

(iii) Amendment to Admission criteria for M.Sc Bio-Chemistry.

On the above subject, the Head, Department of Bio-Chemistry, North-Eastern Hill University, Shillong vide his letter No.9-12/Bio-Che/200+79 of 26th May, 2000 as at Annexure 'A' has intimated that the First Batch of B.Sc Bio-Chemistry(Honours) is going to come out this year from NEHU, and therefore, he has proposed that the admission criteria for M.Sc in Bio-Chemistry be amended as follows :

" For M.Sc in Bio-Chemistry, a student in addition to Honours in Bio-Chemistry, with Honours in Bio-Technology can also apply".

It may be noted that as per the present criteria the students from five subjects viz Bio-Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Micro-Biology and Bio-Technology are eligible to apply for admission to M.Sc Bio-Chemistry. But from the aforesaid suggestions, it appears that the Department of Bio-Chemistry desire to restrict itself to two subjects only i.e. Bio-Chemistry and Bio-Technology.

The matter was placed before the 63rd meeting of the Academic Council and the Council RESOLVED that besides Bio-Chemistry, students with Honours in Bio-Technology can also apply.

- (ii) Drafting of a Regulation for procedure of examinations, fee structure, attendance and equivalent on Certificate and PG Diploma Courses.

- (iii) Amendment to admission criteria for M.Sc. Bio-Chemistry.

EC:107:2000:5:1:(iii): The Council considered the amendment to the admission criteria for M.Sc. in Bio-Chemistry and RESOLVED that Honours in Bio-Chemistry and Bio-Technology may be given preference over others but should not be the requisite criteria. The Council, further noted with regret that the eligibility criteria as proposed by the Department was notified without the approval of the Executive Council.
