

- (iv) Review of the provisions for admission to M.A/M.Sc/M.Com. Programme.

A committee consisting of (1) Registrar as Convener (2) Controller of Examinations (3) Dean, Student's Welfare (4) Dr. Nikhlesh Kumar was constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to look into the existing Provisions on admission to M.A/ M.Sc/M.Com. programmes and to suggest amendments wherever necessary.

The recommendations of the Committee is placed at Annexure-'A'

The above matter was placed before the Academic Council in its 66th meeting wherein the Council resolved to accept the recommendations of the Committee except that the quota of 3% of Physically handicapped candidates may be adjusted against the Universities quota of 10%. The Council further resolved that other things being equal within the already permissible percentage of reserved seats preference will be given to candidates indigenous to Meghalaya.

The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.

The meeting of the Admission Committee was held on 21-11-2001 in the Office Chamber of the Registrar and the following amendments in the NEHU Prospectus was recommended :

A. CAMPUSES AND CONSTITUENT COLLEGES

Consequent upon the establishment of the Mizoram University, Mizoram Campus is now no more with NEHU. Hence it was resolved to delete the name of the Mizoram Campus and Pachhunga University College from the list of the Campuses and Constituent Colleges.

B. Schools and Departments

Since some Departments are already transferred to the Mizoram University, it was resolved to delete their names from the list of Schools and Departments of NEHU Prospectus.

1. Only those candidates who have passed a Three Year Degree Course (Honours) in the relevant subject shall ordinarily be considered for admission to the Master Degree Course.

However, subject to availability of seats, upto ten percent of seats may be assigned to students from other disciplines. It is also provided that if teaching of Major/Honours in a subject has not been sufficient developed within the jurisdiction of the University or in any unit in particular, seats in the concerned Departments may be filled in a manner as may be decided by the respective Department.

Since some candidates may have obtained marks in the relevant subject in the relevant degree course which are not considered in the Master Degree Course, the following provisions are made:

1. Only those candidates who have obtained marks in the relevant subject in the relevant degree course which are not considered in the Master Degree Course, shall be eligible for admission to the Master Degree Course.

2. A candidate with 50% marks in B.Ed may also apply for admission to M.A Education course. (No change)

3. The distribution of seats shall be as follows- The distribution of seat shall be as follows-

- i) Open category - 40%
- ii) Reserved for SC/ST Candidates - 50%
- iii) University Quota - 10% earmarked for the following categories -
 - i) Open category-37%
 - ii) Reserved for SC/ST Candidates-50%
 - iii) Physically challenged -3%
 - iv) University special quota - 10% earmarked for the following categories -

(a) Unrepresented backward areas

The level of backwardness may be determined vis-a-vis the national level of literacy. An applicant coming from an area having 5 % below the national level of literacy may be given 5% added weightage to the marks obtained by the applicant in the qualifying exams. Applications with more than 5% below the national level of literacy may be given 7% added weightage to the marks obtained

by the applicant at the qualifying exams. (vide table showing the district wise literacy rate of the region).

(b) Physically Handicapped

Such applications will be centrally examined by a Medical Board. 3% of the seats may be reserved for the physically handicapped candidates, which may be taken from the open category. This category may not come under the University special quota. An applicant with 40% to 60% physical disability may be given 5% added weightage and above 60% 7% added weightages. Similar provision will also apply to the deaf, dumb etc.

(c) Outstanding Sportsmen/Sportswomen

10% weightage for representing the country at International Level, 5% for representing the State at National level and 3% for Inter-University at National level added weightage to the marks obtained at the qualifying exams

(d) Children of NEHU employees

7% added weightage to the marks obtained at the qualifying exams. Certificate of employment may be issued by the office of the Registrar.

Note : Applicants under (B) above are required to submit necessary documents in support of their claims.

(b) Outstanding Sportsmen/Sportswomen

10% weightage for representing the country at International Level, 5% for representing the State at National level and 3% for Inter-University at National level added weightage to the marks obtained at the qualifying exams.

Ordinarily the sports conducted by NEHU shall be considered.

NEHU employees/spouse of NEHU employees/children of NEHU employees.

10% added weightage to the marks obtained at the qualifying exams. Certificate of employment may be issued by the office of the Registrar.

Only highest weightage will be considered for those who apply under multiple category in University special quota.

Department will prepare consolidated list of all applicants of the total number of seats authorised by the University. 37% of the seats shall be filled by merit and shall include SC/ST students

list. For the remaining 50% seats, a list of Candidates belonging to SC/ST will be prepared and the seats will be filled up from this category in order of merit.

2. Any or all seats under category (iii) above will stand converted to category (1) if unfilled.

3. Departments may, if they consider necessary, conduct written test/interview for admission to the Post-Graduate Programme in accordance with Ordinance OC-7. Performance of a Candidate in the Under-Graduate Course together with eligibility test, if any, shall be taken into consideration while preparing the merit list of students, weightage for eligibility test/interview shall, however, not exceed 50%.

4. In case of all internal students i.e. students who have graduated from Colleges affiliated to or maintained by this University, the percentage of marks obtained in the subject concerned shall be raised by 15% on the aggregate. In case of those candidates who have not offered the subject in the Major/honours no such weightage shall be given and their marks in the Major/honours subject without weightage shall be taken into account.

5. All departments shall constitute Admission Committee and assign them specific responsibility. Students who have already obtained a Master's Degree from this University or any other University, will be considered for admission only if there is any vacancy after considering all eligible candidates seeking first admission. In respect of such candidates too, the general criteria of marks obtained at Honours/Major level will be considered.

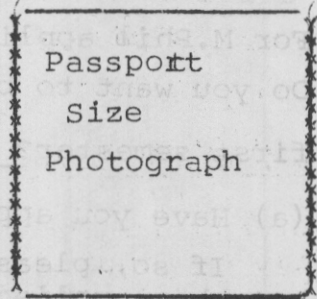

EC:111:2001:5:1:(ii): The Council considered the recommendations of the Committee and RESOLVED to defer taking a decision on the matter and the Committee may look into the viability of the University going in for group insurance schemes and also to find out the procedure followed in other Central Universities.

- (iii) Matters relating to the remuneration payable to the Non-Teaching staff for Examination works in pursuance to 65th Academic Council Resolution No:AC:65:2001:5:1: (iv) Regulation on Remuneration Payable for examination works thereof.

EC:111:2001:5:1:(iii): The Council considered the remuneration payable to Teaching and Non-Teaching staff engaged in the examination works and RESOLVED to approve the same as per Annexure 'A'. The Council however, desired that a Committee be appointed to go into the budgeting and expenditure of the Examination Department without breaking the confidentiality of the department.

- (iv) Review of the provisions for admission to MAM.Sc./ M.Com. Programme.

EC:111:2001:5:1:(iv): The Council considered the recommendations of the Academic Council on the new admission policy to the PG programmes and RESOLVED that the distribution of seats be as follows:

- (i) Open Category – 40%
- (ii) SC/ST Candidates – 50% (other things being equal preference will be given to domiciles of Meghalaya.
- (iii) University Quota – 7%
- (iv) Physically challenged – 3%
- (v) The weightage to be given to graduates from NEHU affiliated Colleges and graduates who are from Universities other than NEHU but who are domiciles of Meghalaya will be 10%.

The Council also desired that Column 13 of the application form may include the words "including co-curricular activities". The application forms need not be filled in the candidate's own handwriting.

5.3- Research-

- (i) Request of two Ph.D. scholars, Department of Philosophy for pre-submission Seminar and Submission of Thesis under the original Supervisor Viz. Dr. N. Malla.

EC:111:2001:5:3:(i): The Council considered the matter and noted that the Council in its meeting held on 17th August, 2001, considered the cases of the following research scholars arising due to the suspension of Professor N. Malla and his subsequent forced retirement vide Resolution No:EC:110:2001:8:(iv): dated 17.8.2001:

1. Shri XP Mao
2. Shri Alempa Ao
3. Shri KD Ramsiej

To ease the position of the research scholars, the Department of Philosophy provided them with alternative supervisors. But, the scholars did not report to the new supervisors and were deliberately defying the orders of the University Authorities. Accordingly, the Executive Council decided that they should be given a notice to comply with the directions of the department within 15 days from the date of receipt of the notice. However, till date, the scholars failed to comply with the direction of the University. The Council is of the firm opinion that this is an act of disobedience and breach of discipline and therefore RESOLVED that the Ph.D. registration of the above scholars would stand cancelled with immediate effect. However, there will not be any bar for them to get admission afresh in the Ph.D. programme of the University.
