The Executive Council vide resolution No:EC:89:96:6:3:(ii) granted E.O.L for one year to Dr.A.C.Dube Lecturer of Economics Deptt., w.e.f 1.4.96 to take up an assignment on the project "Poverty Assessment in India" at Indian Statistical Institute, New Delhi under the project Leadership of Prof.Subhashis Gangopadhyay of I.S.I. Prior to the expiry of the period and on his request and recommendation of Prof.S.Gangopadhyay further extension of E.O.L for a period of four months w.e.f 1.4.97 was granted vide resolution No:EC:93:97:3:(xx). In the meantime in his letter dated 22.4.97 at Annexure-I, Dr.Dube intimated that he got an offer to join the G.B.Pant Science Institute, Allahabad as Reader in Economics and intended to join the position w.e.f 26.4.97 and requested permission for joining the post extending his E.O.L upto 30.4.98. This fact was taken up in the 93rd meeting of the Executive Council, that joining of G.B Pant Institute would be in contravention of the proviso of OE-6 Cl-8(ii) and E.O.L to join the Institute would be irregular. However, the said E.C decision was silent on this aspect, except granting of extension of EOL for four months w.e.f 1.4.97. But with the approval of the Vice-Chancellor, he was directed to report for duty immediately on the expiry of the EOL failing which his services would be liable for termination from the date of commencement of the EOL granted. Dr.Dube did report the Department but on 22.9.97 and submitted an application for extension of EOL from the expiry of earlier EOL granted i.e w.e.f 1.8.97 to 20.9.97 as 21.9.97 being Sunday.

Joining of G.B.Pant Institute while on EOL for his research work in I.S.I. New Delhi is no doubt highly irregular, without having applied for the post through proper channel. He has violated Clause F 19(9) of OE-6 of the ordinance where a teacher on leave shall not without the written permission of the University taken in advance engage directly in any trade or business, whatsoever or in any private tuition or other works, to which any emoluments or honorarium is attached. The A.R.(Audit) views was to treat the period as 'Dies-Non' but there is no such provision in the Ordinance governing leave to teachers. However, from the justification explanation furnished by him at Annexure -II and circumstances that led him to join G.B. Pant Institute and considering the fact that he had applied for permission in his letter dated 22.4.96 prior to his joining the Institute and on rejection did report back to the University, and besides, the assigned project on 'Poverty Assessment' in India being highly acclaimed by the sponsors i.e the Ministry of Planning Deptt.of Statistics, G.O.I in their letter dated 9.9.97 at

Annexure - III, the Executive Council may perhaps take the above into consideration for arriving at a decision to regularise the period from 1.8.97 to 21.9.97 by granting him EOL, subject to payment of Pensionary contribution in accordance to the provision of Clause 8(iii) (d) of OE-6 for the period from 26-4-97 to 21-9-97.

The matter is placed to the Council for consideration.

Sub:- Release from I.S.I., New Delhi.

Madam,

This has reference to your letter No.F.19-211|Estt-II/87/658 dated 27.10.1997 on the subject cited above. In this connection, I have to state the following:-

- (i) As you are aware, I was granted EOL for a year with effect from April 1, 1996 to work on the project Poverty Assessment in India at the I.S.I. New Delhi. During the extended period of the EOL (i.e. during 1.4.1997 to 31.7.1997), I was to continue working with Professor Shubhashis Gangopadhyay on the same project. We submitted the draft report (of the project) to the sponsors (Department of Statistics, Ministry of Planning, Government of India) in the first week of April. As it was a draft report, it was understood that we would have to submit the revised version of the report after incorporating the comments, if any, of the sponsors. This was the reason why I requested for the extension of the EOL.
- (ii) Within a few days of submission of the draft report, we came to know that it will take some time to process the report before we get the comments and are in position to finalize it. (As a matter of fact, the views of the sponsors on the draft report were discussed around last week of August, 1997 and we got official communication about it on September 9, 1997. For details, please refer to enclosure I).

- (iii) It is around this that time middle of April '97 that my collaborator, Professor Gangopadhyay, decided to go abroad on a foreign assignment for about three months. Around this time, I had an offer of Readership at the G.B. Pant Institute, Allahabad. Since my collaborator was going out of country and project report was under consideration of the sponsors, I requested Professor Gangopadhyay to release me from the assignment at the I.S.I., Delhi Centre (please refer to enclosure II).
- (iv) Even before I was released from the ISI, Delhi Centre, I applied to the University for permission to take up the assignment w.e.f. April 26, 1997 (through FAX dated April 22, 1997). In the same letter I had also requested for the extension of the EOL till April 1998. Since my collaborator, Professor Gangopadhyay, was going abroad and considering the fact that I was already on EOL from the University, I joined the G.B. Pant Institute to gain valuable experience as Reader anticipating that the permission to join and extension of the EOL would come in due course.
- (v) But as soon as I was informed about the expiry of the EOL (vide letter No.F.19-217/Estt-II/87-909 dated August 28, 1997) and, was directed to join back the University at the earliest, I reported for duty on September 22, 1997 (i.e. within two weeks of receiving the letter in which I was directed to join back the University immediately).
- (vi) I would like to add here that I did not, join back the University after expiry of the EOL as my request for extension of the EOL was under consideration with the University. (It is to be noted here, however, that I was never told about the outcome of my request for permission to join the G.B. Pant Institute and the extension of the EOL till April, 1998).

(vii) At the time of rejoining the University, I was working with the G.B. Pant Institute, Akhahabad. Therefore, release order from the GB Pant Institute is also enclosed, herewith (please refer to enclosure III).

And finally, may I add here that the EOL granted to me was utilized for carrying out the study POVERTY ASSESSMENT IN INDIA. As mentioned above, we completed the work successfully which is highly appreciated not only by the sponsors but by the academic community in general. During the course of study, we submitted four reports to the sponsors where my name appears as one of the co-author of the report along with my affiliation with the University (copy of cover page of all the reports is enclosed as enclosure IV-VII). As evident from enclosure I, report is not only accepted by the sponsors, they have asked us to revise it and publish it as special issue of the SARVEKSHANA (Official publication of the Department of Statistics, Government of India). The cost of revising the report and publication is being borne by the sponsors. Further, since the report is being published now, we can use the data set. We expect to bring out many more quality publications based on the data set used in the report.

I hope my reply is found satisfactory.
