

MODERATION BOARD FOR RESULTS

i) As of today the following sequence of practices are being followed with regard to finalization of results for PG courses:-

- a) On completion of the tabulation processes by the Office, the same are sent to the concerned Deans for comments and approval.
- b) On receipt of these materials by the Dean he/she constitutes a concerned Departmental Committee to go through the results for approval or comments, if any.
- c) The Dean then forwards his/her final comments, if any, on the result which are subsequently placed to the University Moderation Board as and when it meets.
- d) The University Moderation Board for results, which consists of the VC and all the Deans, is then convened at an opportune time, to finally moderate and approve the results or otherwise.
- e) Thereupon the results are finalized and declared.

The University has been following the above procedure for finalization of PG results since last few years because such was the provision of the Ordinance which had to be adhered to.

The above practices have been experienced to be cumbersome and could have been one of the reasons why the results may be delayed.

Having gone through the system for some years, a proposal is made that the concerned Ordinance be modified and the practices be amended as follows:-

- a) On the completion of the tabulation processes by the Office, the same could be continued to be sent to the Dean for approval or comments.
- b) The Dean could continue to constitute a Committee at the Departmental level that could go through the tabulated results and approve the same or offer necessary comments, if any, as may be deemed fit.
- c) The Dean could give final comments and send to the Office for processing further.

- d) The Office could put up the same to the VC, the comments made by the Department and the Dean along with the comments of the Office for necessary orders or approval.
- e) On the approval of the Vice-Chancellor the results could be finalized and declared without further need of convening the University Moderation Board for results which consists of the Vice-Chancellor and all the Deans.

The above procedure is suggested in view of the following:-

- a) Since the results are already required to be approved by the Department and the concerned Dean, it is perhaps a superfluous exercise to have the same reapproved by the Deans.
- b) The Deans are also teachers having their teaching commitments and may not be necessarily available all times for such meetings.
- c) It has been further experienced that especially during break (Holidays) most of the Deans are not available for such meetings and sometimes none, requiring the office to defer the approval of such results to later days, leading to delays.
- d) Because of the scatter of Campuses calling all the Deans frequently hamper the teaching in the Departments.

It is therefore, proposed that the existing Ordinance on Moderation of PG results may be amended as proposed below:-

Existing

5. There shall be a Moderation Board to moderate the results of the end-semester examinations in each subject and it shall consist of:

- (i) Vice-Chancellor
(ii) Dean of all the Schools of Studies.

6. The Board shall scrutinize the statistics of results prepared by the Tabulators and moderate the same, if need be, before the declaration/publication of results.

Proposed

Ordinarily on the basis of the recommendation of the Department and the concerned Dean the VC shall approve each result before their declaration/publication.

There shall be a Moderation Board consisting of Vice-Chancellor as the Chairman and all the Deans as Members, to moderate results, if need be, before the declaration/publication of the results.

In addition, it is also proposed that for the Under-Graduate results the existing provisions of Moderation Board may be made operative only when such need arises and hence the provisions may be read as if need be.

It may be stated that even in the existing Ordinance the limitation as if need be exists.

The Academic Council may consider the above for approval.

a) Since the results are already required to be approved by the Department and the concerned Dean, it is perhaps a superfluous exercise to have the same approved by the Deans.

b) The Deans are also teachers having their teaching commitment and may not be necessarily available all times for such meetings.

c) It has been further experienced that especially during break (Holidays) most of the Deans are not available for such meetings and sometimes none, requiring the office to defer the approval of such results to later days, leading to delays.

d) Because of the scatter of campuses calling all the Deans frequently hamper the teaching in the departments.

It is therefore, proposed that the existing Ordinance on Moderation of PG results may be amended as proposed below:-

Proposed

Existing

Ordinarily on the basis of the recommendation of the department and the concerned Dean the VC shall approve each result before their declaration/publication.

2. There shall be a Moderation Board to moderate the results of the end-semester examinations in each subject and it shall consist of:
(i) Vice-Chancellor
(ii) Dean of all the Schools of Studies.

There shall be a Moderation Board consisting of Vice-Chancellor as the Chairman and all the Deans as members. to moderate results, if need be, before the declaration/publication of the results.

6. The Board shall scrutinize the statistics of results prepared by the Tribunal and moderate the same, if need be, before the declaration/publication of results.

- ii) : On the Paper Setter/Moderator of Under-Graduate Examination - Proposal for modification thereof.

The Regulation - RC-10 of the NEHU Ordinance deals with the mode of appointment of Paper Setter/Examiners/Moderators of under-graduate examinations.

The regulation aforesaid, vide clause I, provides the following :

- 1.(1) The Board of Under-Graduate Studies in each subject shall draw a panel of Paper-Setters/Examiners/Moderators in the month of March on every alternate year and forwards the same to the Vice-Chancellor, who shall appoint the Paper Setter/Examiner/Moderators for a period of two years. While drawing the panel, the Chairman of the Board shall take into consideration the confidential aspect of the assignment so as to make it fool proof. Criteria for recommending the names of paper-setter/moderators shall be as follows :

- (2) In exceptional circumstances, however, the Vice-Chancellor may relax the condition regarding experience.

Moderator :

There shall be a Moderation Board appointed by the Vice-Chancellor for each paper-subject for a period of one year.

The Board shall consist of :

- i) Chairman, Board of Under-Graduate Studies or any senior teacher in the subject, recommended by the Chairman.
- ii) One teacher in the subject concerned.
- iii) One expert in the subject concerned from outside the University to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor.

At present, the University is only dealing with the BA/BSC/BCOM examinations, since the Pre-University examinations has been taken over by the Meghalaya/Mizoram Board of Education. Hence, the criteria as laid down in the relevant ordinance for paper-setter in regard to Pre-University need to be deleted.

On the other hand, the criteria laid down for paper-setter for BA/BSC/BCOM need to be modified and composition of Moderation Board need to enlarge. This is felt necessary in view of the introduction of various new professional courses, at the Degree level.

In addition, the number of optional papers being offered at the Honours level have been increased by many fold with the introduction of **Three** Years Integrated Degree Course since 1994.

It has been experienced that the paper-setters, appointed from outside this University, rarely accept the assignment particularly for the professional oriented courses, such as Computer Science, Mass Communication & Video Production, Bio-Technology etc. On the other hand, the University neither offer any Post-Graduate courses for the aforesaid subject.

As a result, the University has to take recourse to college teachers, who again by teaching experience may not conform the criteria of paper setters and as a result the department concerned has to face immense problem in order to tide over the situation. In view of this, it is felt necessary to relax the teaching experience for purpose of paper setting and the Chairman, BUGS while drawing the panel, may include the names of teachers from the University Department, outside the University system and teachers from the affiliated college of NEHU as well.

On the other hand, similar problems are also being faced with regard to Moderation Board. The composition of Moderation Board, as emphasised in the said regulation, does not justify to moderate the question papers which run out to 30 to 40 papers in certain subjects. Therefore, the composition of the Moderation Board needs to be enlarged.

Considering the above aspects, it is imperative to amend the said regulation and the proposed amendment is accordingly placed below at Annexure - I & II for consideration of the Council.

UNDER-GRADUATE EXAMINATIONS

MODERATION

Existing Provision

- i) There shall be a Moderation Board appointed by the Vice-Chancellor for each paper-subject for a period of one year.

Amendment Proposed

- i) There shall be a Moderation board appointed by the Vice-Chancellor for each paper-subject for a period of two years.

Justification

In terms of regulation RC-10 vide Clause 1(i) it provides that the Chairman, Board of Under-Graduate Studies shall draw a panel of Paper Setter/Moderators and forward the same to the Vice-Chancellor, who shall appoint the Paper-Setters/Moderators for a period of two years. Hence, the concerned clause need to be amended accordingly, that is moderators to be appointed for a period of two years instead of one year.

The Board shall consist of :

- i) Chairman, Board of Under-Graduate Studies or any senior teacher in the subject, recommended by the Chairman.

The Board shall consist of :

- i) Existing Provision.

ii) One teacher in the subject concerned

ii) One or two teacher(s) in the subject concerned from the Post-Graduate department/ Centre of the University.

iii) One expert in the subject concerned from outside the University to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor.

iii) At least two teachers in the subject concerned from the affiliated college(s) of the University/ One or two expert(s) in the subject concerned from outside the University to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor.

Since, the introduction of Three Years Degree Integrated Courses, the number of Compulsory including Optional papers, offered at the Under-Graduate level, have increased by manifold. Therefore, it is imperative to enlarge the Moderation Board so that more teachers can be involved for moderation purpose.

At least two teachers in the subject concerned from the affiliated college(s) of the University/ One or two expert(s) in the subject concerned from outside the University to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor.

TABULATION/FAKING AND TOPSHEETING
and ALLOTMENT OF SCRIPTS.

1. TABULATION

The tabulation of marks vis-a-vis preparation of results entail a lot of hard/complicated work and it demands thorough knowledge and skills to undertake such assignments. On occasions, the tabulators have to work continuously for hours together to complete the task in hand, which is time bound in nature and with the new examination system would invariably mean more work for the tabulators.

With the introduction of Part-I and II examination system, the tabulators, from this year, have to undertake uphill task to finalise the results of Part-I and for the repeaters and regular batch of students falling under the annual system of examination.

Considering above and as a token of appreciation to the tabulators, the rates of tabulation including writing of Mark-sheet may be enhanced from existing Rs.2.50 to Rs.5.00 per candidate.

2. FAKING AND TOPSHEETING

Faking and Topsheeting are the integral part of the evaluation process and this is followed in order to maintain confidentiality of the scripts. The scripts are sent to the evaluators after completing the process aforesaid which is again a time bound in nature.

Over the years, the rates of remuneration for Paper-Setting, evaluation etc. have been revised from time to time, but there has been no increase in the rates of Faking and Topsheeting.

It is therefore proposed that the existing rate of FIFTEEN PAISE for Faking and TEN PAISE for Topsheeting may be enhanced to THIRTY PAISE for Faking and TWENTY PAISE FOR Topsheeting respectively.

3. ALLOTMENT OF SCRIPTS

In addition, allotment of Scripts to the Examiner has acquired a serious damage with the increasing number of students, the number of optional papers and the decreasing trend of willing examiners. As a result, it has forced the University to find examiners beyond the jurisdiction of the University. With this multifacet problems, the need of increasing rate for allotment has been longdue. It is therefore, proposed that the existing rate of Rs.2000/- payable for allotment of scripts to different teachers may marginally be raised to Rs.3000/-

The following note is presented to justify our stand in the matter of recommendation.

1. Kamalanagar College is situated at Chawngte town, the district headquarters of chakma area, and it is a premier and lone College of the district.
2. Its geographical distance is 102 Km from Lunglei, the second largest town in the State, and there is only one approach road which is far from being a standard highway. The team, therefore, has the impression that the community would remain in quarantine isolation without intellectual development through better and higher educational facility.
3. All the teachers appointed by the college on regular/permanent basis are from outside the community of Chakma and they all obtained the required minimum marks but are not NET qualified except one.

4. "whereas the State of Mizoram has not yet insisted NET qualification as compulsory Condition of entry into a College teaching job owing to dire scarcity of NET qualified candidates, the inspection team is of the view that having NET qualified teachers in all the subjects is an impossibility and affiliation may not be denied on this ground.

In view of the above facts, it is recommended that Kamalanagar College be granted University affiliation with immediate effect.

UGC NOTIFICATION ON REVISION OF PAY SCALES, MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT OF TEACHERS IN UNIVERSITIES & COLLEGES AND OTHER MEASURES FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF STANDARDS, 1998.

The scheme of revision of pay scales, minimum qualifications for appointment, other service conditions of University and College Teachers, Librarians, Directors of Physical Education and Registrars of Universities as a measure for the maintenance of standards in higher education.

1.0.0 COVERAGE

1.1.0 The scheme applies to University and College Teachers, Librarians, Directors of Physical Education and Registrars of Universities (excluding Agricultural Universities), and Colleges (excluding Agricultural, Medical, and Veterinary Science Colleges) admitted to the privileges of the Universities unless they specifically exercise an option in writing to remain out of this scheme. However, the scheme will apply to the Teachers in the Faculty of Agriculture, Medicine and Veterinary Science in the Central Universities.

2.00 PAY SCALES

2.1.0 The revised scales of pay, as decided by the Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development (Department of Education) may be seen at Appendix-I.

2.2.0 Pay scales for academic staff of the Departments of Adult and Continuing Education, Women's Studies, Academic Staff Colleges and University Science Instrumentation Centre should be equivalent to those of the Teachers of the corresponding levels and they should have same designation and channel of promotion provided that they have equivalent qualifications.

3.0.0 RECRUITMENT AND QUALIFICATIONS

3.1.0 The direct recruitment to the post of Lecturers, Readers and Professors in the Universities and Colleges shall be on the basis of merit through all India advertisement and selections by the duly constituted Selection Committees to be set up under the Statutes/Ordinances of the concerned

university. Such Committees should have a minimum of three experts, the head of the concerned Department and the Principal of the concerned College (in case of selection of college teachers).

3.2.0 The minimum qualifications required for the post of Lecturers, Readers, Professors, Principals, Assistant Directors of Physical Education, Deputy Directors of Physical Education, Directors of Physical Education, Assistant Librarians, Deputy Librarians, Librarians, Assistant Registrars, Deputy Registrars and Registrars, will be those as prescribed by the University Grants Commission from time to time.

3.3.0 The minimum requirements of a good academic record 55% of the marks at the master's level and qualifying in the National Eligibility Test, or an accredited test, shall remain for the appointment of Lecturers. It would be optional for the University to exempt Ph.D holders from NET or to require NET, in their case, either as a desirable or essential qualification for appointment as Lecturers in the University Departments and Colleges. The minimum requirement of 55% should not be insisted upon for Professors, Readers, Registrars, Deputy Registrars, Librarians, Deputy Librarians, Directors of Physical Education, Deputy Directors of Physical Education for the existing incumbents who are already in the University system. However, these marks should be insisted upon for those entering the system from outside and those at the entry point of Lecturers, Assistant Registrars, Assistant Librarians, Assistant Director of Physical Education.

3.4.0 A relaxation of 5% may be provided, from 55% to 50% of the marks, at the master's level for the SC/ST category.

3.5.0 A relaxation of 5% may be provided, from 55% to 50% of the marks to the Ph.D degree holders who have passed their Master's degree prior to 19th Sept., 1991.

3.6.0 B in the 7 point scale with letter grades O, A, B, C, D, E & F shall be regarded as equivalent of 55% wherever the grading system is followed.

3.7.0 The Ph.D should continue to be a compulsory requirement for the designation of Reader. However, for other categories, like those of Registrars, Librarians and Physical Education Directors, the Ph.D should be a desirable and not an essential qualification.
