

(ii) Study leave in respect of Shri. B.K. Gupta,
Lecturer, Centre for Applied Statistics.

Shri. B.K. Gupta, Lecturer, Centre for Applied Statistics has applied for study leave for a period of one year w.e.f. 10.9.97 to enable him to complete his Ph.D Research at the Indian Statistical Institute, Calcutta. Shri. B.K. Gupta was a permanent employee of the University who joined on 8.9.1984.

The request of the teacher for study leave was already approved by the School Board held on 21.4.97, which recommended the leave as requested.

Hence, since the teacher fulfilled the criteria as per Ordinance, (Annexure 'A') his study Leave for the period of one year w.e.f. 10.9.97, is placed to the Executive Council for consideration.

AMENDED PROVISIONS OF CLAUSE 10 OF ORDINANCE OE-6
GOVERNING STUDY LEAVEStudy leave:

10 (i) Study leave may be granted to a permanent whole time teacher with not less than three years continuous service to special line of study or research or to make a special study of the various aspects of University organisation and methods of education.

Provided that the Executive Council may in special circumstances, waive the condition of three years service being continuous.

Explanation: In ascertaining the length of service, the period during which a person was on probation or engaged as a research assistant may be reckoned, provided.

- a) the person is a teacher on the date of the application and
- b) there is no break in service.

(ii) Study leave shall be granted on the recommendation of the concerned Department/Centre and the School Board. The leave shall not be granted for more than two years save for Ph.D. studies which may be granted for three years and in exceptional cases extended for another six months.

(iii) Study leave shall not be granted to a teacher who has not served the University continuously for a period of three years after the expiry of the last spell of the extra-ordinary leave under clause (ii) or 8 (iii) sabbatical leave or who is due to retire within two years of the date of which he is expected to return the duty after the expiry of study leave.

6:3: Leave/Deputation

- (i) Absence without leave in respect of Dr K K Dwivedi, Reader, Department of Chemistry, Shimla.

No:EC:93:97:6:3:(i): The Council considered the absence without leave of Dr K K Dwivedi, Reader in Chemistry and while RESOLVING to regularise the period of absence by Earned Leave further RESOLVED that he informed that the Council has taken serious note of his absence without prior permission and warned that he should not repeat the same in future.

- (ii) Deputation of Prof M Miri to I.I.A.S., Shimla.

No:EC:93:97:6:3:(ii): The Council considered the request of Prof M Miri for extension of the period of Prof M Miri beyond the prior of five years and RESOLVED to advise him to resume duty on expiry of the deputation term. The Council, further RESOLVED to seek for advice from the Ministry of Human Resource Development for advice in reply to Letter No.F.8-9/97-Desk(U) dt.17.3.1997 since as per Government of India's Rule as well as the University rule, the maximum period of deputation is five years only.

- (iii) Study leave in respect of Shri B K Gupta, Lecturer for Applied Statistics.

No:EC:93:97:6:3:(iii): The Council considered the grant of study leave in respect of Shri B K Gupta, Lecturer in the Centre for Statistics and RESOLVED to approve the same for a period of one year with effect from 10.9.97.

- (iv) Invitation of Prof A C Sinha to Taleem Foundation.

No:EC:93:97:6:3:(iv): The Council considered the grant of lien to Prof A C Sinha to enable him to accept the invitation for an assignment at Taleem Foundation and RESOLVED to grant him lien for a period of one year only as per University's terms and conditions agreed to by him vide his letter dated 1.1.1997. The Council further RESOLVED that he should also give an undertaking that he will continue to pay his Provident Fund Contributions to NEHU every month.
