

AGENDA PAPERS FOR THE SEVENTY-SECOND MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

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- (vi) Extension of Extra Ordinary Leave for another six months in respect of Dr.R. Lalthangliana Lecturer Pachhunga University College.

Dr.R.Lalthangliana Lecturer Sociology

Department has requested for further extension of Extra Ordinary Leave with effect from 1-3-91 to 31-8-91 to enable him to discharge his duties as an Member of Legislative Assembly of Mizoram.

The Vice-Chancellor has approved the leave

and Dr.Lalthangliana has been granted extension for another six months with effect from 1-3-91. The leave has been granted as per Ordinance O E 6 F. General 19(3) which provides that a teacher who is elected as Member of Legislative Assembly/Member of Parliament can be granted Extra Ordinary Leave upto 5 years.

So far Dr Lalthangliana has been granted leave with effect from 1-4-89 to 28-2-91 that is approximately 3 years.

The matter is placed before the council for ratification.

- (iii) Award of a citation and ~~Cash~~ award to Shri Nilanjon Gupta.

Shri Nilanjon Gupta, a Pre-University Science of St. Edmund's College, Shillong was the topper of the Pre-University (Science) Examination held in February-March, 1991 securing record marks as given below :-

- a) Out of 900 marks, given for the compulsory papers, he secured 777 marks, that is, 86.33%.
- b) Out of 200 marks for the additional papers he secured 187 marks, that is, excess marks of 127.
- c) Thus the total marks secured by him was 904, that is, 100.44 per cent.

This being a very commendable achievement, in not only breaking the records of attainment from the inception of the University but also securing more than 100 per cent, taking into account the excess marks of the additional papers, the Vice-Chancellor was pleased to decide awarding the following to Shri Nilanjon Gupta :

- a) A special citation to be given at the Eighth Convocation of the University
- b) A cash award of Rs. 5000/- (Rupees Five Thousand) P.a. to be given for the full duration of his next course of study.

The matter is placed before the Council for ratification.

- (viii) Extra-Ordinary Leave in respect of Shri Subrat K.Nanda, Lecturer in Sociology, SASRD., Medziphema, Nagaland.

Shri. Subrat K. Nanda joined this University as Lecturer in Sociology, SASRD, Medziphema on 10.12.88 on probation for two years.

Shri. Nanda was found absent from duty for a period of 214 (two hundred & fourteen) days with effect from 6.9.90 to 7.4.91 without obtaining or applying for prior permission from the competent authority. He reported for duty on 8.4.91 and submitted his leave application and charge report with a request that his charge report may be accepted. The reasons given by him for his absence was that his mother was ill and that he was also occupied with his Ph.D work.

The Office viewed that in the first place, Shri.Nanda should have applied for leave in advance and obtain prior sanction of the authority before proceeding on leave. Therefore his conduct is not proper especially when he is still under probation.

Keeping in view that it is difficult to get teachers in the Campuses and that since this is Shri. Nanda's first fault, the Vice-Chancellor allowed him to join with the condition that his probation be extended by 7 (seven) months, that is, the period of absence.

The matter is placed before the Executive Council for consideration and ratification of the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor and that the period of absence be regularised by granting Shri.Nanda extra-ordinary leave.

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4 DEFERRED ITEM

(i) Annual Report for the year 1989-90

The draft Annual Report for the year 1989-90 was circulated in the last meeting of the Council. Consideration of the report was however deferred to enable the members to examine the same.

In the meantime, on account of pressure from the Ministry for early submission of the report, the members of the Council were requested to give written comments/approval on the Annual Report to facilitate speedy finalisation.

5:1 - Statutes, Ordinances, Regulations and Rules.

- (i) Amendment of the table below Statute 20 on Selection Committee for appointment of Lecturers in constituent Colleges and the observation of the Ministry of Human Resource Development thereon

After a series of discussions in the 67th meeting of the Executive Council, 38th meeting of the Academic Council, 68th meeting of the Executive Council and in the 39th meeting of the Academic Council, the Executive Council in its 69th meeting decided that amendment to the table below Statute 20 on Selection Committee for appointment of Lecturers in constituent colleges be amendment as Shown in Annexure-'A'.

The amendment was referred to the Ministry of H.R.D. for the Visitor's assent as required under sub-section (3) of Section 25 of the NEHU Act, 1973. The observations of the Ministry Vide D.O. Letter No.F.8-42/90-Desk(U) dated 2.4.91 in this regard is placed at Annexure-'B' for reference and consideration of the Council.

The original idea for the amendment was to make a provision for inclusion of the Principal as member in the Selection Committee and accordingly the Executive Council in its 67th meeting held on 15th and 16th September, 1989 decided to amend the table by adding only one more clause, "Principal of the College", to the existing provision,

However, in the course of deliberations in the Academic Council and the Executive Council the entire provision was amended as shown in Annexure-'A'.

According to Section 25 of the Act, the power to amend or repeal the Statutes lies with the Executive Council and as per the provisions of Statute 13- on powers and functions of the Executive Council, the latter is to obtain the recommendation of the Academic Council only for deciding cases relating to the number, qualifications and emoluments of academic staff.

In view of the Ministry's observations it is suggested that a provision for inclusion of the Principal of the College, in the existing provision would suffice to meet our needs.

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In view of the above it is suggested that the table to Statute 20 may perhaps be amended as follows as resolved by the Executive Council in its 67th meeting.

Dear Shri Shira,

Kindly refer to your d.o.No.CONF/15-1/Stat/87-88/491 dated 9th January, 1991 explaining therein the justification for the proposed amendment to the Statute relating to Selection Committee for Lecturers of Colleges or Institutions maintained by the University.

The proposed amendment has been examined in detail and the following observations are made :

- (a) While the stated intention of the University is to include the Principal of the College as a Member of the Selection Committee, the new Clause (i) also mentions the Head of the Department. If the intention is to include the Head of the Department as a separate member of the Committee he should be included through a separate clause. If not, reference to the Head of the Department should be deleted.
- (b) The existing clause (ii) provides that a nominee of the EC shall be nominated on the Selection Committee out of a panel of names recommended by the Academic Council. This clause has not been substituted to provide that one Professor in the service of the University would be nominated on the Selection Committee by the VC. However no justification for this amendment has been given.
- (c) The existing clause (i) provides that two persons who are not teachers of the College or Institutions concerned shall be nominated on the Selection Committee by EC out of a panel of names recommended by the AC for their special knowledge or interest in subjects with which the teachers will be concerned. However, in the amended clause (iii), the reference to the two persons not being teachers of the college/institutions concerned has been deleted without

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providing any justification for this amendment. It is felt that the original clause could be retained.

It is requested that clarification in respect of the observations made above may kindly be made available at the earliest.

It is suggested to include the Head of the Department as a separate member of the Selection Committee. The amendment is to include the Head of the Department as a separate member of the Selection Committee. It should be included through a separate clause. If not, reference to the Head of the Department should be deleted.

(iii) Study leave of Dr. B.K. Tripathi, Lecturer, Pachhunga University College, Aizawl.

Dr. B.K. Tripathi, Lecturer, Pachhunga University College, Aizawl, has applied for study leave for a period of six months with effect from 20th May, 1991 as to enable him to proceed to the States for training Programme under BOYSCAT FELLOW awarded from D.S.T., New Delhi. His application was recommended by the Principal, Pachhunga University College.

Dr. Tripathi had already left the station on 9.4.91. Normally study leave is to be granted on the recommendation of the School Board. However, since the School Board is not scheduled to meet soon and scheduled to held only on November, 1991.

The matter is placed before the Executive Council, for consideration.

- (iv) Crediting of Compensatory leave on 1:1 basis for duty performed during Semester break of 1988, 1989 & 1990.

The Dean, School of Social Sciences vide letter dated 6.6.90 (Annexure "A") intimated that in a meeting of the Heads of Departments, Deans of Schools and the Vice-Chancellor it was decided that there shall be no semester break in 1988, 1989 and 1990 to enable the Departments to complete the teaching assignment and that the teachers shall be entitled to Compensatory leave for equal number of days of the vacation.

Ordinance OE6(5) provides that "Earned leave admissible to a teacher shall be 1/30th of actual service including vacation plus 1/3rd of the period, if, any, during which he is required to perform duty during vacation".

No provision is made for compensatory leave in the University Ordinances. The office also do not have any papers/ documents from any appropriate authority to credit compensatory leave on 1:1 basis, except the Minutes of the meeting of the Heads of Departments and Deans of Schools held on 27.6.89.

At one time the University decided as follows and it was circulated vide notification No. F.12-1/Estt.II/85-4231, dt. 18.7.1990:-

1. Crediting of compensatory leave will be subject to the respective Head of Department certifying that a teacher actually took classes during the semester break.
2. Compensatory leave will not be credited to the earned leave account. Seperate account will be maintained for Compensatory leave.
3. Compensatory leave cannot be prefixed or suffixed with earned leave or any other kind of leave including vacation.
4. Compensatory leave should not be availed of more than ten days in each semester and should be availed only after due permission is granted.
5. Compensatory leave should be availed within one year from the date of accumulation. "

However, before the above decision could be placed in the Executive Council for ratification, objections were received from certain departments viz: Sociology Deptt. and Mathematics Deptt. which may be seen at Annexure 'B' & 'C'.

Many requests have been received from various faculty members of different departments for grant of compensatory leave. But it is yet to be decided whether compensatory leave may be computed and granted on 1:1 basis or by crediting the duty performed during semester break to the earned leave account on 1/3rd basis as per the Ordinance.

The matter was again examined and the office held the following views:-

Mid-Semester break or summer break is nothing but a vacation and for performance of duties by a teacher during a vacation, there is a special provision in the Ordinance to the effect that 1/3rd of the period spent on duty during vacation will count towards the earned leave. As such, in accordance with the provision of the Ordinance, 1/3rd of the total period spent on duty during the Mid-Semester break should be credited to the Earned leave accounts of those teachers who worked during the vacation.

The issue for grant of compensatory leave for work during semester break during 1988, 1989 & 1990 does not apply to all the departments and to all the teachers of the University. It applies only to those departments which could not complete the course. Here again only some of the teachers who could not complete the course of teaching had to work during the vacation.

Untill the relevant provision of the Ordinance is amended, the clause as it exists, remains in force and the duty performed during the vacation should be computed towards Earned leave as per the provision of the Ordinance.

The condition for grant of compensatory leave as Govt. of India rules is that normally the leave is to be granted within one month of its becoming due.

It will no, however, be advisable to grant compensatory leave simultaneously as it will affect the teaching and the classes.

The matter is placed before the Executive Council for consideration as to how the Compensatory leave may be computed and granted.

Sub :- Compensatory leave for teachers in lieu of
Semester Break.

Sir,

In a meeting of the Heads of Departments in this School held on 5.6.90 the programme for the 1st and 2nd Semester were discussed. It was observed that the inordinate delay in publication of Honours results in Sociology and History has completely upset the academic calender of the School. The only way to partially recover the loss of time is to do away with the Semester Break this year also and to hold classes during that period like past two years. It is possible, only if the teachers agree to forego the vacation.

In this connection, it may be recalled that it was decided in 1988 and 1989 in meetings of the Heads and Deans under the Chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor that the teachers shall be entitled to compensatory leave for equal numbers of days of the vacation. The first semester classes were, accordingly, held during the vacation. When some teachers applied for compensatory leave, they were not granted such leave on the plea that the decision of the University was not notified formally.

The Heads of the Departments, therefore, felt that the University should formally notify that the teachers shall be entitled to compensatory leave for equal numbers of days of the vacation. I was asked to take up this matter with you so that a notification is issued immediately on compensatory leave for 1988, 1989 and 1990.

I consider it extremely important, because we have to request the teachers not to leave the station during the ensuing Semester Break so that the 1st Semester classes can be held during that period.

I shall be grateful for your immediate and personal attention in this matter.

- (v) Request for two years E.O.L. from Prof. A.K. Sharma,
Deptt. of Public Administration, NEHU, Aizawl.

Prof. A.K. Sharma, Deptt. of Public Administration, NEHU, Aizawl has applied for two years Extra-ordinary leave to enable him to join an assignment as Professor at the I.I.P.A., New Delhi.

The application for the said new post was duly forwarded by the University i.e. the Mizoram Campus Office of NEHU.

Prof. A.K. Sharma joined NEHU on 29.7.85 and he has completed nearly six years of service. He is also a confirmed employee.

As per relevant Ordinance "the application for such leave shall be sent through the Dean of the School concerned and the latter shall give his recommendations taking into account the strength of the teaching staff for the particular subject. Except in very special cases, at no time more than 20% of the strength of the teachers on rolls of a Centre shall be allowed to be absent from the Centre on extra-ordinary leave, study leave and/or sabbatical leave."

At present the regular teaching strength of the Department is as follows:

- (vi) Deputation of Prof.M.N.Karna as
Director of Anugrah Narain Sinha
Institute of Social Studies, Patna.

As per D.O. letter dated 15.5.91 received from R.K.Srivastava, Commissioner & Secretary, Department of Human Resource Development, Govt. of Bihar, Patna, by Prof. M.N.Karna, Deptt. of Sociology, was offered an appointment as interim Director of the Anugrah Narain Sinha Institute of Social Studies, Patna, and the Institute would like to have the service on deputation initially for a shorter period which eventually may extend upto 3 years in case he is selected as Director on regular basis.

Prof.Karna accepted the above offer and had requested that he be released on deputation with effect from May 14,1991, stating that as per the A.N.Sinha Institute (Amendment) Act 1989, the post of the Director is at par with that of the Vice-Chancellor and carries the emoluments commensurate with that post. Prof.Karna had a telephonic discussion with the Vice-Chancellor on the basis of which he joined the post on the 14th May,1991. No formal release order has as yet been issued.

In this connection, it may be mentioned that Prof.Karna was granted Sabbatical leave w.e.f 1.8.89 for one year till the end of the Academic Session vide order No.F.94-22/Estt.II/84-4172 dated 7.8.89, and approved by the Executive Council vide resolution No:EC:67:89:03:(xvii) dated 15th & 16th September 1989. As per order above, he is to execute a bond with the University in terms of Ordinance and to comply to the requirements set therein. But it appears that Prof.Karna has not complied with the above requirements.

As per OE-6,C1.11(para iii & v) stated as under:-

(iii) The teacher shall execute a bond with proper sureties as in the case of study leave, that after the expiry of sabbatical leave, he will return to the service of the University and serve thereafter at least for three years, failing which he will refund to the University the leave salary and allowances and other expenses, if any, spent on him, or on his behalf plus such amount as may be decided by the Executive Council from time to time if the teacher is allowed to go abroad for sabbatical leave together with interest at the rate of 6% per annum to be calculated from the date of such payment. Provided that the Executive Council may, in any exceptional case, waive or reduce, for reasons to be recorded, the amount refundable by a teacher under this Ordinance.

Contd.....P/-

(v) A teacher on sabbatical leave shall not take up during the period of that leave, any regular appointment under another organisation in India or abroad. He may, however, be allowed to accept a fellowship or a research scholarship or adhoc teaching assistance, other than a regular employment in an institution of advanced studies, provided that in such cases the Executive Council, may, if it so desires, sanction sabbatical leave on reduced pay and allowances.

The Vice-Chancellor had permitted Prof.M.N. Kama to join the new assignment on the condition that he will serve the University according to the conditions of the bond letter.

On the expiry of the sabbatical leave, Prof. Kama had resumed duties in the Department but has not fulfilled the criteria as per the Ordinance, viz, execution of the bond and has not completed the period of three years after rejoining NEHU after the expiry of sabbatical leave.

The question of allowing teachers to take up assignment elsewhere on deputation is still under the consideration of the University as no provision exists in the Ordinance for deputation.

The above points could not be considered by the University at the time of Prof.Karna's joining the said Institute due to the reason of the NEHUNSA agitation with effect from 6.5.91.

The matter is therefore placed before the Council for consideration.

vii) Extension of Extra-ordinary leave to Dr.R.P. Sharma, Reader, Deptt. of English, NEHU, Shillong.

Dr.R.P.Sharma, Reader, Deptt. of English, NEHU, Shillong has been granted Extra-Ordinary Leave for 2 (two) years with effect from 1.10.89 to join the University of Sana'a, Sana'a, Yemen Arab Republic for a teaching assignment.

Before expiry of his leave, in January, 1991 Dr.Sharma applied for extension of Extra-Ordinary Leave till August, 1992 as his leave would expire in September, 1991.

The Head, Deptt. of English conveyed his views as well as of the Department that it will not be in the interest of the Department to grant extension of leave to Dr.Sharma.

In view of the above, Dr.Sharma was informed that his request is regretted and that he should resume duty after expiry of his leave.

The University has now received communications from the Indian Ambassador, SANA'A and also the Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi to consider extension of the leave of Dr.Sharma for another one year for the reason that the University of Sana'a has not been able to recruit a replacement for Dr.Sharma from the U.S.A., U.K. in view of the recent Gulf crisis.

The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.

- (v) Request of Dr. Vijai Kumar, Reader
Deptt. of Mathematics for consideration
under the MPS for the post of Professor.

When the revised pay scales of teachers came into force from 1.1.86 a teacher can give his option for either the pay scales of the new pay revision scheme or the merit promotion scheme. The pay scale are as under :-

<u>New Pay Revision Scheme</u>	<u>Merit Promotion Scheme</u>
Professor -Rs.4500-150-5700- 200-7300/-	Rs.4500-150-5700/-
Reader - Rs.3700-125-4950-150- 5700/-	Rs.3000-100-3500-125-5000/-
Lecturer -Rs.2200-75-2800-100- 4000/-	Rs.2200-75-2800-100-4000/-

Once a teacher gives/his/her option for either one of the above, it cannot be changed.

Initially, Dr. Vijai Kumar, Reader, Deptt. of Mathematics gave his option for the revised scales as per the new pay revision scheme and his pay as Reader was accordingly revised with effect from 1.1.86 in the scale of pay of Rs.3700-125-4950-150-5700/-

However, subsequently Dr. Vijai Kumar wanted to opt for the M.P.S. This was examined by the office which was of the view that in case he opted for MPS his pay as Reader would be fixed in the scale of Rs.3000-5000/- and as Professor in the scale of pay of Rs.4500-5700/-. This was communicated to Dr. Vijai Kumar who later give another option for MPS.

In this connection it may be mentioned that in 1988 the Ministry as well as the UGC became aware of the departures being made by the Universities in implementing (a) The Merit Promotion Scheme, (b) Revised scales of pay and (c) the date from which different provisions of the schemes were being given effect to. As such they convened a meeting of the Registrars and Finance Officers of the Universities for giving necessary clarifications. The relevant para of the minutes, which clarifies the position, is re-produced below:-

"It was specifically provided in the Scheme that before the pay in the revised scale was fixed, every teacher was asked to exercise an option in writing to be governed by all the conditions attached to the June 1987 scheme, or to opt for the 1983 Merit Promotion Scheme. The teacher who opted for the Merit Promotion Scheme could claim only the replacement

mentioned in para 19. Teachers who opted for the new scales of pay forfeited their claims to be considered under the MPS of 1983."

As per the above clarification given to the Registrars and the Finance Officers of the Universities, Dr. Vijai Kumar is not eligible to be considered under the MPS, since he had initially opted for the revised scales of pay. He completed 8 years of service for consideration under MPS on 23.3.89, that is after the cut-off date.

Now, after he enjoyed the benefits of the revised pay scales for three years from 1.1.86, he cannot be considered for the second benefit under MPS. The clarifications given by the Ministry as well as the UGC are very clear, according to which a teacher may opt either for the revised scales of pay or for the MPS and not for both. Infact, he should not have been given the second opportunity to exercise his option again. The second option exercised by Dr. Vijai Kumar may be treated as cancelled.

The Director, Ministry of Human Resource Development vide his letter dated November 14, 1990 reiterated that it will not be possible to consider cases of promotion under MPS after 17.6.87. The relevant portions of the letter runs as follows :-

"our stand has been that it is not possible to consider cases of promotion after 17.6.87". Since Dr. Vijai Kumar completed 8 years of service only on 23.3.89 i.e after the cut-off date of 17.6.87, his case cannot be considered for promotion under MPS. In other words, the case of Dr. Vijai Kumar cannot be considered under MPS firstly because he opted for the revised scales of pay and secondly he completed the qualifying period of 8 years of service only after the cut-off date of 17.6.87.

In view of the University having permitted to exercise a second option, Dr. Vijai Kumar was allowed to appear for interview under MPS under the following conditions:

- 1) Dr. Vijai Kumar will continue in the scale of pay of Rs. 1200-1900/- (pre-revised) in the rank of Reader until he is promoted to Professor under MPS.
- 2) Adjustment of arrears etc. will have to be made after re-fixation of his pay at (1) above. Only after re-fixation has been done and settlement of dues that may be payable by Dr. Vijai Kumar, he can be considered for promotion in case this is decided by the Selection Committee.

- 3) Dr. Vijai Kumar may be called for interview for the post of Professor under MPS.
- 4) That the second option of Dr. Vijai Kumar should be treated as final and no other option will be permitted.

The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.

(vi) RECRUITMENT OF JUNIOR LIBRARY ASSISTANT.

As per Executive Council decisions Resolution No. EC:68:90:6:06(x) dated 3.3.90 and No. EC:69:90:6:06(ii) dated 28.6.90 copies enclosed on the Interim Promotion/Recruitment Policy of Non-Teaching employees (Technical/Non-Technical), 25% of the vacancy in the post of Jr. Library Asstts. are to be filled in through Departmental Test and the remnant 75% through open selection.

The eligibility condition prescribed in respect of the Departmental employees to appear the Departmental test is 5 years experience as Library Attendant subject to Seniority-cum-Fitness plus good typing speed of 30 words per minute.

In this connection, the Librarian, NEHU, Shillong has confirmed that the Jr. Library Asstts. are required to perform the following works :-

- (i) Circulation, including issue, return and reminders;
- (ii) Filing;
- (iii) Transcribing;
- (iv) Tracing;
- (v) Duplicate Checking;
- (vi) Accessioning;
- (vii) Registration of periodicals;
- (viii) Preparation of periodicals for binding;
- (ix) Preparation of documentation slips;
- (x) Preparation of books selection cards and
- (xi) Service to readers.

Keeping in view the above works required to be performed by Jr. Library Asstts., it is opined that the typing work hardly finds a place in the performance of the above mentioned jobs and as such, knowledge of typing in the instant case becomes a desirable qualification and not essential.

In view of the circumstances explained above, it is proposed that knowledge of typing may not be made an essential requirement for recruitment/promotion to the post of Jr. Library Asstts. Instead, more emphasis should be given on the knowledge of Library works, service attitude and general knowledge.

Hence, the matter is placed herewith before the Council for favour of consideration, and modification in respect of the Jr. Library Asstts. qualifications envisaged earlier in the Executive Council Resolutions.

The eligibility condition prescribed in respect of the Departmental employees to appear for the Departmental test is 5 years experience as Library Attendant subject to seniority-cum-fitness give good typing speed of 30 words per minute. In this connection, the Librarian, NENU, Shillong has contended that the Librarian Asstts. are required to perform the following works:-

- (i) Circulation, including issue, return and reminders;
- (ii) Filing;
- (iii) Transcribing;
- (iv) Taping;
- (v) Duplicate Checking;
- (vi) Accessioning;
- (vii) Registration of periodicals;
- (viii) Preparation of periodicals for binding;
- (ix) Preparation of documentation slips;
- (x) Preparation of book selection cards and
- (xi) Service to readers.

Keeping in view the above works required to be performed by Jr. Library Asstts., it is opined that the typing work hardly finds a place in the performance of the above mentioned jobs and as such, knowledge of typing in the instant case becomes a desirable but not essential.

7:4 - Delegation of financial power

- (i) Investment of University Funds- delegation of powers thereof.

In terms of Clause 13 (viii) of the University Statute, the power to make investment of the University Funds has been vested with the Executive Council.

In view of the said provision prior approval of the Executive Council is required whenever any investment is proposed to be made. But this often results in the University not deriving full benefits from the profitable but time bound investment schemes floated by the Banks from time to time since the Executive Council does not meet frequently. It is therefore, proposed that the Executive Council may delegate power to the Vice-Chancellor for investment in profitable investments.

The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.

- (ii) Revival of the Post-Graduate Students' Union.

The Executive Council in its 24th meeting held on 3rd and 4th April 1981 had decided that the Post Graduate Studies' Union of the University stand suspended until further orders and until the Union has received Official recognition by the University. Herein it may be mentioned that although the PGSU was in existence from 1975 upto 1981 yet no Official recognition has been granted to it.

In the same meeting mentioned above, the Council had appointed a Committee to draft the constitution of the PGSU. The draft constitution was considered by the Council in its 30th meeting held 24th May, 1982. The Council in this meeting accepted the draft with some modification and authorised the Vice-Chancellor to finalise the draft and bring it into effect on a date suitable to the University. However, the modifications made by the Council on the draft constitution are not available in the records.

The PG Students have now revived the PGSU and have presented a number of demands which are placed at Annexure-'C'.

It is suggested that the PGSU may perhaps be formally constituted and for this purpose a Committee may perhaps be setup to prepare the constitution of the PGSU. In the meantime the PGSU may perhaps be set up on a Provisional basis and will function under the supervision of the DSW until it is formally constituted. As regards financial matters the same may perhaps be managed by the PGSU through the DSW who will liaise with the Finance Department. A copy of the draft constitution as considered by the Council in its 30th meeting and a copy of the constitution as submitted by the present PGSU are placed at Annexure-B & C respectively. The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.

We would like to bring to your notice the following matters :

1. Immediate opening of the Post Graduate Students' Union office: The office which has been closed after 1982, needs to be opened now since the new P.G.S.U. is formed. This requires action on your part take it up with the district administration for its opening.
2. Expansion of Intake capacity of students to various departments: To accomodate the increasing number of students seeking admission to the MA/MSc programmes, the various deppts. should be expanded as far as possible. Physical expansion of the departments being a time-taking matter, increasing the intake capacity in the deptts. by utilising the available resources to the maximum is called for. This is particularly possible with social science departments, which do not require laboratory facilities. Also, NEHU products should be given first preferences (as far as possible).
3. Appointment, selection of research scholars/students in projects under the university: Projects involving research work in the North East Region and being carried out by different departments of the university should select (qualified) candidates from NEHU and only in the absence of qualified candidates from the University, should the candidature of non-NEHU products be considered. A case in point is the selection of staff in the Social Forestry Support Office (SFSO). In this department, for the post of Research Associate (Permanent) no NEHU products were called for interview. However, some candidates from another university were called for the interview (and given appointment). In the case of Research Associate (temporary) post, without interview some NEHU students were given temporary appointment.

4. Students representation to Academic Council: In the past few years three students were selected as student representatives to the Executive Council, on the basis of their securing the highest aggregate marks in the honours examinations. However, since the PGSU (NEHU) has been revived, we request you to amend the selection (SR) procedure and allow 3 students chosen by the PGSU, to represent the students. It may be noted that untill 1982 (i.e. prior to the dissolving of the PGSU) the students were chosen by the PGSU. Thus we are asking for the original procedure, which lapsed along with the PGSU, to be revived/re-introduced.

5. For all advertisements regarding appointments in the teaching and non-teaching, projects etc. in NEHU, a copy should reach the office of the PGSU, well in advance so that concerned students can be informed of all such vacancies, which otherwise may be missed out by some candidates.

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AMENDED CONSTITUTION OF THE POST-GRADUATE STUDENTS' UNION,
SHILLONG CAMPUS

EMBLEM AND FLAG

The Union shall have an emblem and a flag.

The emblem shall be that of the University with the addition of : (1) the words "Post-Graduate Students' Union" written in a semi-circle on top, and (2) the word "Shillong" written on the bottom. The motto on the emblem of the University (i.e. "Rise up and build") shall be the motto of the Union.

The emblem of the Union shall be in the centre of the flag. The flag will be of silk material and its colour and size shall not be identical with the University flag.

ARTICLE I: AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

Clause 1. The North-Eastern Hill University Post-Graduate Students' Union (hereinafter to be referred to as the Union) shall strive to work for the welfare of its student community.

Clause 2. The Union shall strive to ensure that its members will contribute to the progress and development of society in general, and the region under the jurisdiction of the University in particular.

Clause 3. The Union shall strive to promote the identity, rights and duties of the student community.

Clause 4. The Union shall provide a forum wherein students can freely express their views provided that do not conflict with the rules and regulations of the University and state.

Clause 5. The Union may maintain fraternal relations with similar Unions of Post-graduate students at the other campuses of the University.

ARTICLE II: MEMBERSHIP

Clause 1. All post-graduate students of the University at the Shillong Campus, shall be members of the Union.

Clause 2. Every member of the Union shall pay membership fee of Rs.10 per annum which shall be collected by the University at the commencement of each Academic year.

ARTICLE III: STRUCTURE OF THE UNION

Clause 1. The Union shall consist of the general body and the students council.

ARTICLE IV: THE GENERAL BODY

Clause 1. The General Body shall consist of all the members of the Union.

5.8.2 (5A)

Clause 2. The General Body shall be the highest body of the Union.

Clause 3. Decisions of the General Body shall be by a simple $2/3$ majority of those present and voting.

Clause 4. The quorum for a meeting of the General Body shall be two thirds ($2/3$) of the total members of the General Body.

Clause 5. The meeting of the General Body may be convened by giving a notice to the President by $1/5$ of the total General Body membership. However, any of the member of the General Body is at liberty to request at any time any agenda included in the requisition letter to be taken up with the permission of the Chair.

Clause 6. The General Body meeting must be held within 14 days from the date of receipt of requisition of the General Body to hold such a meeting duly signed by $1/5$ of the total membership.

Clause 7. The General Body shall meet at least once in each semester.

ARTICLE V: THE STUDENTS' COUNCIL

Clause 1. The Students' Council shall consist of student representatives elected one from each academic department of the University.

Clause 2. The Students' Council shall act the Executive Body of the entire student community of the University.

Clause 3. The Students' Council shall elect one President, one Vice-President, one General Secretary, 2 Joint Secretaries (of whom atleast one shall be a lady), and one Treasurer. This will be an office bearers of the Student Union and they shall function along with the other members of the Student Council as the Executive.

Clause 4. The Students Council shall meet at least twice in every semester.

Clause 5. The President shall convene the meetings of the Students' Council. The agenda for such a meeting will be decided by the President in consultation with the office bearers. However, any member of the student's Council shall have the right of suggest items for inclusion in the agenda for such a meeting.

Clause 6. The notification convening an ordinary meeting of the Students' Council shall be issued at least four days before the scheduled date of the meeting. However, an emergency meeting of the Students' Council may be convened with a notice of at least 12 hours. The decision as to whether a meeting of the Students' Council is an emergency meeting or not shall be taken by the President and the office bearers.

Clause 7. The President shall have to convene a meeting of the Students' Council if one-third ($1/3$) of its members requisition, in writing, such a meeting. The agenda for such a meeting shall be as specified by the requisitionists. Such a meeting shall be convened in the manner specified in Clause 6.

Clause 8. The quorua for all meetings of the Students' Council (ordinary or emergency) shall be one third ($1/3$) of its total membership.

Clause 9. All decisions of the Students' Council shall be by a simple majority of those present and voting.

Clause 10. Any member of the Students' Council who fails to attend three consecutive meetings of the Council without assigning valid reasons for such absence may be asked to vacate his seat by the office bearers, provided he is given a fair chance to give his reasons for his non attendance.

ARTICLE VII: THE PRESIDENT

Clause 1. There shall be a President of the Union; elected by the members of the Students' Council, voting as an Electoral College. He/She shall be the Head of the Union.

Clause 2. The President shall preside over all meetings of the General Body, and the Students' Council.

Clause 3. In all meetings over which he/she presides, the President shall not vote, in case of a tie, however, the President may exercise the right of casting vote.

Clause 4. The President shall endeavour to ensure that the aims and objectives of the Union are realised, and that the constitution of the Union is upheld and respected.

Clause 5. The tenure of the President shall be one academic year. Any President elected during an academic year to fill an interim vacancy shall hold office till the end of that particular academic year.

Clause 6. The President shall be over all responsible for:

- a) The day-to-day functioning of the Union.
- b) Co ordination of the work of the Student Council.
- c) Delegation of responsibilities, in consultation with General Secretary, to the members of the Students' Council.

ARTICLE VIII: THE VICE-PRESIDENT

Clause 1. There shall be a Vice-President of the Union

ARTICLE IX: THE GENERAL SECRETARY

Clause 1. The General Secretary shall be responsible for:

- a) Maintenance of the Minutes of the meetings of the General Body and the Students' Council.
- b) Correspondence of the Union.
- c) Presenting to the Students' Council at every ordinary meeting, a report on the activities of the Union and of the Students' Council.
- d) Maintenance of the office, and records of the Union.

Clause 2. The tenure of the General Secretary shall be one academic year. Any person elected General Secretary during an academic year to fill an interim vacancy shall hold office only till the end of that particular academic year.

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ARTICLE X: JOINT SECRETARY

Clause 1. The duties and functions of the Joint Secretaries will be specified by the President in consultation with the General Secretary.

ARTICLE XI: TREASURER

Clause 1. The Treasurer will maintain a complete record of accounts of all monies receipt and paid up and present the same to the University for audit, at the end of the academic year.

Clause 2. The Treasurer will be directly responsible for seeing that money spent are directly in accordance with those sanction by the Students' Council and are in conformity with the procedure laid down by the University.

ARTICLE XII: ELECTIONS TO STUDENTS' COUNCIL

Clause 1. The elections of the representatives from each academic department will be conducted by the University authorities not later than 2 months from the dates of closure of admission in all departments.

ARTICLE VIII: THE VICE-PRESIDENT

ARTICLE IX: THE GENERAL SECRETARY

CONSTITUTION OF THE POST-GRADUATE STUDENTS' UNION
NORTHEASTERN HILL UNIVERSITY
SHILLONG CAMPUS

P R E A M B L E

We, the Post-Graduate students of NEHU, Shillong Campus do hereby solemnly constitute the Post-Graduate Students' union to secure to all its member a healthy fraternity and to foster the spirit of unity and oneness amongst ourselves; to safeguard the common welfare of the University; do hereby adopt and ordain this constitution on this day the 29th of April, 1991.

ARTICLE-IAIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- Clause 1. The North eastern Hill University Post Graduate Students' Union(hereinafter to be referred to as PGSU) shall strive to work for the welfare of the student community of Post-graduate students and research scholars.
- Clause 2. The PGSU shall strive to ensure that its member will contribute to the progress and development of the University in general, and the region under the jurisdiction of the University in particular.
- Clause 3. The PGSU shall provide a common platform wherein students can freely express their views about academic advancement and general welfare of the students community on condition that they do not conflict with the rules, regulations and statutes of the University.
- Clause 4. The PGSU may maintain fraternal relations with similar Unions of other Universities.

ARTICLE -IIMEMBERSHIP

- Clause 1. All the post-graduate students and research scholars of the University at the Shillong Campus, shall be members of the PGSU.
- Clause 2. Every member of the PGSU shall pay membership fee of Rs.10/- per annum which shall be collected by the PGSU at the commencement of each academic year.

Contd/.../-

ARTICLE-IIISTRUCTURE OF THE PGSU

- Clause 1. The PGSU shall consist of General Body, Students Representatives and the Executive Committee.
- Clause 2. (a) The General Body shall consist of all the members of the PGSU
 (b) Decisions of the General Body shall be by a $2/3$ majority of the members present and voting.
 (c) The quorum for a meeting of the General Body shall be $1/3$ rd of the total members of the General Body.
- Clause 3. (a) There shall be two representatives elected from each Academic Department of the University.
 (b) The Students Representatives shall be duly elected by their respective department under the supervision of the PGSU.
 (c) The Students Representatives will be the medium through which problems and needs of their respective department is brought to the attention of the PGSU Executive For appropriate action.
 (d) It shall be the duty of the General Secretary to convene a meeting of the Students Representatives if $1/3$ rd of its members requisition in writing for such a meeting. The agenda for such a meeting shall be as specified by the requisitionist.
 (e) The quorum for all meetings of the Students Representatives (ordinary or emergency) shall be $1/2$ of its total membership.
 (g) All decisions of the Students Representatives and the Executive Committee shall be by simple majority of those present and voting.
- Clause 4. (a) All the elected office-members and the three appointees for the post of President, General Secretary and Finance Secretary shall constitute the Executive Committee.

Contd/.../-

- (b) The General Body shall be the supreme body of the PGSU.
- (c) It shall be the duty of the General Secretary to convene the meeting of the Executive Committee.
- (d) The required quorum for the meeting of the Executive Committee shall be 2/3rd of its members.
- (e) All decisions of the Executive Committee shall be by simple majority of those present and voting.

ARTICLE-IV

POWER AND FUNCTIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Clause 1. PRESENT

- (a) The President shall be the Chief Executive Head of the PGSU and shall have the power to advise any member of the Executive Committee.
- (b) The President shall have the power to summon, preside over and prorogue any meetings of the Executive Committee or Studies' Representatives or General Body.
- (c) The President can in consultation with the Executive Committee, accept/reject the resignation tendered in writing by any of the Executive Committee members.
- (d) In all cases of ties the President shall cast his/her vote to settle the same.
- (e) The President shall be entitled to a discretionary sanction of Rs. 500/- (Rupees Five Hundred only) to meet any emergency requirements.

Clause 2. VICE-PRESIDENT

- (a) He/she shall aide and assist the President in all the PGSU activities.
- (b) In the absence/resignation of the President, the Vice-President shall assume the office as 'de facto' President till a new President is elected.

Clause 3. GENERAL SECRETARY

- (a) The Secretary shall be responsible for maintenance of the minutes of the meeting of the Executive Committee, students Representative and the General Body.
- (b) Correspondence on behalf of the PGSU.
- (c) Presenting to the Students Representative at every ordinary meeting, a report on the activities of the PGSU and of the Students Representative.
- (d) Maintenance of the Office and records of the PGSU.

Clause 4. ASSISTANT GENERAL SECRETARY

- (a) He/She shall assist the General Secretary in the execution of his official duties.

Contd/.../-

- (b) In the absence/resignation of the General Secretary, the Assistant General Secretary shall assume the office as 'de facto' General Secretary till a new General Secretary is elected.

Clause 5. FINANCE SECRETARY

- (a) He/She shall maintain strict financial accounts of PGSU.
- (b) No money shall be released without the signature and seal of the Finance Secretary.
- (c) The Finance Secretary shall have the power to raise the PGSU's funds in consultation of the Executive Committee.
- (d) The Finance Secretary shall present a record of accounts of all money receipts, incomes, expenditure and balances to the University for audit fifteen days before the expiry of the tenure.
- (e) In the absence/resignation of the Finance Secretary the powers and functions delegated thereof to the Finance Secretary shall be assumed by the President and the General Secretary in a joint effort till a new Finance Secretary is elected.

Clause 6. TREASURER

- (a) He/She shall be responsible for safe custody of the PGSU funds.
- (b) He/She shall release the PGSU funds only under the joint signatures and seals of either the President and Finance Secretary or General Secretary and Finance Secretary.

Clause 7. GAMES AND SPORTS SECRETARY

- (a) He/She shall be responsible for promotion of games and sports of the PGSU and shall take initiative in organising any sport events in representing the University.

Clause 8. PUBLICITY SECRETARY

- (a) He/She shall be responsible for the circulation of information and wide publicity of such matters relating to the activities and affairs of the PGSU.

Clause 9. CULTURAL SECRETARY

- (a) He/She shall be responsible for the promotion of cultural interests and activities such as would highlight the cultural attitudes of the various communities coming from different regions.

Clause 10. DEBATING SECRETARY

- (a) He/She shall be responsible for initiation and conducting of debates, quiz and extempore competitions and development of interest and participation by the students in such activities in the University and elsewhere.

Clause 11. ORGANISING SECRETARIES

- (a) He/She shall be responsible for organising any social function and social gathering as and when decided by the PGSU.
- (b) To motivate and mobilise the student community to co-operate and participate and support any activity of the PGSU that may call for prompt action against devious forces that would otherwise harm, mutilate or corrupt the good office and the name of the PGSU and the University in general.

Clause 12. EDITOR

- (a) It shall be the duty of the Editor to publish the Union's magazine the bulletins.

Clause 13. ASSISTANT EDITORS

- (a) He/She shall assist the Editors in matters relating to publication and circulation of magazine and bulletins.

Clause 14. ACADEMIC SECRETARY

- (a) He/She shall look after the academic interests of the students.

ARTICLE - V

TENURE

Clause 1. The tenure of the Executive Committee shall be one academic year. The new Executive Committee shall assume office within three days of the declaration of the results of their election.

Clause 2. The tenure of the Students' Representative shall be one academic year. The old representative shall cease to function from the date the new representative assumes office.

ARTICLE - VI

ELECTIONMANUAL

Clause 1. The three main posts viz., the President, General Secretary and Finance Secretary shall be appointed from the three constituent States of this University on a rotation basis for a term of one year.

- Clause 2. The members of the PGSU shall elect the remaining posts on the basis of popular or open Election.
- Clause 3. All nominations filed shall be duly signed and countersigned by the person nominating, by the person seconding the nomination and the nominee.
- Clause 4. In the event of nominations for the post not being filed at the cut point of time, any member of the PGSU may nominate any member of the PGSU, who on being duly seconded shall fill the vacancy.
- Clause 5. All the voting of the election shall be by secret ballot.
- Clause 6. Each office bearer shall be declared elected on a simple majority basis.

ARTICLE - VII

ELECTION COMMISSION

- Clause 1. The election commission will comprise Dean of Students' Welfare, as Chairman, Director of Sports, two teachers and three outgoing members of the Executive Committee.
- Clause 2. All notification regarding the Elections shall be made by the Election Commission.

ARTICLE - VIII

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES TO THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL & ACADEMIC COUNCIL

- Clause 1. Two student representatives to the Executive Council shall be the nominee of the PGSU.
- Clause 2. Two student representatives to the Academic Council shall be the nominee of the PGSU.
- Clause 3. Two PGSU representatives shall be present as a silent observer in each departmental admission interview of students.
- Clause 4. Five students representative to the Court.

ARTICLE - X

AMENDMENTS

- Clause 1. Any proposal to amend the Articles should first be considered by the Executive Committee.
- Clause 2. After consideration of the proposal, the Executive Committee shall place it in the next General Body meeting along with its recommendations.
- Clause 3. A motion to amend the Articles should be passed by a 2/3rd of the members of the General Body present and voting.

ARTICLE - IX

IMPEACHMENT

Clause 1. Any member of the General Body will be impeached by a 2/3rd majority of the Executive Committee members present and voting if he/she is found indulging in anti-PGSU activities.

ARTICLE - XI

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Clause 1. The Finance Secretary shall make a written request for release of funds indicating the amount required and certifying that it is in accordance with the budget, to the Dean of Students' Welfare, who shall be the sanctioning authority.

Clause 2. The General Secretary shall forward to the Dean of Students' Welfare, or in his absence such persons as may be incharged, copies of all correspondence with the University.

EMBLEM AND FLAG OF THE PGSU

The emblem shall be that of the University with the addition of :

- (1) The words "Post-Graduate Students" Union" written in a semi-circle on top, and (2) the word "Shillong" written on the bottom. The motto on the emblem of the University (i.e. "Rise Up and Build") shall be the motto of the PGSU.

Flag (description): The colour of the flag will be light blue, emblem and wording in black, and will be of silk material. The emblem of the PGSU shall be in the centre of the flag.

- ii) Representation of Dr.(Mrs) Debjani Roy
with regards to Faculty Selection

The representation of Dr(Mrs) D. Roy, Lecturer, Institute of Self Organising Systems and Bio-Physics addressed to the Chairman, Executive Council, relates to a certain provision made in the University advertisements which reads as under :-

" Candidates applying for higher post in any department/ centre may be considered for a lower post at the discretion of the University".

According to her the above provisions takes away her chances for future promotions and job opportunity.

The argument put forward by her is as under :-

A candidate who applied for the post of Professor if found not suitable for the post but considered for a lower post (say that of a Reader) then her promotion opportunity is taken away.

This perhaps is true because she may have the experience, qualifications etc. for the post of Reader and which if the University had advertised she may have had the opportunity to apply and even got herself selected. Thus it transpires from the representation of Dr(Mrs) Roy that her apprehension is that a person who is called for interview for the post of Professor may be recommended as Reader by invoking the above mentioned provisions .

The provisions mentioned above is perhaps not very clear & there is chances to interpret the said provision as conceived by Dr(Mrs) Roy.

But the idea is that a person who applies for the post of Professor may not necessarily be called for interview for the said post but he may be considered to be called for interview for the post of Reader in case there is a post of Reader advertised and the Screening Committee finds the candidate not suitable to be called for interview for the post of Professor. And the said provision is limited upto this point only.

If a person is called for interview for the post of Professor it is the duty of the Selection Committee to see if that person is suitable or not for the said post. Recommending a person for a lower post instead, perhaps does not arise especially when no such posts is

In view of the above, in the absence of an advertisement perhaps there is no ground for Dr(Mrs) D.Roy to have apprehension as per her understanding so long as the University takes the interpretation of the said provisions made in the advertisement as indicated above.

According to her the above provisions takes away the chances for future promotions and job opportunity.

The argument put forward by her is as under :-
A candidate who applied for the post of Professor is found not suitable for the post but considered for a lower post (say that of a Reader) then her promotion opportunity is taken away.

This perhaps is true because she may have the experience, qualifications etc. for the post of Reader and which if the University had advertised she may have had the opportunity to apply and even get herself selected. Thus the argument from the representation of Dr(Mrs) Roy that her apprehension is that a person who is called for interview for the post of Professor may be recommended as Reader by invoking the above mentioned provisions.

The provisions mentioned above in perhaps not very clear & there is a chance to interpret the said provision as provided by Dr(Mrs) Roy.

But the idea is that a person who applied for the post of Professor may not necessarily be called for interview for the said post but he may be considered to be called for interview for the post of Reader in case there is a post of Reader advertised and the governing committee finds the candidate not suitable to be called for interview for the post of Professor. And the said provision is limited upto this point only.

If a person is called for interview for the post of Professor it is the duty of the Selection Committee to see if that person is suitable or not for the said post. Recommending a person for a lower post instead, perhaps does not seem especially clear as such posts

Respected Sir,

Most humbly and respectfully I would like to lay down the following few lines for favour of your kind consideration and judicious action in respect of the facts narrated here-in-below which to the best of my knowledge and sincere belief is nothing less than violation of natural justice and denying^{ing} of equal job opportunity in true sense and terms of employment and its prospect thereof.

That Sir, your official advertisement No. 1-60/ESTT-II/90-6966 dated 30th November 1990 and subsequent Advertisement No. 1-63/Estt/11/91-8199 dated 04th Feb 1991 for appointment of teaching and non teaching posts in different department/centres of the North Eastern Hill University has taken me to surprise in as much as that the aforesaid two advertisement appears to have^{been} suffering from gross irregularities and partisan view of favouralism.

That Sir, I joined in your university in the Institute of self Organising system and Bio-physics in the year 1986 and since then in continuous uninterrupted service in the said department with best of my ability, sincerity and unblemished record of service. It would not^{be} out of place to mention here my bio data to establish my better claim to hold subsequent higher post as a matter of right and service benefit, which is enclosed herewith as Annexure I.

That Sir, by virtue of my service and ability I verily believe and uphold that under all prudence and fairness I am legally entitled, eligible to be selected for next higher post of reader as and when such vacancy arises and advertised for, if not, otherwise, besides my qualification and aptitude I am found unaccountable for.

But as ill luck would have it, your aforesaid two advertisements have distinctly put an impediment in my future promotion and has shattered all scope of the same, thereby destroying all hope of my service benefit and future prospect.

That Sir, the stipulation as provided in your aforesaid two advertisements particularly the stipulation which I quote " Candidates applying for higher post in any department/ centre may be considered for a lower post at the discretion of the University" is wide enough to take away the right of future promotions and job opportunity of others. As for example, assuming that the candidate applied for the post of a professor if found not suitable for the post in any department and therefore considered for the lower post as that of a Reader at your so called discretion, then promotion opportunity of the person eligible for appointment of a reader which I claim to be, becomes remote and shattered in these days of scarce opportunity. Such a discretionary power not only ^{is} illegal but highly violative of all norms and principles of natural justice. Scope given to one cannot be termed as scope denied to others. Natural justice demands equal scope and opportunity to all and exercise of discretionary power violating the norms and principles of all procedure and natural justice is a colourable exercise of power not vested according to rules and regulations prescribed for proper administration of the affairs of the University.

That Sir, the aforesaid discretionary power is to be exercised for consideration of lower posts of the candidate applied for a higher post, when no other suitable person is found eligible to hold the lower post and after proper effort made in this regard and that too after proper advertisement. When suitable contending person exists for a particular post, not duly advertised for, any appointment of a candidate applied for a higher post in the name of discretionary power would be

It is highly improper in as much as no scope is given to other suitable contending persons to prove their responsibility and eligibility. Such a procedure if adopted will create a bad precedent at the cost of all employees of the University at large and all benefit of promotion and future prospect would be limited and confined to a narrow sphere.

That Sir, had the post of a reader was advertised for, I would have definitely applied for the same but in absence of such advertisement for protection of my interest in the service, I am left with no other alternative but to prefer this appeal to you for your kind consideration under your reserved discretionary power as stipulated in your said two advertisements that "the University reserves the right to negotiate with suitable person who may not have applied formally", in the event of consideration of reader post of any candidate applied for the post of professor.

That Sir, being the ex-officio chairman of the Executive Council, you are in duty bound to see that the Statute, the Ordinance, the Regulations and all affairs thereof are duly observed and to ensure all necessary endeavour in observance of the same, including all appointment and matter ancillary thereto for upliftment of healthy atmosphere in the institution and all around prosperity and development and hence through this my appeal, I would like to accelerate your co-operation and necessary action into the matter, which I hereby do and sincerely hope will not be wasted to bring any fruitful desired action.

In the circumstances, it is therefore requested that you may be graciously pleased to take note of the matter stated

herein above and extend your kind
action for redressal of my grievences,
after proper inquiry into the matter
and to do all other d needful action
which you deem fit and proper to do
so and for which act of kindness as
in duty bound shall ever/pray.

viii) Request of Dr.V.B.Sharma, Reader in Animal Husbandry, SASRD for grant of 2 year EOL.

Dr.V.B.Sharma, Reader in Animal Husbandry, SASRD has applied for 2 years Extra-Ordinary Leave to enable him to join an assignment as Reader in the Chitrakut Gramodaya Vishwavidyala, Chitrakut(MP).

The Dean, SASRD while forwarding the application has not given any specific recommendations whether to grant the leave or not, but stated that at present there is only one teacher on study leave from this institution and that the case be considered in accordance with the Ordinances of NEHU.

In this connection, it may be stated that the application of Dr.V.B.Sharma was not forwarded by the University.

Moreover, the new post which he has been offered is an equivalent one.

In earlier cases teachers who were selected for equivalent posts were required to resign, viz:

1. Dr.V.Xaxa of Sociology Department, NEHU, Shillong.
2. Dr.S.J.George of Political Science Department, NEHU, Shillong.
3. Dr.J.P.Gaur of Botany Department, NEHU, Shillong.

In view of the above it will appear that there is no scope of granting Extra-Ordinary leave to Dr.V.B.Sharma but he may have to resign.

The relevant NEHU Ordinances on grant of Extra-Ordinary leave reads as under :-

" The application for such leave shall be sent through the Dean of the School concerned and the letter shall give his recommendations taking into account the strength of the teaching staff for the particular subject. Except in very special cases, at not time more than 20% of the strength of the teachers on rools of a centre shall be allowed to be absent from the Centre on extra-ordinary leave, study leave and / or sabbatical leave.

In Animal Husbandry, SASRD, we have only the following teachers.

1. Dr.V.B.Sharma, Reader and 2. Shri.Saket Bhusan, Lecturer.

Appointment of Prof.P.C.Dutta
in the Department of Anthro-
pology as Visiting Professor.

In October 1990, a letter from Prof.A.P.Sinha Head Deptt. of Anthropology, was received requesting that Dr.P.C.Dutta be given a contract appointment as Professor with the understanding that, (a) the appointment will be against the vacancy of Professor which has been advertised and (b) the appointment will continue till this post has been filled.

From the letter of A.P.Sinha it is understood that Dr.Dutta was already a Visiting Professor for one ^{year} term which expired on 26.9.90.

The matter was put up by the office and the proposal was to appoint him as Visiting Fellow for a period of six months. At that time two Professor's post were vacant (vice Prof.B.N.Saraswati & Prof, P.K.Misra who were both on deputation). It was decided that Dr.Dutta be given appointment with effect from the Academic Session 1991 as the academic session 1990 was almost over at that time. This was conveyed to Dr.A.P.Sinha.

Offer was given to Dr.P.C.Dutta in February, 1991 for appointment as Visiting Fellow in the Professor's pay scale of Rs.4500-150-5700-200-7300/-, for a period of six months. Dr.Dutta accepted the offer and assumed charge with effect from March 11, 1991.

Since the scale offered was in the Professor's grade, he was appointed as Visiting Professor for a period of six months with effect from 11.3.91 and his pay and allowances are regulated according to the Govt.of India guidelines relating to fixation of pay of re-employed pensioners.

The matter is placed before the Council for ratification.

Item No: _____ AGENDA NOTE FOR E.C.

Subject: Upgradation of pay scale of Senior Technical Assistants.

At Annexure 'A' is a representation submitted by Sr. Technical Assistants with regard to upgradation pay scale from Rs. 550-900/- (PR) / Rs. 1640 -2900(R) to Rs. 650-1200(PR)/ Rs.2000-3500/- (Revised).

71st. The said upgradation of pay scale was decided by the EC in its meeting vide Resolution No. EC:71:91:6:06(v) dated 18.3.91 (Annexure 'B') in which the Sr. Technical Assistants have made the following observations for consideration:-

- (i) The effective date of 18.3.91 for upgradation of pay scales does not confer any financial benefits to those STAs who have rendered more than 5 years of service. Hence, the effective date may be revised as 1.1.'86 at least, the date on which the Fourth Pay Commission recommended the revision of pay scales.
- (ii) Some of posts of STA be upgraded to that of Jr. Technical Officer/Jr. Scientific Officer in the scale of Rs. 2000-3500/ (Revised) in order to accommodate the STAs who have completed 3 years of service with post graduate qualifications and those STAs who have completed 5 years of service with graduate qualifications.

With regard to the request at (i) above, it may be pointed out that as the E.C. did not specify the effective date for implementation of the same, the date the E.C. passed the Resolution i.e, 18.3.91 was taken to be the effective date.

Regarding(ii) above, it may be recalled that the E.C. vide its Resolution No. EC:68:90:6:06(x) dated 30.3.1990 read with Resolution No. 69:90:6:06(ii) dated 28.6.90 had decided to implement the Interim Promotion/Recruitment Policy for some cadres which inter-alia includes Laboratory service vide Annexure 'C' wherein it was laid down that the STAs on completion of 5 years service as STAs shall be eligible for promotion to fill up some of the posts of Jr. Scientific Officer in the pay scale of Rs. 2000-3500/- on the basis of their seniority-cum-fitness.

The above matter is placed before the E.C. for re-consideration. However, while making decision on(i) above, the E.C. may also kindly decide whether the said upgradation of pay scale will be personal to the present incumbents only or it may be made applicable to future appointees also.

Sub: Upgradation of pay scales of STA's.

Sir,

We would like to call your attention to the order No.15-3/CRC/91-720 dt. 6/5/91, resolving the case of upgradation of the scales of STA,s from Rs.550-900 to Rs.650-1200 w.e.f. 18/3/91.

It appears from the above that the long standing demands of the STA,s and the many discussions held with the authorities have not been taken into account while resolving the case. In this context the points which we would like to reiterate are as under:-

1. By implementing the upgradation w.e.f. 18.3.91., as per the order No. F. 15-3/CRC/91-720. dt. 6.5.91., the beneficiaries have very little benefits especially those who have been in service for more than five years. Hence the effective date should be from 19.2.83, the date which was made effective for Section Officer's of our University. However, if it is not feasible, atleast the effective date with effect from 1/1/86 (Revised) may kindly be considered.
2. While upgrading the pay-scale it may also be considered to upgrade some post of STA to Junior Technical-Officer based on the following criterion.

- (i) Those having served for three years with M.A./M.Sc.] degree.
- (ii) Five years for those having graduate qualifications.

Item 2. above has been proposed considering the resolution of 71st EC meeting whereby they have upgraded the scales of STA's from Rs. 550 - 900/- to Rs. 650 - 1200/- irrespective of seniority and qualifications vide EC resolution No.EC:71:91:6:06:9v dt 18.3.91. We would like to point out that the post of STA's are filled with personnel having qualifications ranging from pre-university with diplomas to Ph.D.'s. It is therefore, only rational to give due credence to the years of service and their qualifications by upgrading the post to Junior Technical Officer.

We hope that the authorities will give due consideration to the points made above.
