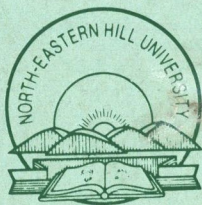

FOREWORD

The North-Eastern Hill University has entered its twentieth year. The University has registered all round progress in its academic and developmental programmes. During the year under report, Conferences, Seminars, Symposia were not organised much as before due to the ban by the Ministry, as the whole country was facing a financial crisis, excepting those of which commitments had already been made prior to the ban, and those conducted internally in the Departments, for the interest of the students and local public.

During this period, provisional affiliations for a period of three years had been given to Nongtalang College, Salt Christian College, Prabananda Women's College, Mountain View Christian College, Jaintia Eastern College, and Lakichera College (Zawlman), Mizoram for the Pre-University level course.

The College Development Council, NEHU, had also approved up-gradation of Degree (Arts) level for Sohra College, Cherrapunjee, Ri-Bhoi College, Nongpoh, and B.Com. (Pass) to Public Commerce College. Affiliations of Sociology (Pass) Course, for Synod College, Shillong and Honours Course of Pisciculture for St. Anthony's College, Shillong; from 1992 session were also granted. Tura Govt. College, Tura had also been granted permanent affiliation by the Council.

During the year under report NEHU had 61 (sixty one) affiliated Colleges and 7 (seven) professional Colleges for B.Ed. and L.L.B. Courses.

During this year, the University had been able to frame the Regulation for the endowment of "Prof. M.K. Khare Memorial Prize Award" duly approved by the Executive Council, while the Srimati Sarada Krishna Iyer Memorial Prize is still under process. Besides the above, the Meghalaya State Freedom Fighters' Association Shillong had also endowed the University for a sum of Rs.2000/- (Rupees two thousand) only for awarding a prize to the student, securing the highest mark in Political Science, in the B.A. (Pass Course) Examination, to be named as "U Tirot Sing Memorial Prize". This was also approved by the Executive Council of the University.

During this period, the Department of Education, Nagaland Campus, organised a paper reading Contest for the NEHU Students on "Education and Development with Special reference to Nagaland on the 19th April, 1993.

The Department of Geography, organised the Fourth Conference of Indian Institute of Geomorphologists from 30th April to 2nd May, 1992, and a regional seminar on processes of Development and Planning was also organised by GSNEHR and NEGS, NEHU, Shillong on 26th to 27th March, 1993.

The Department of Philosophy organised the following departmental seminars and during this period :-

A Seminar on "Concept of Tribe and Tribal Identity" was held on 8.4.92 in the Department. On 22.4.92, a seminar on "Aurobindo Political Philosophy was also held. A seminar on "The Doctrine of Karma" was also held by the Department on 29.4.92. The Department also organised a seminar on Plato's Philosophy of Language on 12.8.92 and a Seminar on "Symbiosis : A Marriage of Convenience" was also held on 19.8.92.

The Department of Public Administration, Aizawl organised the following during

the year under report :

1. Lecture Meeting on "Problems in Indian Administration" on which Sri S.R. Vala, retired, IAS, Chairman Mizoram Public Service Commission, spoke on the subject.
2. This Department in collaboration with local branch of IIPA Aizawl, arranged a get-together on 3.12.92. In this gathering Sri. L.B. Thanga, retired IAS, gave a talk on "Abolition of Chiefship in Mizoram and its impact on cultural, social and economic transition in the Mizo Society".
3. Again this Department along with local IIPA, Aizawl organised a lecture meeting on 15.12.92 on "Water Resources Management and Problems of Mizoram". In this Meeting, the Chief Engineer, P.H.E., Mizoram gave a lecture.
4. A study tour of the students was also conducted by the Department to Situal Village of Thingsuthliah Development Block on 14.11.92, for the study of the New land Use Policy (NLUP) which aims to abolish shifting cultivation.

The Khasi Department, NEHU organised a workshop in collaboration with C.I.I.L., Mysore, in June, 1992 on "Problems of Research in Tribal Languages".

The Department of Economics, Aizawl organised a Seminar on "One-day Panel Discussion on Research Priorities in North-East India", on 16.11.92 which was funded by NER-ICSSR, Shillong.

The Department of Linguistics, Kohima organised a two-days seminar on "Language and Education in Nagaland, Challenges and Constraints", on the 10th and the 11th December, 1992.

The Department of Zoology, organised the following Refresher Courses sponsored by the UGC for college teachers and University teachers.

- (i) Recent Advances in Zoology I from 16.11.92 to 5.12.92.
- (ii) Recent Advances in Zoology II from 08.03.93 to 28.3.93.

Centres of the University :

The Centre for Adult and Continuing Education, NEHU in commemoration of "International Day" on the 8th September, 1992 organised talks on the "Role of Schools and Voluntary Agencies", for the promotion of Literacy and National Literacy Mission on various topics :-

- (i) Importance of Literacy and Development
- (ii) Role of Youth in National Literacy Mission
- (iii) Role of Youth in Adult Literacy
- (iv) International Literacy year and Importance of Post Literacy

The following Schools were associated in the above programmes with Inter House Posters, Quiz, Essay Writing, Art Competition, Skits Competition etc :

- (1) Loreto School, Shillong
- (2) Step by Step School, Shillong
- (3) Army Public School, Upper Shillong
- (4) Pine Mount School, Shillong

- (5) Holy Child School, Shillong
- (6) H.L. Mizo High School, Shillong
- (7) St. Edmund's School, Shillong
- (8) Lady Keane Girls' School, Shillong

The Centre also organised a programme on "Gyan Vigyan Samata" in collaboration with Assam Science Society, where a street play entitled "Women for Education", Peace and Equality were held by two schools viz., in Gorkha Pathsala High School and Pine Mount School, at Shillong. Gyan Vigyan Samata of Assam gave the performance and refreshments was sponsored by the State Bank of India, Zonal Office, Shillong.

The Centre for Creative Arts Organised the following during the year under report:

- (1) Demonstration and Deliberation on Arts, Crafts and Creative debate in collaboration with Khasi Cultural Society, Shillong.
- (2) "A School-Integrated Workshop" at Cherrapunjee was organised on 20.10.92 on the theme, "Arts as related to Literature, Science, Arts and Commercial Potentials".
- (3) The Centre had also organised the "Art Exhibition and Consultation", on 12.11.92.

Centre for Science Education : During the year under report the Centre organised three regional workshop on "Explaining Service Behind Miracles". These three regional training workshops were organised as follows :

- (1) Imphal for Manipur and Nagaland - 12th to 16th October.
- (2) Guwahati for Assam and Arunachal Pradesh - 6th to 10th October.
- (3) Shillong for Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland and Manipur - 23rd to 27th March.

Campus Development and Engineering Cell : During the year under report, this Cell had completed the construction of 140 seated hostel and was occupied, while 68 (sixty eight) seated hostel construction was in progress. Out of the 50 (fifty) staff quarters, 49 (fortynine) have been completed and occupied by the teaching staff and the remaining one is to be taken up in the next six months.

In respect of the construction phase of 800 (eight hundred) seated hostel, the construction of 400 (four hundred) seated hostel, has been completed, while the remaining 400 (four hundred) will be taken up in a phased manner depending on the release of fund by the UGC.

Regarding construction of 150 (hundred and fifty) staff quarters, this Cell has completed 29 (twenty nine) staff units. Of these, seventeen are under RUAB and twelve under type 4 (four). These were already occupied. Construction of the remaining quarters will be taken up as and when fund will be released by the UGC.

The ancillary work in respect of Seminar Hall and Guest House, e.g., Seating arrangement and Central heating arrangement, S/F/F Generator for emergency light and fire fighting equipment etc., have not been completed.

The construction of Lecturer Hall Complex, School of Life Sciences and School of Physical Sciences and RSIC building were completed by this Cell. However, the

ancillary work like internal and external electrification road works and furnishing the buildings are in progress, to be completed by January, 1993.

In respect of the construction of Sports Complex, which comprises of construction of football field, hockey field, cricket field and two basket ball courts, this Cell had been able to complete only construction of football field in levelling only. The remaining fields and courts will depend only on release of grants by the UGC.

The construction of V.C's residence was taken up by this Cell at a tendered cost of Rs.11.83 lakhs and is likely to be completed by the middle of 1993 and the construction includes ancillary work also. Ninety percent of this construction has been completed in March, 1993.

The work of external electrification of the Permanent Campus, Shillong was also taken up by the this cell. Ninety-six percent of the work had been completed while the remaining four percent is likely to be completed by January, 1993.

In respect of Mizoram Campus, the construction of hostel for 50 (fifty) students which was entrusted to Mizoram Govt. P.W.D. as deposit work, has since been completed. Taking over of the building is pending, depending upon release of fund by UGC.

Construction of Building Complex, in Mizoram Campus, as per provision of the VIII Plan with an estimate amount of 1.71 crore, prepared by an Architect was sent to NEC. Work will be taken up only after NEC and UGC clearance and release of fund.

As regards the construction of building at Pachhunga University College, Aizawl, approval of the UGC to the phase I Project for construction although cleared by NEC in October, 1983 for 220.65 lakhs is awaited.

Nagaland Campus construction had been held in abeyance due to administrative reasons.

Lastly, the year under report also witnessed the visit of His Excellency, the Governor of Meghalaya, Sri. M. Dighe on 9th December, 1992 to this University Permanent Campus at Umshing-Mawkyroh. In one of the programmes, His Excellency visited the students' hostels, where he named the hostels as follows :-

- (1) P.G. Men's Hostel I-named "Saramati", after a 11,000 ft. high Mountain in Nagaland.
- (2) P.G. Men's Hostel II-named "Japfu", after another 7,000 ft. high peak over looking Kohima.
- (3) The first wing of the Research Scholars' Hostel was named "Sohpetbneng", after the high Hill in Khasi Hills, where the Khasis are said to have first settled.
- (4) The second wing of the Research Scholars' Hostel was named by His Excellency as "Chinlung", after the original home of the Chin - Mizo People.

S.R. Vala IAS, (Retd), Chairman, Mizoram Public Service Commission, Aizawl spoke on "Problems in Indian Administration".
2. Both the Department of Public Administration and the Aizawl Local Branch of the IIPA, also arranged an academic get-together on the 3rd December, 1992 in which Shri L.B. Thanga, IAS (Retd), life member of the Local Branch gave on "Abolition of Chiefships in Mizoram and its impact on cultural, social, political and Economic transition in the Mizo Society". Prof. R. Lalthangtlunga, Pro-Vice-Chancellor, NEHU, Mizoram Campus, Aizawl and life member of the Local Branch chaired the get-together.
3. The Department of Public Administration and the Aizawl Local Branch of the IIPA, jointly organised a lecture-meeting on the 15th December, 1992 in the Lecture Hall of the Department of Public Administration in which Shri Dunglema, Chief Engineer, Public Health Engineering Department, Govt. of Mizoram delivered a lecture on "Water resources Management and Problems of Mizoram".
The lecture-meetings were well attended.
4. The students and faculty members of the Department of Public Adminis-

tration, NEHU, Mizoram Campus, Aizawl conducted a study tour to Saitual village of Thingsalthliah Development Block on the 14th November, 1992 to have an on the spot study of the New Land Use Policy (NLUP) and its implementation in the village. The New Land Use Policy aims to abolish shifting cultivation and thereby to provide an alternative occupation to needy family as well as to maintain ecological balance in this mountainous state of Mizoram. 11. Thrust Area of Research :

The research activities in Organic Chemistry centre around developing newer synthetic methods for novel biologically important heterocyclic in carbocyclic compounds. A number of new compounds have been screened at Organon Research Centre, Calcutta, and results show that they have potential as antiparasitic and anti-insecticidal activity. Synthetic and mechanistic study on cycloaddition reactions of novel azadienes and oxyplumbation reactions have also been carried out.

The research activities in Physical Chemistry include research in Solid State Chemistry with emphasis on isomorphous substitution on hydroxylapatite, solubility equilibria of solid solutions of apatite, organic semiconductors, molecular interactions involving charge-transfer complexes, hydrogen bonding and hydrophobic interactions and micelles. Research in Chemical Kinetics includes the kinetics and mechanism of oxidation of organic substances by one electron oxidants and chromium (VI) reagents, and the reduction of transition metal ions by sodium tetrahydroborate. Work on the transport behaviour of electrolytes in aqueous and molten media as a function of temperature, pressure, and theoretical studies on vibrationally excited states are actively pursued. Studies on vibrationally excited states are actively pursued. Studies are being carried out on single electron transfer reactions by ESR, and on free radicals using spin trapping techniques.

The research activity in Inorganic Chemistry addresses to the synthesis, characterization, evaluation of molecular structures by different techniques and studies of reactivity of fluoro, peroxy/dioxygen and diketonometallates and fluoro and peroxy compounds of nonmetals, sulphoxide and arylazo complexes of transition metals. Emphasis is also given on the stabilization of unusual oxidation states of metals, and the development of newer reagents and catalysts.

In Nuclear Chemistry, research activities include heavy ion range and energy loss in solids, development and characterization of track detectors and their applications, fusion-fission and particle evaporation, radon monitoring for radioprotection and earthquake prediction, and the measurement of trace pollutants in environment.

2. Introduction :

The School of Agricultural Sciences and Rural Development was originally established as a College of Agriculture in 1978. The College was upgraded to the status of School of Agricultural Sciences and Rural Development in 1985. The institute at present offers courses leading to B.Sc. (Ag.) and M.Sc. (Ag.) degrees. There are 13 departments, of which four are approved by the UGC to offer post-graduate courses in the disciplines of Soil Conservation, Horticulture, Rural Development Planning and Animal Science. Initially, the intake of students to under-graduate programme was 40 which was increased to 60 and finally to 80 to meet the technical manpower requirement of the region. However, the intake has now been limited to 55. Intake of students in post-graduate programmes is limited to 5 seats in each discipline. The School plans to start post-graduate programmes in other disciplines in a phased manner. The School caters to the need of producing technically trained manpower needed for the development of agriculture in the North-Eastern Region by imparting instruction, training and guidance in the field of hill-agriculture. The institution also aims at developing area specific farm level technology to increase farm productivity and to disseminate the same from laboratory to the field. The School has 240 acres of land under its possession.

CENTRE FOR SCIENCE EDUCATION SHILLONG CAMPUS

1. Introduction

The Centre for Science Education of the North-Eastern Hill University is a free choice environment, innovatively stimulated, where joy of learning is experienced through exploring Science without any regimentation, examination or award of certificate, diploma or degree. The Centre encourages multistage multiple free interaction so as to facilitate learning through self-prompted motivation and recyclic enquiry.

The Centre is not a substitute for other schools of learning but it provides a fascination with learning that cannot be found elsewhere and facilitates traditional teaching at all levels.

The Centre was created in April, 1985.

2. The Programmes of the centre on four Streams :

a) Stream I : Popularisation of Science and Mathematics

This stream covers a wide variety of programmes like (i) Meet the Scientist (ii) Amateur Radio (iii) Electronic Hobby Centre (iv) Popular Lectures and Demonstrations (v) Participatory exhibit Area, (vi) Open House (vii) Quests and Debates (viii) Camps and Field Trips (ix) Film and Video Shows (x) Exhibitions and Olympiads and (xi) Various other similar activities.

b) Stream II : Enrichment and Improvement of School & College Science Inputs.

The activities in this stream are divided into three sections (i) New curriculum and enrichment materials development (ii) In service teacher's training, refresher courses, problem solving programmes (iii) Under-achievers, Gifted and Motivated students programmes.

c) Stream III : Research and Development Programmes.

In order to make science learning a meaningful experience for the Centre's participants the local scene and life patterns must be the backdrop. The central core area of investigation which draws on this backdrop for its analogues, then becomes the foundation of our programme.

d) Stream IV : Awareness Programme

OTHER IMPORTANT PRIORITIES INCLUDE

a) Evaluative trials of Audio-Visual Programmes and Emphasis on

- multi-media use.
- b) Development of interactive self-instructional packages and programmes.
- c) Computer Education and Computer Aided Instruction.
- d) Integrated Research Programme and Measurement Designs.
- e) Open Laboratory Programme for School and College going students.
- f) Mass Action for National Regeneration - Peoples' Science Movement and propagation of Bharat Jana Gyan Vigyan Jatha activities.
- g) Low-Cost Teaching Aids Bank for every district.
- h) Computerisation of University - A Model, International Project.
- i) Regional Programme package for improvement of Science and Environment Education and Technology Transfer.

3. Courses Conducted :

3.1 a) NON FORMAL COURSE ON COMPUTER APPRECIATION

This is a Course for Community enrichment and awareness is aimed at demystifying Computer and enable general community to become comfortable with P.C. The duration is 4 months - twice in a year and begins in March and July. It is open to all level participants above sixth standard.

During both terms of the year 1992-93, 150 participants, 16% more than the previous year were registered. Participation comprised - Males 106; Females 44; Scheduled Tribe/Caste 54; Others 96. 41 from Schools, 60 from Colleges, 25 Post-Graduates from University and 24 working women which included drop-outs and housewives. It is encouraging to discover that quite a few participants came from long distance more than 10 kms. Students came regularly from Marbisu, Mairang, Smit and Nongkrem spending Rs. 10/- to 12/- daily.

b) COURSE ON BASIC PROGRAMMING

The duration is for 14 weeks. It is open to School, College going students.

200 applicants applied for admission. 102 were given a test and 24 students were selected which comprised 17 males, 7 females; 13 from Scheduled Tribe/Caste and 11 Others; 6 from Schools and 18 from Colleges including drop-outs. Majority of them came from long distances, 5 kms. above. 90% of participants attended 95% classes.

c) COURSE ON USE OF dBASE III PLUS

The duration is for 12 weeks and is open to College and University students and working individuals.

18 students were retained after testing a large group on Culture Fair Intelligence Test. The group comprised of 11 males, 7 females; 8 from ST/SC and 10 from Others; 7 students (Post-Graduate); 11 Working individuals including Housewives and drop-outs.

3.2 COURSE ON AMATEUR RADIO

The duration is for 12 weeks and is open to participants from all the sectors of community including students from colleges and schools.

The examination was conducted by the Ministry of Communications, Wireless Division, Govt. of India, New Delhi.

The selected group comprised of 16 males, 6 females; 8 from ST/SC and 14 Others, 9 from Schools, 10 from College level and 3 from other community including working individuals and drop-outs.

Requests have been received from other States to help them in conducting such courses.

3.3 COURSES OF REMEDIAL TEACHING ON BOTANY, CHEMISTRY, MATHEMATICS, PHYSICS AND ZOOLOGY.

The Courses are designed for disadvantaged students to provide additional learner centred interaction and enrichment materials based upon diagnostic discussion so as to enable tribal students to improve their scholastic achievement and participate in competitive selections.

The duration is for 20 weeks and is open to Tribal PU IInd year students.

14 students were admitted on Principal's recommendation as well as direct approach after General Intelligence Testing.

4. Other Activities

a) DEMISTIFYING SCIENCE OR POPULARISATION OF SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS

Under auspices of Bharat Jana Gyan Vigyan Jatha - peoples' Science Movement sponsored by National Council of Science and Technology Communications, Centre for Science Education joined hands with Regional Organising Council and State Organising Councils and began celebrations from 15th February onwards to commemorate National Science Day and organising Regional Culmination and continued during April 1993. Science Fair at Jowai for Jaintia Hills was participated over two days during the fair - Exhibition of Mirrors Mirrors Everywhere; Discovery Participatory Exhibits; Easy to do and understand experiments alongwith Star Shows were organised.

b) Science and Environment Fair at Central State Library

The Centre participated in the fair organised by State Science and Technology Department through its Star Lab Programme and exposition of Discovery Gadgets.

c) SCIENCE EXPO AT KOHIMA

In order to launch BJGVJ- 1992 in Nagaland on the request of Pro-Vice-Chancellor, NEHU and Science and Technology Department of Nagaland, SCIENCE EXPO was organised at Kohima.

Nearly three thousand participants took part. The expo initially proposed for two days had to be extended to third day. Although the extended day being Sunday received tremendous response.

d) Village Jatha Programme (Mass Action for National Regeneration- Bharat Jana Gyan Vigyan Jatha)

In preparatory phase to Regional Culmination, the Centre for Science Education in collaboration with SOC Meghalaya and State Science Technology Cell-Meghalaya, took jatha team comprising 22 activists from Shillong to 4 villages in two days.

e) Visits to/from Schools continued, the break-up being :—

: Schools Visits - 10 schools - 560 Students and Teachers

: Visits to Schools - 6 schools - 300 and odd participants and Organisations.

f) Discovery Interactive Exhibits in Villages

This year nearly 3500 participants took the benefit and 14 more exhibits were included.

g) Amateur Radio Demonstrations.

Twelve demonstration were organised alongwith Jumboone for Scouts and Guides - 175 participants participated.

h) Regional Culmination- Bharat Jana Gyan Vigyan Jatha- Peoples' Science Movement.

Under the auspices of Mass Action for National Regeneration Bharat Jana Gyan Vigyan Jatha sponsored by National Council of Science and Technology Communications, Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India and collaborated by all State SOC's and Centre for Science Education, North-Eastern Hill University first time a gigantic peoples Programme in the form of Regional Culmination was organised at Palashbari, a village 35 kms. away from Guwahati from 28th February to 3rd March, 1993.

The culmination was preceded with five Jatha Movement over long distances beginning from Itanagar, Imphal, Kohima, Aizawl and Shillong. Prof. Yash Pal, Dr. V.B. Kamble from Delhi, Mr. R. Kurup from Trivandrum, Mr. R. Raghuvanshi from National Organising Council and host of other dignitaries from North East and other parts of the country participated in the programme.

Unaccounted participation must have crossed 10,000 over four days. Nearly 120 volunteers worked for the Regional Culmination day and night. It received tremendous encouragement and support from Palashbari village community.

i) Regional Trainig Workshop on Mathematics through ORIGAMI (SHILLONG)

The programme was sponsored by National Council of Science and Technology Communications, Department of Science and Technology, New Delhi; State Departments of Education and was organised in collaboration with the Centre for Science Education, NEHU at Shillong from 19th to 23rd June, 1993.

41 teachers-6 from Arunachal; 10 from Assam; 25 from Meghalaya; comprising 10 females and 31 males participated in the

programme.

- j) Regional Training workshop on Mathematics through Origami (IMPHAL)
Another 5 days workshop was organised at Imphal for Nagaland, Mizoram, Tripura and Manipur from 26th to 30th June, 1992 in collaboration with respective SOC's and State departments of Education and Science and Technology.

- k) Regional Training Workshops on Development and Use of Low-Cost Teaching Aids.

Under the auspices of MANAR/BJGVJ - 1992, the opportunity was taken to collaborate and organise five regional training workshops.

For first set of five workshop, Regional Organising Council could persuade SOC's of North Eastern States to raise their own funds and it was accordingly self-managed.

The Centre for Distance Education, NEHU, Shillong Came into being by a resolution of the Academic Council in its 25th Meeting held on 17th and 18th December, 1985 to organise and introduce correspondence courses in the University. The Council further resolved that efforts would be made to explore the possibility of having collaborative programmes with Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi.

The Centre actually started functioning with effect from 29th August, 1986. The University provided the minimum infrastructural facilities. There was no full-time faculty position in the Centre and hence attempts to start correspondence courses could not succeed so far.

However, the Certificate courses, Diploma courses, Degree courses and Postgraduate courses of Indira Gandhi National Open University are managed in the

Centre for Distance Education as the host institution of the IGNOU Study Centre, Shillong. This is facilitated by the appointment of the Director of the Centre for Distance Education as the Co-ordinator of the IGNOU Study Centre, Shillong. At present Dr. Mathew George, is the Director of the Centre for Distance Education and the Co-ordinator of IGNOU Study Centre, Shillong, in addition to his normal duties in the Department of Education, NEHU, Permanent Campus, Shillong. The Centre for Distance Education has been shifted from the rented building to the second floor (former Biophysics) of NEHU, Bijni Complex, Laitumkhrach, Shillong with effect from 1st July, 1993. Fresh attempts are being made to revamp and rejuvenate the activities of the Centre for Distance Education and the IGNOU Study Centre, Shillong.

This section which includes all prescribed books on heavy demand is kept under closed access and issued strictly for one week.

2.2. Local Collection

The section contains one copy of each book, written on the North-East and purchased by the Library. These are allowed for consultation only, so as to ensure that one copy of the North-East books are available in the library.

2.3. Geography Books

This collection brings together all geography books scattered in different subject for easy location by geography students.

2.4. Gandhian Collection

This collection contains all books written by Mahatma Gandhi and on Gandhi.

2.5. Other Important Collections

Data bank, census, thesis and dissertation.

3. Procurement of Books and Journals during 1992-93

During the year, the library was provided with Rs. 5 lakhs for purchase of books, Rs.52.15 lakhs for journal subscription. In addition, the library also received an additional allocation of Rs.27 lakhs for purchase of books and journals.

3.1 Books Purchase

Under Rs.5 lakhs provision for purchase of books the library has procured 2494 volumes for different departments. The following special items may be mentioned.

Out of the limited fund available 18 serials and advances have been covered.

A ten year index of the journal was prepared in the documentation section which was published in the Vol. 10 No.4 of the NEHU Journal.

5.5. Reminders for Overdue Books

During the winter vacation, a total number of 350 reminders were sent to all teachers and staff to which the library has received a very good response.

5.6. Books Bound during the year.

A total of 2564 journals were bound and accessioned during the year.

COLLEGE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL SHILLONG CAMPUS

The College Development Council started functioning from October 1979 with joining of the Director, College Development Council. The Council as envisaged by the UGC provides some mechanism for Co-ordinating the activities of the colleges and the University, and it does act as a link between the colleges and the University and the UGC. The establishment of the College Development Council with the active participation of various academic and administrative constituents of the University was a welcome step for improving the standard of higher education.

NEHU has 61 affiliated Colleges including 7 Professional Colleges for teaching Law and Education, and many new Colleges are under Processing to get affiliation.

In giving affiliation the University has, besides enforcing the normal provision of the ordinance governing condition for affiliation look into the special needs of the backward areas and also their requirement in terms of academic inputs and the employability of the students who could be graduated from the Colleges. In view of the paucity of teachers the University has a provision for faculty exchange programme where the University teachers on the request from the Colleges may go to assist a particular faculty/discipline of the college for a short period. The exchange programme also envisages the opportunity of college teachers to come to the University Departments for a greater exposure or improving their horizon of knowledge.

In the initial stage of College Development Council only a few colleges were enlisted under Section 2 (f) 12 B, which entitle the colleges to receive grants from the Commission. The Council is now very much actively pursuing the UGC to enlist all eligible colleges under 2 (f) 12 B of the UGC Act.

During the period 1992-93 the following Colleges were brought under Provisional affiliation/Extension of Affiliation and Upgradation.

The Provisional affiliation to Nongtalang College for a period of three years and Resolved to approve the same up to Pre-University level subject to fulfilment of the condition laid down same upto P.U. (Arts) level.

The Provisional affiliation to Salt Christian College and Women's College up to P.U. Arts level Pranabananda. Women's College up to P.U. Arts level.

The Committee decided that the three Campuses should conduct the Inter College Sports in their respective Campuses during the month of July, 1992.
2. The Asstt. Director Sports, Mizoram Campus pursued the Sports Board meeting decision and applied for some amount of money to the Head-quarters for

organisation of Inter College Sports within Mizoram. The Headquarters sanctioned a small amount of money and the Inter College Sports within Mizoram had been organised during the month of July, 1992 at Aizawl. Fortunately the Govt. of Mizoram sanctioned fund for TA and DA of outside College Students this enabled more participating College numbering 12 (twelve).

3. According to the Sports Board Committee decision, Inter Zonal College Sports had been organised by the Asstt. Director Sports Shillong during the month of July 1992. The asstt. Director Sports NEHU Mizoram Campus let the Mizoram College Students contingent and participated in the Inter Zonal Sports at Shillong. The Mizoram Zone got championship in Badminton Boys and Girls and Chess and also second position in Table Tennis.

The Champion team continued practice in Badminton Boys and Girls and supervised by the Asstt. Director Sports NEHU Mizoram Campus, Aizawl for Inter University Badminton Tournament i.e. (East Zone). But no intimation was received from the Headquarters and practice also was considered useless and that the Asstt. Director Sports stopped the coaching.

The NEHU Headquarters Sports incharge entrusted the Asstt. Director Sports Mizoram Campus to collect good players for NEHU Hockey Team for the Participation of East Zone Inter Varsity Tournament. The Asstt. Director Sports Mizoram Campus selected good Hockey players from different colleges and conducted coaching. But due to many reasons the participation also cancelled.

It is expected that for the coming year the authority of NEHU may consider the convenience for participation in East Zone Inter Varsity. If not the moral of the Players - Students will be down.

During the month of March 1993 with the permission of Pro. V.C. Mizoram Campus Tournament was organised by the Asstt. Director Sports Mizoram Campus for non-teaching staff Mizoram Campus and Pachhunga University College staff.

In the Mizoram state level Hockey Tournament 1993, the Asstt. Director Sports Mizoram Campus rendered his services as official.

The above activities have been done besides normal routine works.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME SHILLONG CAMPUS

1. Name of the Department : N.S.S. Cell, NEHU, Shillong

2. Introduction :

The NSS Department of NEHU was started in 1974-75 to cover the State - Meghalaya (head Quarters, Shillong), Mizoram and Nagaland. However towards the middle of 1980, the Government of Nagaland decided to release grants directly to the Colleges without renting it through the University. From this year Mizoram has also received permission to have funds directly rented to them from the Centre (Ministry).

The main objective of NSS is development of the personality of the students through community service. This is hoped to be realised through 2 main programmes, the Regular Activities and the Special Camps. The Regular Activities are programmes carried out throughout the year around the vicinity of the College and its campus, neighbouring areas and other related places where NSS volunteers take part during their free Time. Special camping programme involves a 10 day camp at the adopted village of the College. Activities that are under taken here depend on the theme as instructed by the Ministry though other priorities of the village are also taken into consideration. The theme for activities for 1992-93 is Mass Programme for Functional Literacy.

The reports send under NSS, NEHU reflect only the activities of the 2 States of Meghalaya and Mizoram, as Nagaland have stopped sending reports since 1980.

The enrolment of NSS volunteers during 1992-93 is Meghalaya-6426 and Mizoram-6,334. Meghalaya has 62 NSS units in 17 Colleges, with 25 programme Officers looking after them Mizoram has 60 NSS units in 15 Colleges with 34 Programme Officers, looking after them.

Besides the above prescribed activities, instructions are also received from time to time from the Ministry to observe certain dates of significance. These are the following :-

1. World AIDS Weeks was being observed from 23rd November, 1992 to 1st December, 1992, by the students volunteers making the public aware of this dreaded disease. This is generally done by the means of preparing poster and pasting them throughout the Town. In the College itself, exhibitions of posters and other information is carried out followed by lectures, evaluation of questionnaires and film shows on AIDS. Besides these news items were given to the press and All India Radio.
2. Tree plantation programmes are held by the Colleges on 5th June, 1992, which is the occasion of World Environment Day, and later dates of the month as well.
3. The National Youth Day is celebrated on 12th January, 1993 by a light programme by College who can manage as this falls during the winter vacation.
4. Similarly the NSS Day which falls on 15th January every year has had to be shifted to the first (monday) of April for the very same reason that it falls during the winter holidays).
5. A No Tobacco Day is also being observed by the Colleges on 31st May, 1992. Posters and pamphlets prepared by the NSS Cell, NEHU were also distributed to the volunteers. Some Colleges held Seminars and discussed on papers written about the disease.

Various programmes which included putting up of posters, discussions on Topics like Secularism, Non-violence and anti-communalism, were conducted ending with a fancy dress of different areas of India.

PLANNING DEPARTMENT SHILLONG CAMPUS

No new developmental schemes could be undertaken during the year 1992-93 by the University since against the remaining 8th Plan outlay for New Schemes, amounting to Rs.661.91 lakhs, no grants were released by the Commission. Of the outlay of Rs.910.00 lakhs for "Spill Over Items" approved for the 8th Plan period, Rs.338.58 lakhs had been released upto 31.3.92, and only Rs.66.50 lakhs were released by the Commission for 1992-93. This trickling of Plan grants despite repeated requests for more funds might be occasioned by the decision to extend the 8th Plan period to 31.3.97 instead of 31.3.95. Be that as it may, the flow of Plan grants has to improve if the University is not to be blamed of failure to utilise Plan grants during the plan period. If grants are released in the final year of the Plan period it will be difficult for the University to utilise them within the Plan period. The University this time is ready and capable of lifting of the entire 8th Plan outlay even by 21.3.94, if the grants are released to it.

Since the University is in a position to utilise the entire 8th Plan outlay for both "Spill-Over" items and "New Schemes" its requirement of Plan grants for 1993-94 are depicted below :-
