extends for another year and so on and it creates problems for the University. It is difficult to get teachers against leave vacancies. The Chairman suggested that there has to be some rationality to the grant of leave/extra ordinary leave.

On the above background, the Council reviewed and RESOLVED To substitute Para one of the Executive Council's Resolution No.EC:24:81:06 as follows:-

The academic staff may be allowed to apply for higher posts as per procedures laid down for the purpose. For equivalent posts, however, a teacher may not be allowed to apply more than twice in a calender year. In the case of Selection to an equivalent post, the teacher shall be required to resign the post with three months notice.

If a Professor, who may have served the University for five years or more, is invited for a period to a chair or similar other distinction of professorship in a University or Institute extra-ordinary leave may be granted as per rules. The Council further RESOLVED that the same rules shall be applicable to all categories of teachers.

6:4: Dr. Majid Hussain's application for extension of extra-ordinary leave for one year with effect from 25th May, 1983 to 24th, May, 1984.-

EC;33:83:06(4): The Council did not agree to Dr. Majid Hussain's request for extension of extra-ordinary for one year with effect from 25th May, 1983 to 24th May, 1984 and RESOLVED To inform him of the decision of the Council and to request him to join immediately on the expiry of his leave.

6:5: Guidelines on Service Condition to elected members of the District Council -

EC:33:83:06(5): The Council RESOLVED to refer the matter to the University Grants Commission.

6:6: Sponsorship to All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi, for Junior Residency (Post-Graduate) leading to the award of M.D.(Medicine) and request for study leave -

EC:33:83:06(6): RESOLVED that Dr. J.L. Sailo, Medical Officer, be sponsored to the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New, Delhi, to enable him to pursue further studies leading to the award of M.D.(Medicine) and that he may be granted study leave with pay in the event of his selection.

6:7: Revision of scale of pay of Library staff and Director of Physical Education in Central Universities-

EC;33:83:06 (7): The Council accepted the revision of scale of pay of Librarian, Director/Instructors, Physical Education, Documentation Officers in the Central Universities as recommended by the University Grants Commission.

However, the Council observed that two posts of Assistant Directors of Sports be created for the Nagaland and Mizoram Campuses respectively and that the scale of pay will be Rs. 700 - 1300/-. The Council RESOLVED to refer to the University Grants Commission for approval.

6:8: Appointment of Dr. D.S. Baines as Professor in Agronomy, College of Agriculture, Medziphema, Nagaland on contract basis -

EC:33:83:06(8): The Council considered the request of Dr. Bairnes for allowing him to draw maximum scale in the Professor's scale and also extension of duration of contract appoint-

ment from two years to three years.

The Council RESOLVED that he may be offered the last pay drawn with two increments and that duration of contract a appointment be extended for one more year, i.e., upto three years.

6:9: Extension of leave and commutation of leave to study leave with pay in respect of Smti. M. Momin, Lecturer, Department of History.

EC:33:83:06(9): The Council RESOLVED to extend granting of extra ordinary leave for one more year combined with extraordinary leave granted earlier to Smti. M. Momin, Lecturer, Department of History to enable her to complete her Doctoral Research at the Jawaharlal Nehru University.

6:10: Extension of study leave to Shri P. Sudhir, Lecturer, Department of History -

EC:33:83:06(10): The Council approved the extension of study leave with effect from 1st February, 1983 for a period of four months to Shri P. Sudhir, Lecturer, Department of History, to enable him to complete his studies at the School of Oriental and African Studies, University of London, U.K.

6:11: Request from Dr(Mrs) S. Miri for accepting an assignment at the University of Texas, USA. -

EC:33:83:06(11): The Council considered the request of Dr.(Mrs) S. Miri, Reader, Department of Philosophy for permitting her to accept an assignment at the University of Texas, U.S.A., for a period of six months with effect from 1st July, 1983. Since Dr(Mrs) Miri had not specified the nature of leave she would like to avail of, the Council RESOLVED to grant her extra-ordinary leave for a period of six months with effect from 1st July, 1983.

6:12: Regularisation of extra-ordinary leave granted to Shri K.J.S. Prasada Rao.-

EC;33:83:06(12): RESOLVED that extra- ordinary leave granted to Shri K.J.S. Prasada Rao, Private Secretary to the Vice-Chancellor, for three years with effect from 1st October, 1979 be treated as on lein and that the earlier decision of the Council in its meeting held on 22nd September, 1979, be superseded by this decision.

Item No. 7 TO CONSIDER THE GRANT OF 2(TWO) ADVANCE INCREMENTS TO SHRI SANTOSH PRASAD, LDA, NEHU.

EC:33:83:07: The Council considered granting of two advance increments to Shri Santosh Prasad, LDA, NEHU who has successfully completed the Accounts Training in his parent Department. before joining this University which is an added qualification.

The Council observed that if the procedure followed by the Central Government Offices is to grant two advance increments to those employees who complete Accounts Training, the same be made applicable in this University also.

Item No. 8 TO FIX THE DATE OF THE 8TH MEETING OF THE THE COURT OF THE UNIVERSITY:

EC;33:83:08: The Council decided that the next meeting of the Court of the University be held latest by the first week of June, 1983., and authorised the Vice-Chancellor to finalize the date.

8:2 Payment of salary to the teachers, Pachhunga University College for 5(five) pen-down strike fr 12th July, 1982 to 16th July, 1982 -

EC:33:83:08(2): The Chairman apprised the Council that due to the taking over of Pachhunga College by the North-Eas-

tern Hill University the fixation of pay of teachers and non-teaching staff of the College had to be refixed in the NEHU scale of pay. This process took a long time for want of information from the College and payment of arrears pay was delayed. He also informed the Council that in the process, the teachers launched the pen-down strike for five days. They ultimately withdraw unconditionally when explained.

The Council took note of the same and RESOLVED that payment of pay for five days be granted to the teachers and the period of pen-down strike be adjusted against their leave.

8:3 To consider the resignation tendered by Dr.S.C. Narula, Reader, Department of English, NEHU, Mizoram Campus.

EC;33:83:08 (3): The Council accepted the resignation tendered by Dr. S.C. Narula, Reader, Department of English, Mizoram Campus, NEHU, with effect from 15th February, 1983, as per Rules.

8:4 To consider the proposal for confirmation of teachers who have completed their term of probation -

EC;33:83:08(4): RESOLVED that the teachers who have completed their terms of probation as per list be confirmed with effect from the date of their joining in this University, subject to the execution of the Bond.

8:5 Appointment of academic staff on deputation, etc -

EC:33:83:08(5): The Council considered this matter in detail and RESOLVED that experienced teachers be appointed on deputation basis from the Government Agencies as per original scale plus 20% deputation allowance and also RESOLVED that deputation should ordinarily not exceed three years during which period the person may exercise his option either way.

The Council further RESOLVED that the terms of deputation laid down by the Government of India in Appendix - 31 of Civil Service Regulation be incorporated in the Ordinance of the University.

8:6: Note on the execution of the construction of the permanent Campus of the NEHU at Shillong -

EC:33:83:08(6): The Chairman informed the Council that the construction of the permanent Campus at Shillong was going on and expected to be completed soon. He also informed the Council that discussions was held with the National Building Construction Corporation, a Government of India Undertaking for taking up construction of Campus. The rates quoted by them have been examined by the University which are reasonable keeping in view the rates quoted in the recent tenders and the price escalation thereafter.

The Council RESOLVED that the works to the extent of about Rs 5.00 crores be entrusted to the National Building Construction Corporation as per terms mutually agreed to between the University and the National Building Construction Corporation.

Item No. 9 FINANCIAL MATTERS -

9:1: Contribution to National Children's Fund -

EC:33:83:09(1): RESOLVED that a token amount of Rs 1,000/- be paid to the Secretary-Treasurer, National Children's Fund as a Donation from the University, be approved.

9:2: Collection of fees from students and distribution of scholarship money to them by the State Bank of India -

EC:33:83:09(2): The Council approved the proposal for collection of fees and distribution of scholarships by any Nationalised Banks having an extension counter at its Campuses at Shillong, Aizawl, Medziphema, Kohima and RESOLVED that this system be introduced from the next academic session, i.e., June-July, 1983.

Item No. 10 ITEMS FROM THE CHAIR :

10:1: Principles for granting of advance increments to the teachers -

EC:33:83:10(1): The Chairman pointed out that there are no guidelines for grant of advance increments to Lecturers appointed to the University. Anomalous situations arise where a fresh M.A. or M.Phil., or Ph.D., with or without post-doctoral research experience may be fixed at the same stage. It was also noted that sometimes persons use appointments in this University as a stepping stone and offer of advance increments is only a transitory attraction. The Council after detailed consideration RESOLVED that :-

(i) all advance increments, other than those which a person may be entitled to in case of fixation according to rules, may be given in the form of 'Personal Allowance';

(ii) three advance increments above the minimum of the scale of the Lecturer may be granted to those fresh entrants to service who may hold Ph.D. Degree;

Contd/...

- (iii) one further advance increment may be granted for each unit of two years of post-doctoral research to the fresh entrants;
- (iv) candidates selected for Campuses in Nagaland and Mizoram may be granted one advance increment; and
- (v) the total number of advance increments under all these provisions shall not exceed five in all.

10:2: Recommendations of Selection Committees for appointments to academic posts -

EC:33:83:10(2): The Executive Council accepted the recommendations of the Selection Committees for the appointment of the following :-

- (i) Dr A.K.Sen - for the post of Professor, Psychology.
- (ii) Dr Sri Prakash - for the post of Professor, Economics (Shillong posting).
- (iii) Dr S.N.Guhathakurta - for the post of Professor, Economics (Aizawl posting).
- (iv) Dr Man Singh - for the post of Reader, Psychology (temporary subject to re-assessment at the end of one year).

(b) Recommendations of the Selection Committee for the filling up of the post of Director of Sports -

The Selection Committee's recommendations are as follows:-

- (i) Mr. P. Blah.
- (ii) Mr. Thomas Patrick.
- (iii) Mr. Nankholum.

The recommendations are for the Shillong Campus only.

The Committee felt that the responsibilities of Director of Sports for a University are high and none comes to that level. The scale is too low for that responsibility. Therefore, the post may be re-designated as Sports Officer and may be offered to them. The qualifications may be revised as per UGC norms. The scale of Sport Coaches should also be revised.

Contd/...

The Executive Council RESOLVED to re-advertise the post of the Director of Sports with the revised pay scale and inform the UGC the necessity to create posts of Sport Officers one each for Shillong, Pachhunga University College and the College of Agriculture.

The Chairman informed the Council that Dr M. Santhana, Professor of Education, State Planning Commission, Madras has responded belatedly to the special advertisement of the University inviting offers for senior appointments on contract basis. Dr Santhana has offered to come initially for one year.

The Council RESOLVED to offer him an appointment as Professor on contract basis and that he be given the responsibility to organise the Centre for Educational Technology.

The Chairman also tabled the Bio-Data received from Dr R.L. Sharma, Professor, Himachal Pradesh Agricultural University.

The Council RESOLVED that he be offered the post of Professor in Horticulture on the same terms and conditions applicable, on contract basis.

10:3: Term of appointment of Registrar, NEHU -

EC:33:83:10(3): The Chairman informed the Council that the terms of appointment of the present Registrar expired on 19th February, 1983. He also informed the Council that the pay scale of Registrar, the Deputy Registrar, etc., is being revised by the University Grants Commission.

The Council RESOLVED to authorise the Vice-Chancellor to request the Government of Meghalaya to extend the period of deputation of Mrs. M.R. Mawlong, Registrar for another six months.

10:4: Discrimination in the evaluation of
dissertation of M.Ed. students -

EC:33:83:10(4): One of the members drew the attention of the Chairman regarding some representations submitted to the University by three M.Ed. students in connection with the evaluation of their M.Ed. dissertation and suggested that some clear-cut procedures should be followed in this respect.

On this, the Chairman explained the procedure followed by the University in the evaluation of M.Ed. dissertations. The M.Ed. dissertations are sent to two examiners for evaluation. If the difference in evaluation of those two examiners is not more than one grade point or 15% in marks, their assessment is taken as final and the marks awarded by the two examiners to arrive at the final score. If the difference of marks is more than one grade point or 15% the dissertation is sent for evaluation by a third examiner. According to the Ordinance, the Departmental Committee may choose the awards of any of the three examiners and their average represents the final score.

The Chairman observed that the discretion as envisaged in the Ordinance may lead to some anomalous situations and go against the basic premises of the system. The first premise in the scheme of evaluation does not differ by more than one grade point or 15%, then the difference is within the tolerance limit and they are reliable. They can be average to arrive at reasonable score. The second premise is that in case of difference being more than a grade point or 15%, the evaluations are not consistent and there is a bias. The bias may be in the form of over-valuation of under-valuation. Therefore, a third assessment is necessary. From these two premises, it follows that the basic purpose of the third valuation and to arrive at a reasonable score. At this stage, the guidelines are not clear. It is expected that the Committee should use their discretion to isolate the biased valuation. This can be done by taking the two nearest valuations, which may not differ from each other by more than one grade point or 15%, and rejecting the third. But it is


possible a Committee may not use its discretion rationally and the biased valuation may be chosen as one of the two scores for averaging. A specific provision, therefore, needs to be made in the Ordinance so that the choice may be unambiguous.

The Council RESOLVED to accept the premises of the examination scheme as outlined above and that suitable changes may be made in the Regulations. Any specific case may be referred to the Vice-Chancellor.

10:5: Next meeting of the Executive Council -

EC:33:83:10(5): The Council decided that the next meeting of the Executive Council be held in Kohima.

- (a) A departmental proceeding if instituted while the Government servant was in service whether before his retirement during his re-employment, shall, after the final retirement of the Government servant be deemed to be proceeding under Rule 9 of the above mentioned Pension Rules and shall be continued and concluded by the authority by which it was commenced in the same manner as if the Government servant had continued in service.

On retirement; the Government servant is paid provisional pension but not gratuity, the payment of which is authorised only after the conclusion of proceedings and issue of final orders thereon.

- (b) A departmental proceeding against a pensioner can also be instituted in respect of an event which took place not more than 4 years before such institution.

- (c) The President has the right to withholding or withdrawing pension or part thereof, whether permanently or for a specified period and of ordering recovery from a pension of the whole or part of any pecuniary loss caused to the Government if in any Department or judicial proceeding the pensioner is found guilty of grave misconduct or negligence during the period of his service including rendered upon re-employment after retirement.
