Pending approval by the Council, the above matter was placed before the 91st meeting of the Executive Council for consideration and adoption wherein the Executive Council vide its resolution No:EC:91:96:6:6:(xii) (Annexure-II) approved the accreditation awarded by the UGC to the SLET conducted by the aforesaid States.

In furtherance to the above, the UGC vide its letter No.F.4-2/90(NET) dated 16th March, 1998(Annexure-'III') has further granted accreditation to the SLET conducted by 3 (three) more States viz.(i) Himachal Pradesh (ii) Kerala and (iii) Tamilnadu. While according accreditation to the above 3(three) more State, the Commission has also intimated that the test conducted by the Madres University on behalf of Tamilnadu State in 1990, test conducted by the Himachal Pradesh State in 1995 and Arunachal Pradesh State in 1996/97 are not accredited by the University Grant Commission

The matter was placed before the 58th meeting of the Academic Council held on 10th Sept 1998. The Council considered the accreditation of a SLET conducted by the following States and resolved not to accept the recommendations of the U.G.C. unless NER NET is recognised by the Commission.
