

SCHEDULED CASTES/TRIBES RESERVATION

Against the constitutional background provided under Article 16(4), 46, 335, 341 and 342 governing the entire reservation set up, the Central Government has provided reservations, concessions and relaxations to members of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes. The main object is not only to provide employment to these communities thereby increasing their representation in various services, but also to uplift them socially and educationally so as to make them find some place in the society. With this end in view, the constitution envisaged in the Direct Principles of state policy and elsewhere, economic and educational development of the weaker sections, particularly SCs/STs.

To ensure that relevant orders of the Government of India are actually implemented by the Universities, the UGC vide letter No.F.9-57/90(SET) dated 11.3.83 conveyed its approval to provide cent per cent financial assistance for creation of SC/ST Cells in the Universities. Accordingly, an SC/ST Cell was established in the University in the last part of 1983 to look after the work relating to co-ordination, evaluation and monitoring of the implementation of the programmes contained in the Government of India directives and other instructions and guidelines issued by UGC from time to time.

The policy on reservation as laid down by the UGC has been accepted by the University in 1985. Subsequently, on the approval of the Executive Council and also the Academic Council the following percentages of reservation were adopted by the University :-

- a) Admission to Post-Graduate : 50% (for both SC and St students)

- b) Admission to NEHU hostels : 40% (for both SC and ST students)
- c) Staff Quarters (for both : 15% for SC and 7.5% for ST
the teaching and non-
teaching staff)
- d) Direct recruitment to : 1% for SC and 44% for ST (for the
posts in Group C & D State of Meghalaya)
45% for ST (for the State of
Mizoram)
- e) Direct recruitment on all : 16.66% for SC and 7.5% for ST
India basis.
- f) Appointment of Lecturers : 22.5% for SC and ST

- g) Promotion (for the posts : 15% for SC and 7.5% for ST in Groups B,C & D and from Grup B to lowest rung of Group A)

To strengthen implementation, evaluation and monitoring of reservation orders/guidelines as stated above, the University has constituted a Standing Committee for SCs/STs. As regards reservation in respect of OBCs, the matter has also been referred to the State Governments of Meghalaya and Mizoram for lists of OBCs duly identified. In the meantime, the Executive Council has resolved to adopt the percentage of reservation for OBCs as fixed by the Government of India for recruitment to group 'B' posts.
