The School of Economics, Management and Information Sciences comprises of three departments and one centre namely: (i) The Department of Commerce (Shillong), (ii) The Department of Economics (HQ Shillong and Campus Department at Aizawl), (iii) The Department of Library and Information Sciences and (iv) The Centre for Adult and Continuing Education (Shillong). The departments offer Masters, MPhil and PhD degree programmes while the Centre is engaged in organising awareness programmes on adult literacy, population education, environmental education, health and hygiene programmes including consumers protection covering all the states in the North Eastern region.

The departments and the Centre in the School have been continuously adding to the reserve of skilled man power for the service of the nation in general and the NE region in particular. During the year of reference, the School has significantly augmented the body of knowledge by conducting research, organising seminars and administering awareness programmes on relevant issues.

Centre for Adult and Continuing Education

The Centre continued to engage itself during the year under report in numerous activities not only in the states of Meghalaya, Mizoram and Nagaland but also in other north-eastern states with a view to fulfilling its primary objective of creating awareness on important national issues at the grassroot level. These issues include Adult Total Literacy, Population Education, Environmental Education, Health and Hygiene, Nutrition, Drug Abuses, Women Studies, Skill Improvement Activities and Consumer's Protection. Department of Library & Information Sciences

During 1960s, libraries and information centres began to spring up in a number of institutions and organisations besides universities and colleges. Demand for trained library personnel increased. On the other hand, training facilities were available only at Gauhati University which was not in position to cope up with the needs of the region as a whole. North Eastern Hill University Library took cognizance of the problem in 1978 and realised that there was need for training on two levels, i.e., Professional and Semi-professional. Decision was taken to initiate the process first on the Semi-professional level. The idea received recognition from the University authorities. As a result of it, certificate course in Library Science of four months' duration was started by the NEHU Central Library under the auspices of the Centre for Continuing Education in 1979. It was a part-time course in the evening. The senior staff of the Library took it as a professional commitment and trained nearly 100 candidates from 1979 to 1982. This attempt on the part of the NEHU Central Library filled in a sizable gap on the Semi-professional level in the libraries of the North East. Encouraged by this attempt, a proposal was put up for the opening of the Department of Library and Information Science which was approved by the UGC in 1985 and this Department came up in 1986.
