

- (ii) Condonation of late submission of Home Town LTC - case of Dr. Aseem Sinha, Lecturer, Deptt. of Chemistry, Pachhunga Univ. College, Aizawl.

The Principal, Pachhunga University College, Aizawl, had allowed Dr. Aseem Sinha, Lecturer in Chemistry, to avail Home-Town LTC on 18.12.96 and an advance of Rs. 3500/- was sanctioned to him.

The Audit (AG), in its inspection report had directed that the amount of LTC advance be recovered as the amount remained unadjusted till the close of the Audit (i.e. 3.12.97).

Accordingly, the Principal, P.U. College has recovered the entire amount of advance.

Now Dr. Sinha vide his letter dated 7.9.98 (Annexure 'A') has prayed that the delay in submission of the final LTC bill be condoned. He has put forward some reasons for delay in submission of the final bill. The ground appear to be sound.

Since such condonation had been granted by the Executive Council in several cases in the past, the matter is therefore placed before the Council for consideration particularly in view of the ground that this is the first occasion in respect of Shri Sinha.

Sir,

With reference to above mentioned subject, I would like to bring to your kind notice that I have received an amount of Rs. 3500/- as the HTC Advance around 18th. December, 1996, for the block year 1996-97, from the college. Further, I could not submit the final bill of my HTC within the stipulated time as per the rules of LTC/HTC. However, I have submitted the same in the College, on the 6th Dec. 1997.

The reasons for such an inordinate delay in submitting the final bill were (i) that I was on leave last year for almost five months, from March, 1997 to August 1997; and (ii) that I was, later on, almost bed-ridden as per the doctor's advice for a month (from Sep to Oct, 1997) due to a fracture in my leg. These attributed majorly to the delay in submitting the final bill of my HTC. However, it was expected that I should have submitted the same during the time I was present on my duties, but I missed that opportunity though with no deliberate ignorance.

On the basis of the genuineness of the above mentioned grounds, I, therefore, request you kindly to consider my case as special and genuine with a separate eye, and kindly oblige me in condoning the delay of submission of the final bill of my HTC. Further, I would like to make an earnest request to you to be kind and considerate enough in doing the needful for the clearance of my above mentioned pending HTC bill.
