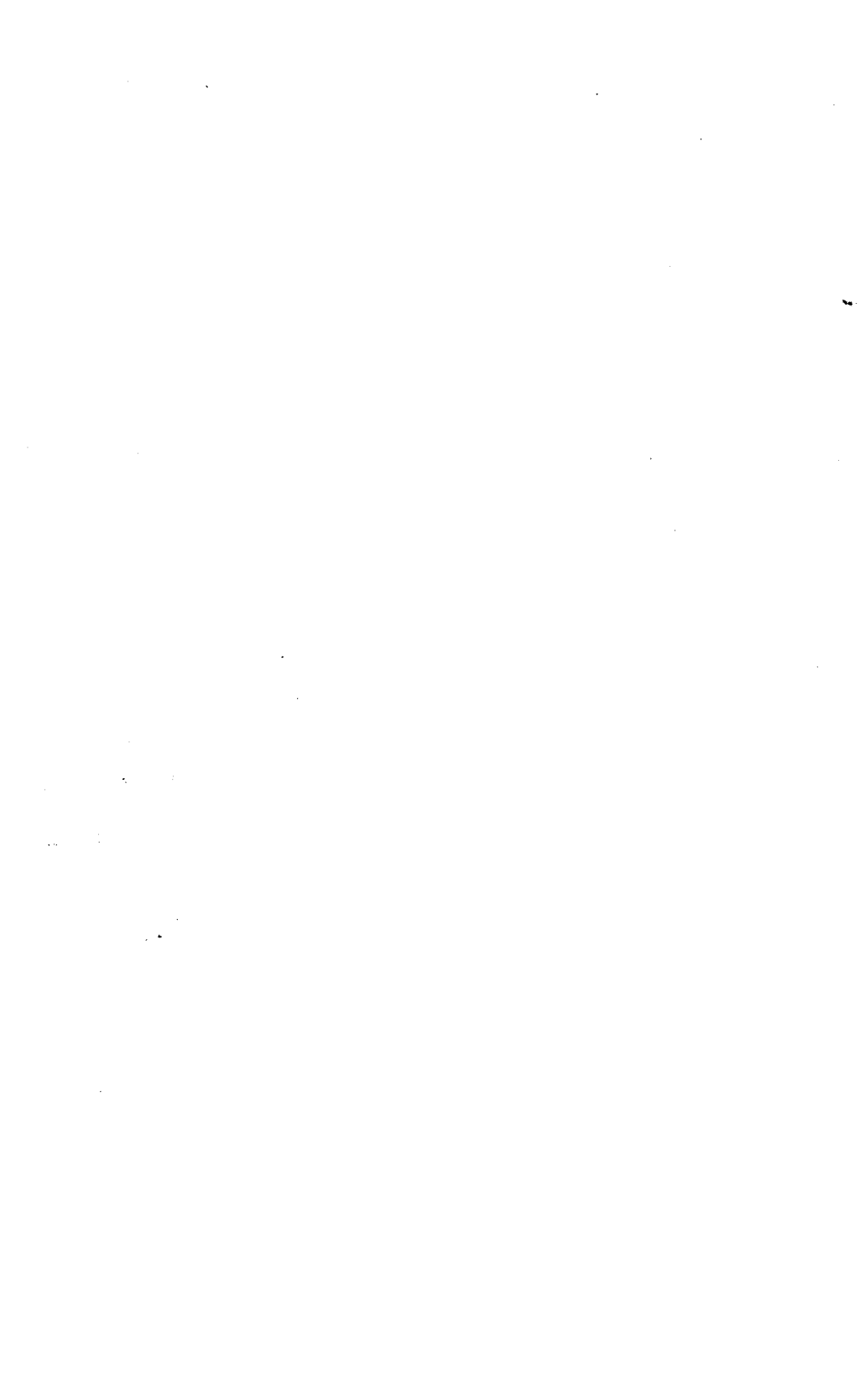

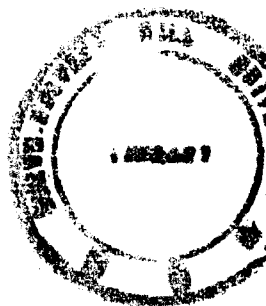

# FOREWORD

---

Occupational programming represents one of the more important thrusts in American higher education during recent years. The growth and expansion of occupational programs comes about from a recognition of the need to prepare men and women for upward mobility on the job and in society, and to meet escalating new manpower needs in the complex technological world of today. The major vehicle for this development has been the two-year college. Joseph P. Cosand, president of the Junior College District of St. Louis, Missouri, and chairman of the American Council on Education, discussed the phenomenal growth of occupational education before a Congressional committee: "A new program in technical or occupational studies springs up in a community college somewhere in this country almost every day. The sweep of such programming is phenomenal, in both the single institutional sense and in the national sense, ranging on many campuses from police science and the health services, to agricultural and environmental studies."

There are nearly two and one-half million students in junior and community colleges today. It is estimated that as many as one-third of these people are pursuing occupational education courses, sometimes known as career programs. Many persons, already employed, are counted among the thousands of those who pursue occupational education in "week-end colleges" and evening schools on two-year college campuses. The government, business and industry, hospitals, and municipal governments are among the users of the occupational education graduates. A survey conducted last year found that technically trained associate degree holders were more in demand than recently graduated Ph.Ds. Moreover, in many fields, they command excellent starting pay and benefits. Many large companies recruit technicians on two-year college campuses.

Occupational education programming and development will not be confined to the shores of this country. Many other countries have expressed interest in the manpower and human development potential of the community junior college. Again, there is recognition that traditional liberal arts or professional education will not meet the needs of the many, only the few. It is likely, therefore, that there will be widespread application of the community college idea—particularly in terms of the occupational education thrust—in many other countries during the years ahead.

Often, occupational education programs must be created and started within a minimal amount of time to meet a developing manpower need in

a given community. In planning such programs, the institution must obtain information and advice from a variety of sources. There is no ready blueprint for creating many of these new programs. An individual college may occasionally find itself in a "pioneering" position with regard to developing a new course of study. Sources of assistance and information must be found.

Thus, *Materials for Occupational Education: An Annotated Source Guide* will be welcomed by many curriculum and program planners at junior and community colleges, technical institutes and even at four-year colleges and universities. The publishers have undertaken an enormous task in assimilating this information into one book. It should prove to be a useful reference, easy to read and concisely organized.

# PREFACE

---

Educators and librarians concerned with occupational education programs face a number of special problems in locating materials relevant to curriculum needs. Perennial small budgets, the uniqueness of some of the programs, the scarcity of trade titles, and the virtual nonexistence of book-reviewing media and bibliographies in these areas compound the difficulties. The number of new occupational programs increases daily and the need for up-to-date and appropriate books, periodicals, films, and other materials grows concomitantly. The kinds of materials needed are diverse and the sources diffuse, but the problem has been largely ignored in standard bibliographic tools.

*Materials for Occupational Education: An Annotated Source Guide* has been compiled to facilitate the location of curriculum and training materials, a majority of which are available from professional and trade associations, government agencies, and private businesses. Because of the need for current, accurate information, a list of sources rather than a standard bibliography has been compiled to enable the user to find and contact the specific agencies producing materials useful to him. Since publications change and multiply, and new organizations are created, standard directories and bibliographies can rarely keep abreast of all the changes. The concerned user of such materials should be on the permanent mailing lists of those organizations he finds most useful. The materials available from these companies take a variety of forms, from pamphlets to multivolume books, from slides to 16-millimeter films, records, tapes, and multimedia kits. Periodicals include anything from weekly newsletters to quarterly or even semiannual scholarly publications. Because schools often undertake totally new occupational programs, for which no books exist, all these different kinds of media must be examined.

Though this list was based originally on my compilation of associations providing curriculum materials related to the twenty-three course offerings at New York City Community College (published as "Non-trade Sources for Technical-Vocational Curricula," *Choice*, September 1969), it has now been up-dated and expanded to cover sixty-three major instructional areas. Emphasis is on materials relevant to two-year college instructional programs, but the organizations listed also provide a rich source of career information for occupational files, useful scholarship information, and materials appropriate for various occupational levels, including vocational high schools and four-year colleges. Public libraries may find the

self-instructional and audiovisual materials, as well as the career information available from these sources, particularly useful.

I wish to acknowledge with deep gratitude the encouragement, advice, support, and aid I received from colleagues, friends, and the staff at New York City Community College, particularly Darrow Wood, Florence Becker, and Ethel Spilko of the Acquisitions Staff of the Library Department. Special thanks also go to Peter Doiron, editor of *Choice*, who encouraged me when I first began the source list, and to John N. Berry III, editor of *Library Journal*, for his continuing interest and support of the project. I also wish to acknowledge the invaluable assistance of Lee Mickle, Assistant Editor, in the preparation of the manuscript, and to thank Madeline Miele, Editor, for her unceasing efforts, guidance, and friendship in seeing the book to its completion. Last, but not least, I express my deep appreciation to my husband Alan for his infinite patience, understanding, and love.

# INTRODUCTION

---

*Materials for Occupational Education: An Annotated Source Guide* lists approximately 600 organizations which supply books, periodicals, and other media for sixty-three occupational areas. More than 3,000 associations and agencies were identified through use of the guides listed in the Bibliography under "Further Sources of Information," through discussions with librarians and faculty members, and through consultation of the few bibliographies that exist specifically for the field of occupational education. Many organizations were subsequently eliminated because of their failure to respond to repeated inquiries, or because they either do not have a publishing program or do not supply appropriate materials. Those finally included in the book were selected because their materials are directly related to specific occupational areas. However, in view of the multiplicity of associations and of industry and government training programs, as well as signs of a coming breakthrough in publishing for this field, it is suggested that this list be regarded as a basic file, to be enlarged as the reader discovers new sources related to his own needs. The listings in "Further Sources of Information" in the Bibliography are meant to aid in locating other agencies.

With the exception of the "General Sources" and "Occupational Education" sections, the broad curriculum areas are arranged alphabetically, with alphabetical subheadings for specific courses. Three sections, "Business," "Engineering Technologies," and "Health Occupations," open with a "General" subcategory. The agencies listed under this subcategory supply materials for all the instructional areas in the chapter. Under each subheading, the organizations are arranged alphabetically. There is one main entry for each company, with a complete annotation, under the most pertinent subject category. A number of associations produce materials useful in several different curriculum fields, and their names appear as cross-references to the main entry. For example, the fully annotated entry for the American Insurance Association appears under "Business/Insurance." Because this association publishes material useful for Construction Technology and Fire Science courses, it is listed in both of these sections with a cross-reference to "Business/Insurance."

The "General Sources" section includes agencies and publishers that offer materials for a wide range of occupations, and in some cases for all the fields in the book (such as the U.S. Government Printing Office). Entries in this section are not cross-referenced under each curriculum area;

the user should consult this section in addition to the specific areas of interest to him.

The "Occupational Education" section includes sources which provide background materials on vocational training in general. The "Background Reading" and "Curriculum Outlines" sections of the Bibliography list individual titles to supplement the materials found in this section.

For quick reference, an alphabetical listing of all the sources found in the book with addresses and pertinent subject areas, is provided in the "List of Sources" beginning on page 165. The category under which the main entry for each source appears is marked by an asterisk.

The annotation for each organization includes sample titles to provide an idea of the type and number of publications available, not as a recommendation or endorsement of these titles. Prices have been included only to give a general indication of price range. The aim of the annotations is not to provide complete bibliographic information for individual titles, but to guide the reader in selecting catalogs and materials for examination, to determine what materials best suit his needs.

Because of the lack of uniform information in catalogs and brochures provided by the associations, the stated aims of each association, membership qualifications, and cost benefits of membership are given only when this information was provided. Interested users may also contact an association directly or inquire of faculty members who may belong, to ascertain membership benefits. At times, a well-written letter can elicit a discount on materials, complimentary copies or even free or reduced membership fees.

Occupational education is still a growing field and a number of different terms are used to describe similar curricula. Subject cross-references will be found in the body of the book, but the user should refer to the "Index of Occupational Categories" for a more detailed subject breakdown. This index relates terminology drawn from *American Junior Colleges* (American Association of Junior Colleges, 1967) and the Office of Education's *Vocational Education and Occupations* (U.S. Government Printing Office, 1969) to the subject headings found in the book. Headings which appear in the body of the book are also listed, and fully capitalized to distinguish them from this alternate terminology.

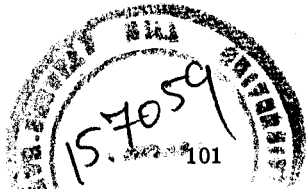

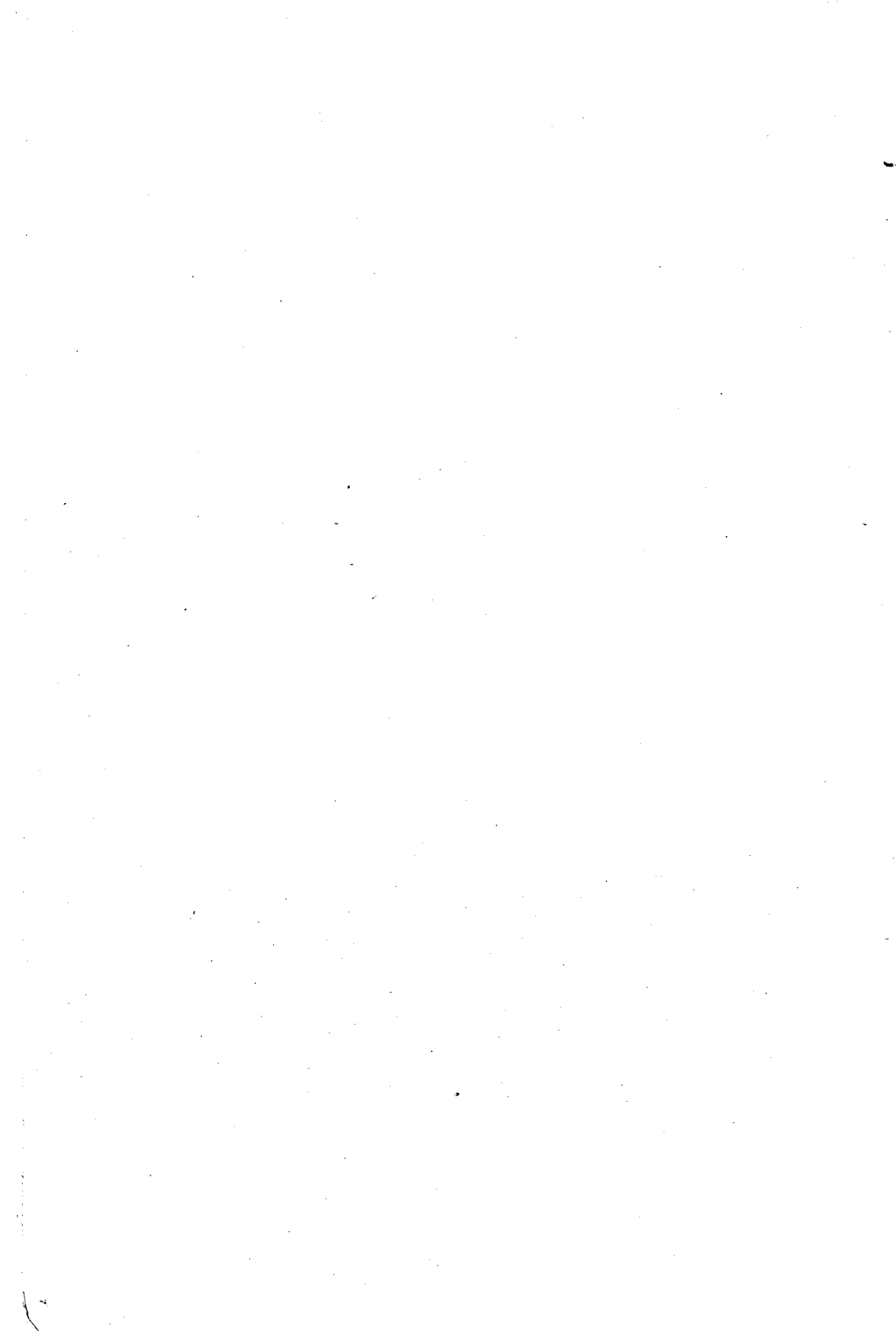

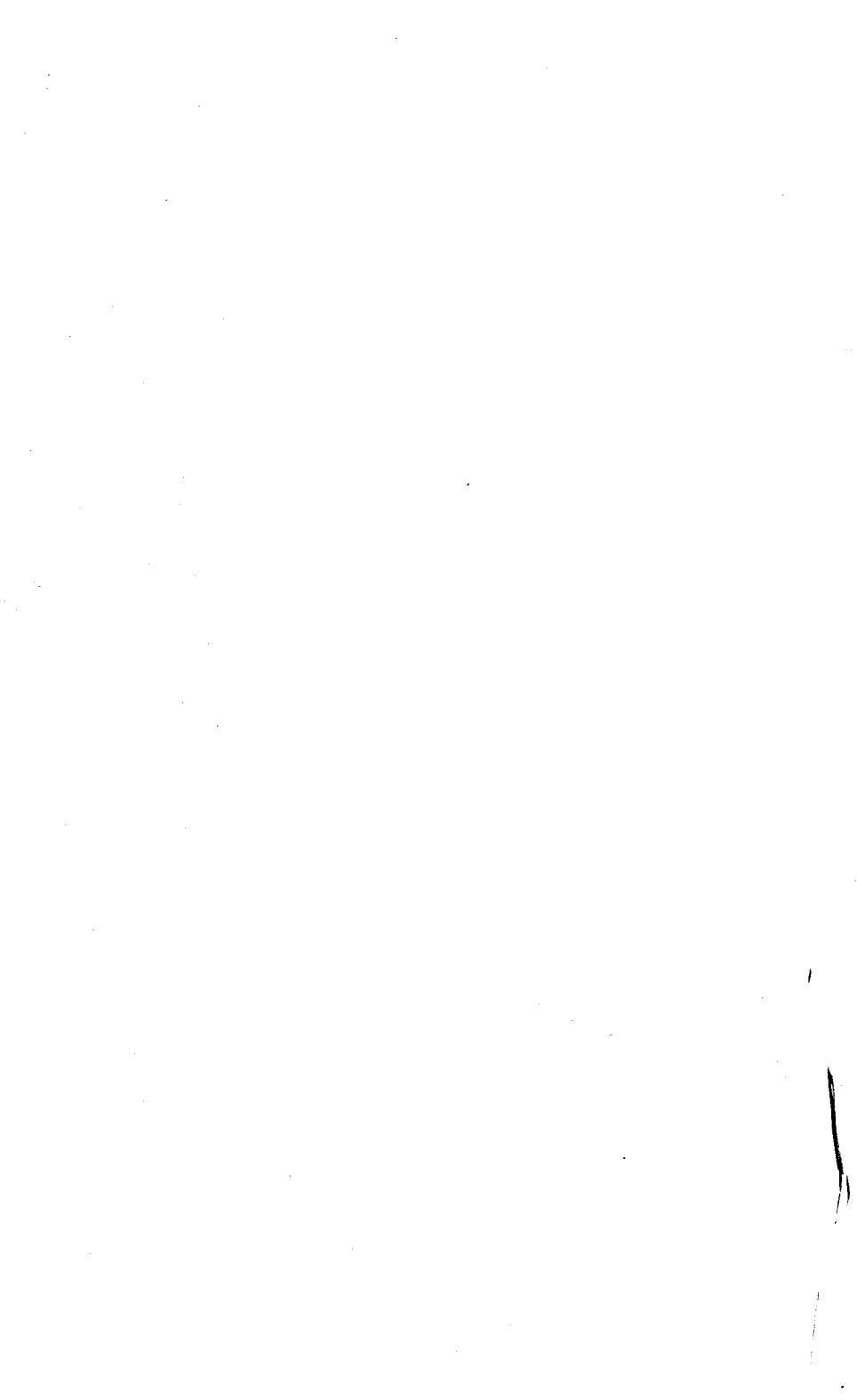
