From the Vice-Chancellor's Desk



I feel privileged to present before you the Forty-sixth Annual Report on the activities and achievements of our University for the year 2019–2020. This Annual Report is a reflection of the milestones that we have achieved through our overall endeavour to strive towards excellence. In its 46 years of existence, NEHU has achieved distinction and recognition in both academic and non-academic domain. The achievements for the period under report reflects the University's motto – **RISE UP and BUILD**.

NEHU is committed to achieving what it has been set up as objectives with a vision to develop academic leadership, keeping in consonance with the national and global perspective that values diversity and inclusion. Its mission is, therefore, to achieve excellence in teaching, learning and research, capacity building, social outreach, skill development and innovative academic programmes.

The University is spread over two campuses located in Shillong and Tura with 44 teaching departments and one centre. There are 310 teachers and 5007 students with an appreciable teacher-student ratio of 1: 16. There are 72 colleges affiliated to NEHU, which offers undergraduate and postgraduate courses in different disciplines. In this reporting period, 14502 students from the University were awarded degrees in its XXVI convocation graced by His Excellency Mr. Ram Nath Kovind, the Honourable President of India, as the Chief Guest.

The academic output involving research activities of the faculty during 2019–2020 has been satisfactory with approximately 683 research papers published in national/international journals of repute including books, book chapters and conference proceedings. The academic departments of the University organized as many as 97 national and international

seminars, conferences and symposia. Many of our faculty members were involved in 115 extramural research projects funded by national and international agencies. During 2019–2020, 29 research projects were successfully completed and a good number of consultancy services were rendered by our faculty. Several collaborative research projects were also executed by the University faculty in various disciplines of Arts, Science and Technology during the period.


NEHU signed an MoU with IIT Guwahati with the objectives, viz. IITG- academic support to NEHU, internship programmes at IITG, joint degree programmes, IITG faculty support to NEHU and vice-versa, short-term training programmes, guidance in infrastructure development, joint twinning programmes, creation of Centre of Excellence and joint short-term programmes and workshops, thus to facilitate co-operation for developing new areas of R&D at NEHU.

In a follow-up to the visit of Her Royal Highness of Thailand, Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn two years ago, the academic collaboration between NEHU and Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok was strengthened further through an animated workshop organized by NEHU, Shillong, in collaboration with a team of innovators, graphic designers and artists from Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok.

The University sent 22 number of students to Japan under the exchange programme, 'IRIS', an initiative fully sponsored by the Govt. of Japan, with an objective to promote talented students of the North-East India, to understand Japanese culture, technology in the fields of environment and disaster prevention.

The Incubation Centres at the Shillong and Tura campuses were inaugurated this year, with an objective to attract talented students to share their innovative ideas for transformation into products and thus useful for the society at large.

I would like to place on record my sincere gratitude and indebtedness to the teaching and non-teaching staff, students and other stakeholders for their untiring efforts and contributions made towards achieving the goals of the University. I am grateful to the members of the Editorial Board for their commitment in timely completion of the Annual Report, which presents a gist of valuable information about North-Eastern Hill University for the year 2019–2020.

Executive Summary

North-Eastern Hill University (NEHU) is a Central University established on May 26, 1973 by an Act of Parliament of India. It became functional on July 19, 1973 with the appointment of Dr. Chandran D. S. Devanesen as its first Vice-Chancellor. The University has its headquarters located at Shillong and a campus at Tura, Meghalaya. The motto of the University is **“Rise up and Build”**. The main objective of the University is “to disseminate and advance knowledge, pay special attention to the improvement of the social and economic conditions and welfare of the people of the hill areas in North-East India, particularly their intellectual, academic and cultural advancement”.

This Annual Report showcases the diverse activities and achievements of various Departments, centres, administrative Departments and central services of the University from April 01, 2019 to March 31, 2020.

Background

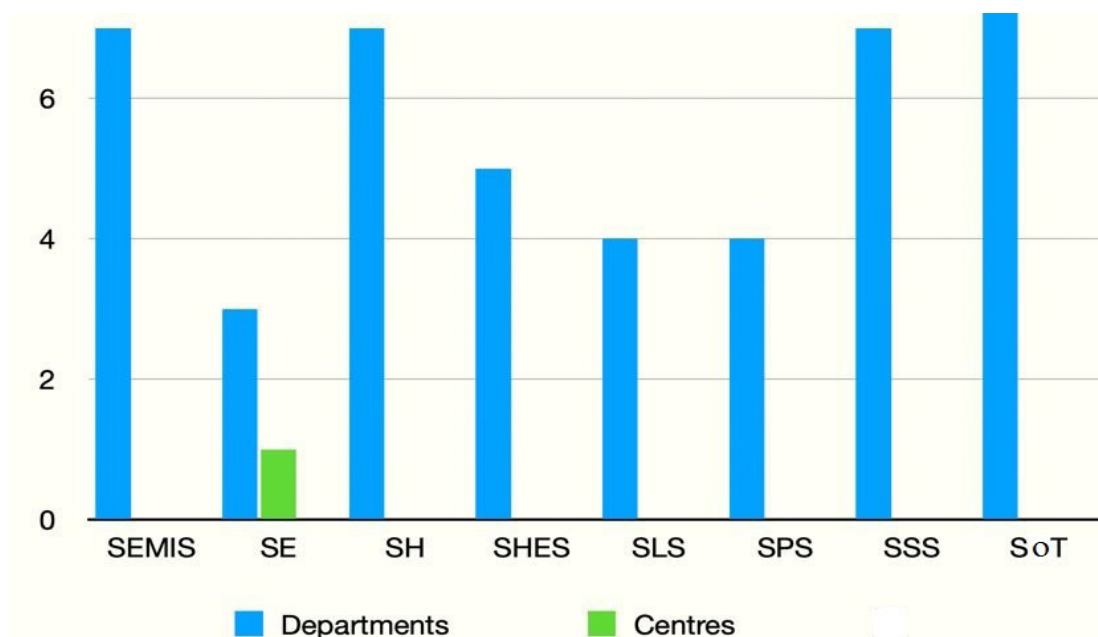


Figure 1. Departments and Centres in each School

The University has eight schools , viz. School of Economics, Management, and Information Sciences (SEMIS), School of Education (SE), School of Humanities (SH), School of Human and Environmental Sciences (SHES), School of Life Sciences (SLS), School of Physical Sciences (SPS), School of Social Sciences (SSS) and School of Technology (SoT). The University has 44 academic Departments and one centre of studies (Figure 1), while 35 Departments and 01 centre of studies are located in Shillong campus, nine academic Departments are located in Tura campus.

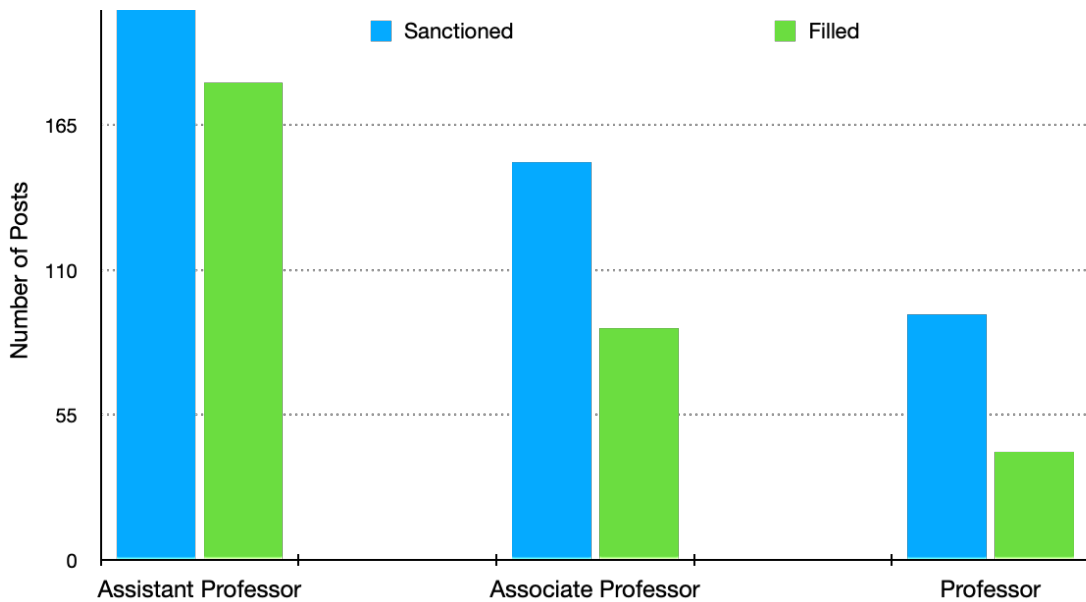
The Academic Departments of the University offer postgraduate and Ph.D. Programmes in various disciplines. Some Departments also offer undergraduate and M.Phil. programmes, in addition to conducting research and extension activities. Several Departments received financial assistance under SAP from the University Grants Commission (UGC) and under FIST from the Department of Science & Technology (DST), Govt. of India. The departments of Botany and Chemistry have been recognized as Centres for Advanced Studies (CAS) by the UGC. The University has a DBT-sponsored Bioinformatics Centre (BIC), a DST-supported Sophisticated Analytical Instrument Facility (SAIF) and the UGC-supported Human Resource Development Centre (HRDC). The University has 71 Colleges affiliated to it offering undergraduate programmes. Some of these colleges also offer postgraduate programmes. The North-Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health and Medical Sciences (NEIGRIHMS), a referral institute for medicine and health services for the region, established by the Union Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Govt. of India is also affiliated to NEHU, and offers academic programmes in Medicine and Nursing. The University has also started one Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Community College at Wahiajer, Jowai for skill development of rural people in the Jaintia Hills.

The University has received several endowments from various organizations and eminent individuals. The University has instituted several awards like the President of India Dr. Shankar Dayal Sharma Gold Medal, Smt. Sarada Krishna Iyer Memorial Award, U Tirot Sing Memorial Prize, Rajendra Kumar Sunheri Devi Jain Charitable Award, U Kiang Nangbah Memorial Award, Prof. M. K. Khare Memorial Prize, Prof. M. N. Karna Young Sociologist Award, Dr. D. S. Babu Memorial Award and Prof. S. S. Khare Promising Mathematician Award. Some of the University faculty members have been conferred with several Civilian Honours, viz. Padma Shri, Padma Bhushan etc. in the past.

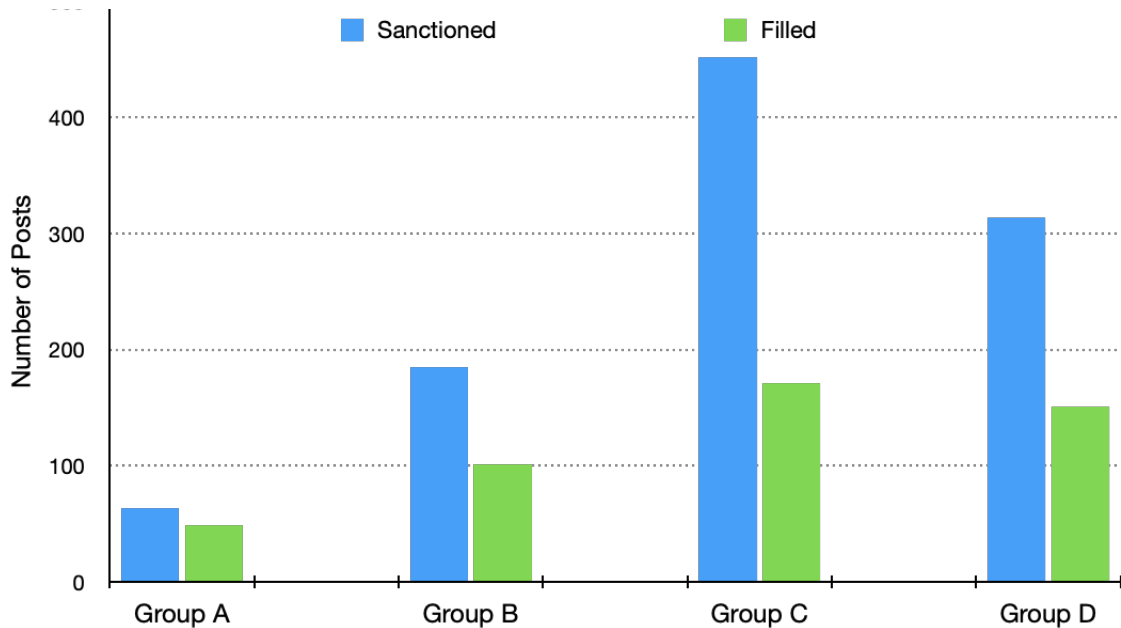
The University has Central Services, which facilitate the educational and research activities as well as health, sports and other civic activities for the general welfare of the University community. The Central Services include the Central Library, Voice and Data Network, Health Centre, Career and Counselling Cell and Students' Welfare Cell. Other Central Services are Guest Houses, College Development Council, Hindi Cell, Equal Opportunity Cell, Pension Cell, Women's Cell, RTI Cell, Internal Complaints Committee, Internal Quality Assurance Cell, National Service Scheme Cell, Incubation Centre, Design Innovation Centre, Sports Department and Campus Development Department. NEHU has extended its campus facility to house institutions of national importance, viz. Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), Indian Council of Social Science Research-North Eastern Regional Centre (ICSSR-NERC), English and Foreign Languages University (EFLU), Sports Authority of India (SAI) and the Shillong Science Centre.

Teaching faculty and Non-teaching staff

The University has 467 sanctioned positions of teachers, of which 310 have been filled and 157 posts are lying vacant (Figure 2).



The total sanctioned positions of non-teaching staff in the University are 1013. Among these 64 are in Group-A, 185 in Group-B, 451 in Group-C and 313 in erstwhile Group-D. At present, the filled-in posts are 472 and the vacant posts are 541 (Figure 3).



Student Enrolment

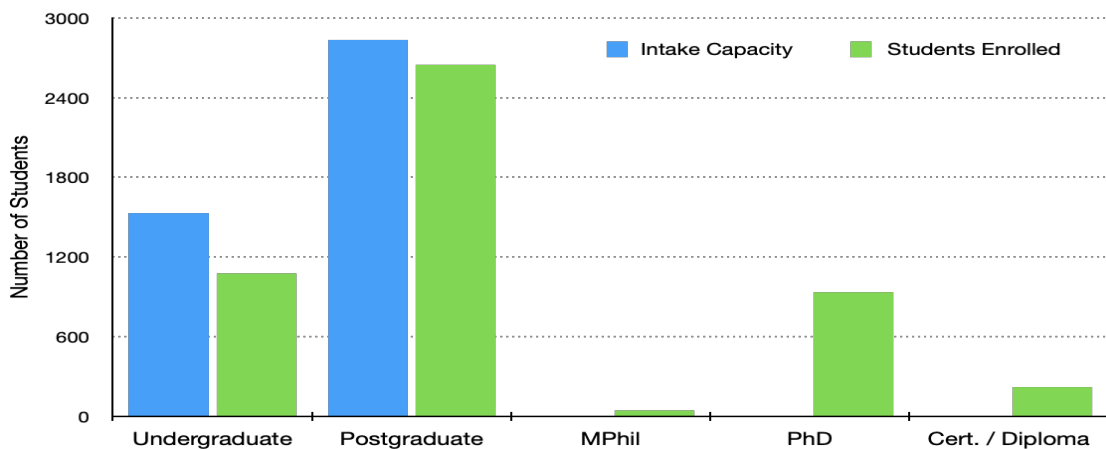


Figure 4: Course-wise Student Enrolment Status (2019 - 2020)

NEHU, a premier University of the region, attracts students from different parts of the country and from abroad. Students are admitted to different programmes in various schools according to the University Rules and UGC guidelines. The University has adopted the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for PG courses and is all set to introduce it at the UG level as well. During 2019–20, 5007 students were enrolled in degree/diploma/certificate programmes in various Departments of the University. Of them, 16 students are from Asian and African countries. The student-teacher ratio is 16:1 in the University during the period under report. The enrolment of students for various academic programmes in the University is detailed in Table 1 and Figure 4.

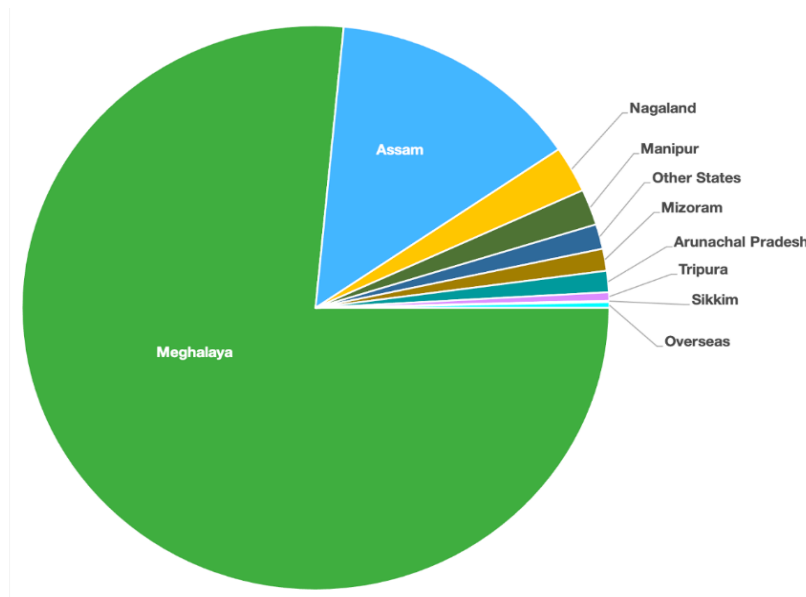


Figure 5: Student Enrolment from Within and Outside North-East India (2019 - 2020)

Figure 6. Category-wise students' enrolment in various programmes

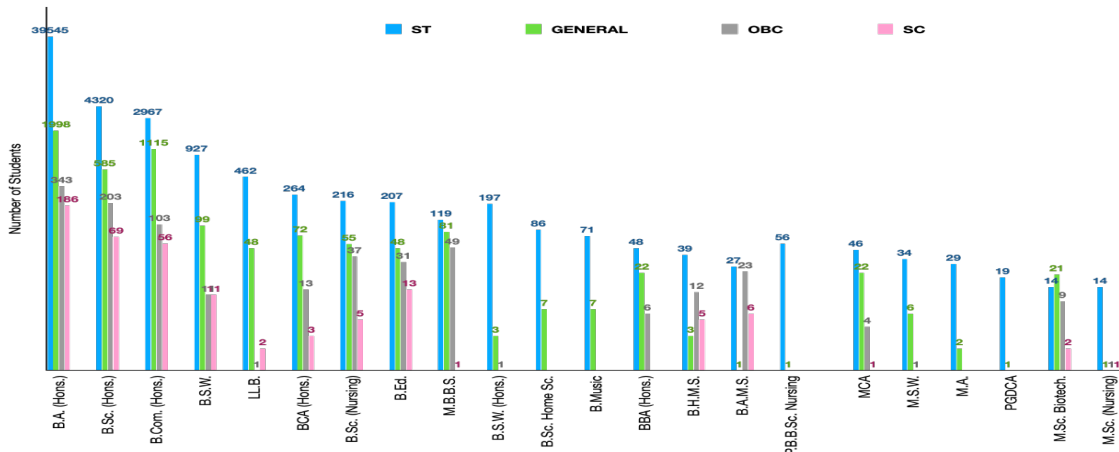


Figure 8: Course-wise Student Enrolment Status in Affiliated Colleges (2019 - 2020)

Degrees Awarded

A total of 14,502 students were awarded degrees by NEHU in 2019–20 in various programmes, as detailed in Table 4.

Publications and Presentations

- In 2019–20, various Departments of the University organized 97 academic events such as conferences, seminars, symposia and workshops of which 89 were National, and 08 were International.
- Scholarly publications in peer-reviewed journals by the faculty included 213 research papers in journals published in India and 266 in journals published abroad. The faculty members have also authored/edited 40 books and 164 book chapters in edited volumes including seminar and conference proceedings (Figure 8).
- Faculty members of the University were actively involved in 115 research projects sanctioned by various funding agencies, viz. the UGC, DST, DBT, CSIR, DRDO, ICMR, DAE (BRNS), ICSSR, ICAR and NEC, out of which 24 were sanctioned during the year under report, 62 are ongoing project and 29 have been completed.

Academic Collaborations

Academic collaboration is an integral part of teaching and research as enshrined in the Act and Statutes of NEHU. One of its main objectives is to collaborate with other universities and research organizations for such academic purposes. During the year, the University has signed MoUs with IIT Guwahati and several other institutions of National and International repute. Besides, the faculty members have also established academic collaborations with eminent scholars and scientists within and outside the country.

Hostel Accommodation

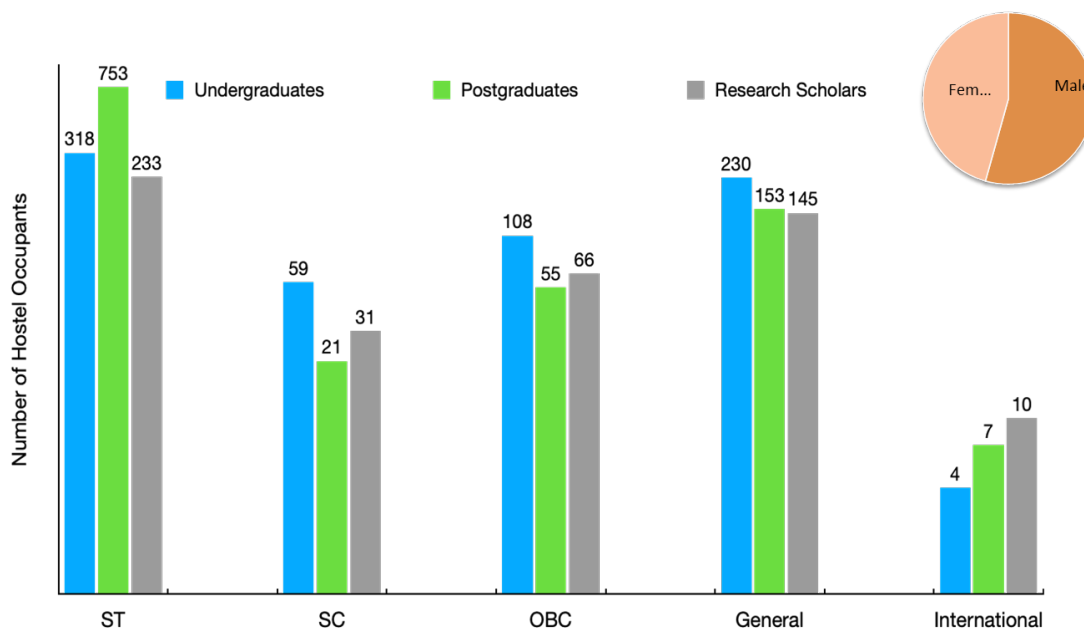


Figure 9: Number of Students provided with Hostel Accommodation (2019 - 2020)

In total, the University has 26 hostels. The Shillong campus has 12 hostels for males, 11 for females and 01 for International students whereas the Tura campus has 01 hostel each for male and female students. A total of 2193 students were provided hostel accommodation at Shillong and Tura campuses during the year under report. Of these the campus residential facility was availed by 48% female and 52% male students. As many as 1304 students (59%) belonging to the Scheduled Tribe category were allotted hostel accommodation. The category-wise number of students residing in University hostels are shown in Figure 9.

The Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) was adopted by the University in May 2019, as an integrated course of the academic curricula for all programmes of the University. The MOOC's action programme was promoted for the students and faculty in accordance with the UGC Regulation on the Credit Framework for Online Learning Courses through SWAYAM. A two-day workshop on MOOCs was organized during May 28 - 29, 2019 with the goal of acclimatizing the participants on the adoption, promotion and development of MOOCs on the SWAYAM platform.

During 2019-2020, the Hon'ble President of India, Shri Ram Nath Kovind visited the University and graced the XXVI Convocation on November 04, 2019. He conferred the Degree of Doctor of Letter (Honoris Causa) on Shri Kanubhai Hasmukhbhai Tailor, for his outstanding contributions in advancing the cause of humanitarian services for specially-abled persons. The Minister of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India, Dr. Ramesh Pokhriyal 'Nishank' e-inaugurated the Incubation Centre at Tura Campus on February 14, 2020 and the Minister of State for Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt. of India, Shri Ramdas Athawale inaugurated the Incubation Centre of NEHU at Shillong Campus on August 28, 2019.

Of the 50 members delegation from North-East India, 22 students from the University participated in the 3rd IRIS Programme (A Youth Initiative Programme undertaken by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Government of Japan), in Japan from February 01 to February 08, 2020. The University organized several events and observed the days of National and International significance as mandated by the UGC and MHRD, Govt. of India during the year.

NEHU has maintained its position as a leading Central University in building excellence and raising standards of higher education at both national and international arenas. The University is committed to achieving academic excellence by initiating and developing national and international partnerships and collaborations towards promoting the values of diversity and inclusiveness. The University enjoys a relatively higher position in terms of student-enrolment, student-teacher ratio, female-to-male ratio enrolment, and above all, teaching and research activities. The University's potential for excellence in teaching and research has also been endorsed by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), which has accredited the University with 'A' Grade. The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) has ranked NEHU 74th overall position in India and at 49th position among Indian universities in 2019–2020.

Major Highlights (2019-2020)

- **Gender Parity Index** for students' gross enrolment (female to male students) ratio is 1.30. The highest value of female student enrolment was from Meghalaya with female to male student ratio of 1.39.
- There were **16 international students** from Asian countries (Bangladesh, Bhutan, China, Myanmar, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Thailand) and African countries (Namibia, Nigeria, South Africa) for the period under report.
- **Total number of Publications** for the year 2019-2020 was 683.
- Twenty-two students from the University participated in the 3rd IRIS Programme in Japan from February 01 to February 08, 2020.
- The NSS units under NSS Cell, NEHU adopted 42 villages from Meghalaya.
- Important events organized in NEHU
 - The International Yoga Day on June 21, 2019.
 - The Run for Unity on October 31, 2019 to mark the National Unity Day.
 - The National Sports Day on October 16, 2019 in commemoration of the birth anniversary of Major Dhyan Chand.

Brief Statement of Academic Activities

is a laudable venture as it will further help in documenting and preserving the local performances and theatrical forms of Meghalaya and the nearby areas.

Thrust Areas of Research

The Department trains and creates expertise in Cultural and Biological Anthropology. It is the only Anthropology Department in North-East India with equal strength of faculty in these two major fields of anthropology. Plant and Microbial Diversity: Assessment, Characterization, Bio-prospection, and Conservation.

Brief Statement of Academic Activities

The Department offers two MSc Programmes, viz., MSc (Botany) and MSc (Plant Molecular Biology), and Ph.D.

Programme in Botany. Faculty members are actively involved in diverse areas of research in plant sciences and are operating several research projects funded by various National and International agencies. The Department is currently coordinating four multi-institutional research projects. Eleven individual research projects are also going on. The Department received a research

grant of 78.72 lakhs (Rupees Seventy-eight lakhs and seventy-two thousand) from different funding agencies (including non-plan grant from the UGC) during 2019–20. The faculty members were invited to deliver lectures at important National and International events, such as symposia and Seminars as keynote and lead speakers.

Besides regular teaching and research programmes, the Department organized one International Symposium on Buckwheat, several Workshops and training programmes. Five students were offered student fellowship within the Department and three traineeships were awarded to Post-MSc students. Eight students of the Department availed internships at various universities/ laboratories in the country. Dr. Seraj Ahmad, Dr. Diana Kharkongor, Dr. Macmillan Nongkhlaw, Dr. Fenella Nongkhlaw, Dr. Kuldeep Singh and Dr. Jauti Sharma taught some courses as Guest Faculty during the year. The faculty, staff and students received a number of awards and fellowships during the year.

Thirty-three students were admitted to

MSc in Botany and ten students to MSc in Plant Molecular Biology during the year. Twenty-nine students were awarded the MSc degree in Botany and nine students were awarded the MSc degree in Plant Molecular Biology. Eight students were admitted to the Ph.D. programme. Nine students were awarded the Ph.D. degree during the year. The research scholars participated in Workshops and training programmes at universities/institutions, and also presented papers at National and International Seminars/symposia in India and abroad. One student qualified NET and four students qualified GATE during the year. A total of thirty research papers were published in peer-reviewed scientific journals of National and International repute and conference proceedings.

Several distinguished scientists delivered talks on different topics during the year. Prof. Praveen K. Verma, Scientist VI, National Institute of Plant Genome Research, New Delhi on the topic entitled, “National insights in plant fungus interactions: from secreted effector to host target”.

Thrust Areas of Research

The Department is engaged in research under the thrust area “Faunal Diversity and Ecophysiology” in various disciplines, such as biodiversity of freshwater zooplanktons, fishes, amphibian and insects in the North-Eastern Region, adrenergic signal transduction in pineal gland, hormonal regulation of oxidative metabolism, and breeding biology of endangered fishes, amphibians and birds, cisplatin action as an anticancer drug, and efficacy of putative anticancerous plants and animals from the North-Eastern Region, biochemical adaptation to nitrogen, carbohydrate, protein and oxidative metabolism, and nitric oxide signalling under various environmental stresses in air-breathing fishes, diversity of helminth parasites and entomopathogenic nematodes in the North-Eastern Region with an emphasis on molecular taxonomy of zoonotic parasites and bioprospection of anthelmintic efficacy of plants used in traditional medicine systems, chronoendocrinology and photophysiology of reproduction, migration and moult in some birds of the region, silkworm growth and development under various environmental stresses and the involvement of hormones mediated signalling pathway, and epigenetic study of human cancer with emphasis on the role of DNA methylation.

Brief Statement of Academic Activities

The Department of Zoology offers specializations in all major disciplines of Zoology. The Department is regularly conducting the UGC Refresher Course in Zoology for college and university teachers. Faculty members of the Department have several collaborations with international and national academic and research institutions.

The Department has successfully organised several national and regional seminars, symposia and workshops having direct regional and national relevance. Besides book(s)/book chapters, many research papers were published in reputed national and international journals. The Department offers the MSc and PhD Programmes. The Department has adopted the choice-based credit system (CBCS) at the MSc level. Some research students qualified in the CSIR-UGC NET examination. Some students have acquired important faculty positions in educational and research institutions of the North-Eastern Region and other parts of the country. The total intake of students per year for MSc Zoology course is 30, and for the PhD programme it varies from 15 to 20. Faculty members and research students of the Department are recipients of various awards, distinctions and fellowships. Based on the overall academic and research contributions, the Department was awarded the three phases of DRS and the two phases of DSA programme by the UGC under its Special Assistance Programme to promote higher research with special reference to the North-Eastern Region. Further, the Department has received grants recently under the DST-FIST programme for the second time and the third phase of UGC-DSA programme. The Department has various research projects sponsored by UGC, DST, DBT, ICMR, ICAR, MoEF, etc. All these projects have a direct relevance to the socio-economic development of the North-Eastern Region. The Department is conducting seminars every week for the MSc students to deliver talks under the supervision of faculty members. The Department runs a “Zoonic Society” for various activities involving students, teaching and non-teaching staff.

Brief Statement of Academic Activities

The Department of Political Science, established in 1974, aims at building an academic community of students, researchers and teachers devoted to an open, critical and analytical study of the discipline with an emphasis on inter-disciplinary approach. It also aims at making courses and research work that are socially relevant

and developing an awareness of the basic issues and problems in the discipline so as to equip the students intellectually to fulfil these needs.

With the strength of eight faculty members, the Department has 104 students on its roll at the MA level. The School of Technology has eight Departments, namely Architecture, Basic Sciences & Social Sciences (BSSS), Biomedical Engineering (BME), Electronics and Communication Engineering (ECE), Energy Engineering (EE), Information Technology (IT) and Nanotechnology in Shillong and the Department of Computer Applications (CA) in Tura. These Departments offer various regular programmes – B.Arch., B.Tech., M.C.A., M.Tech. and Ph.D. At present, the School runs a total of 5 UG and 4 PG programmes. 7 Departments offer Ph.D. programmes.

The School has total of 55 faculties and 264 students (176 male and 88 female). In the last Convocation, a total of 16 research scholars (9 male and 7 female), 46 PG students (33 male and 13 female), and 138 UG students (98 male and 40 female) received their degrees. At present, 30 research scholars are getting fellowship. 13

B.Tech.. students got placed in Capgemini, Cognizant/Cognizant Technology Solutions Corporation, and Infosys and 5 students got placed as design engineer, site engineer, and drilling assistant.

The faculties of the School have published 112 papers in reputed journals in India and abroad besides 59 books/book chapters/conference proceedings. 6 patents were filed during the year by 4 Departments in the School. In addition, a prototype IR based thermometer, developed by one of the Departments, was used in NEHU Shillong Campus, during the initial phase of the Covid-19 pandemic. 4 Departments organized Faculty Development Programmemes (FDP) sponsored by AICTE under AICTE Training and Learning Academic (ATAL) programmes in the areas of 3D Printing and Design, Robotics, Energy Management and Audit, and Artificial Intelligence besides three Workshops and one outreach programme.

The College Development Council is an intermediary between the University and the affiliated colleges under its jurisdiction. It is the principal Advisory Body to the Executive Council and the Academic Council of the University in all matters relating to affiliation. It is constituted every two years and has representatives comprising university officials, faculty members, principals and teachers of affiliated colleges, and a representative of the Government of Meghalaya. It plans for the integrated development of the affiliated colleges by extending help, guidance and advice. Serving as an academic guide to the college system, it ensures availability and use of facilities in the University Departments to the teachers of affiliated colleges. It provides a forum for taking necessary steps on various aspects of education with a view to promoting coordination and improving the general educational standards in the affiliated colleges of the University.

In accordance with the Section 2(f) and 12(B) of UGC Act, 1956, the Council is also a liaison between UGC/MHRD and affiliated colleges in carrying out all procedural formalities regarding proposals for obtaining funds under the different schemes for the overall development of the Colleges. The Examination Department performs its routine activities that include a host of exercises such as conducting the various end semester examinations twice in the span of a year, arranging evaluation of theses/dissertations submitted by its registered scholars, facilitating holding of Convocation and carrying out other support activities for the benefit of the concerned. The Department ensured that it delivers its mandated services to the various stakeholders of the University in the best feasible fashion.

- During the period under report, the Department conducted the routine end semester examinations both at the University Departments and at the affiliated colleges and ensured, to the extent feasible, fast processing and timely publication of the results to benefit its student community. The Department takes delight in reporting that during the year, PG final semester examination results were declared within about ten days time counting from the day when the last of such an examination was held in a particular PG Department.
- During the Academic Year under review, the Examination Department, by and large, successfully managed to smoothly conduct the UG even semester end term examinations at all its affiliated institutions. The Department was able to declare all its UG end semester exam-

ination results within the stipulated time-frame which, in turn, facilitated aspiring students to join in PG programmes for pursuing their higher studies either at this university or elsewhere in the country/abroad.

- During the year under review, the University could smoothly phase out the Annual Examination System and switched over to the Semester System of Examinations for students enrolled at any of its undergraduate programmes.
- In pursuance of the Government of India's "Digital India" initiative, the Department went ahead and implemented necessary improvisation as was felt required in its ERP system aiming further streamlining of the automation initiatives it has already put in place. The system of online filling of examination application forms, registration forms, payment of various fee payable by a student/institute to the University introduced earlier have accordingly been further rationalized. This has enabled the Department to provide better services by ensuring timely issuance of Registration Cards and examination Hall Tickets. Plan are also afoot to ensure that the system of downloadable auto-generated Hall Tickets is made operative at students end in near future to all active students enrolled in the various affiliated colleges under the jurisdiction of the university.

- The University Management System (UMS) which is the University's exclusive ERP system automation solution was effectively deployed to ensure that processing of all University Departments results is handled smoothly. The process of uploading IA marks/ end semester examination marks of concerned students by the respective faculty in charge could be carried out in an error free and speedy manner thereby facilitating timely declaration of results.
- The examination Department is closely working along with the Computer Centre to ensure that facilities such as online availability of the academic credentials of students through the National Academic Depository (NAD) portal are put in place to enable them use the features available in the portal to the best of their advantage. The nodal officer in charge of NAD monitors the routine activities in this regard.
- During the year under review, the University successfully conducted various examinations of professional degree programmes offered at its own campus as also in the various affiliated institutes and brought out their results in time. Accordingly, the University conducted examinations of various Engineering, Medical and Medico related professional programmes at the North Eastern Institute of Ayurveda & Homeopathy (NEIAH), The North East Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical and Health Sciences (NEI-GRIMHS), the Woodland Nursing Institute, the Regional Institute of Technology (RIST) besides its own Engineering programmes run at its campus under the School of Technology.
- The Department has now fully integrated its receipt payment processes in the Public Finance Management System (PFMS) thereby facilitating cashless transactions towards payment of TA bills/ examination remuneration bills etc., to the concerned teachers. Examination Fee payable by the students are also being collected in online mode either through RTGS / NEFT or through SBI Collect.
- As a part of research activities and in adherence to the UGC guidelines in such matter, the University Departments, in coordination with the Examination Department conducted coursework examinations for the enrolled M. Phil and Ph.D. Scholars. The results of the Course Work examinations have been brought out within the stipulated time frame.
- The Examination Department receives scores of requests from external agencies for verification and authentication of certificates / documents issued by this University for the purpose of employment. The Department has taken all feasible measures to ensure that such requests are responded to and disposed of as expeditiously as possible by according them the priority they demand and deserve.
- The Examination Department as part of its regular workload did engage in preparing various data sheets as and when required for their onward submission to the concerned authorities such as the UGC, the MHRD and such other government or statutory bodies.
- The Department responded to scores of RTI queries by individuals or various government or non-government agencies as the case may be with all the promptness.
- The Department remained engaged round

the year in the preparation, sorting and sending of examination related materials to all concerned and by and large, was able to stick to the relevant schedules for each such job.

- During the year under review, the Examination Department took proactive steps to streamline the academic calendar at the undergraduate level with a view to ensure improved teaching-learning time and ambience at colleges without curtailing the permissible vacation time in any manner.
- During the year under review, the Examination Department played a key role in organizing the XXVIth Convocation of the university wherein 2019 batch Graduates and PG students besides hundred plus Ph.D. and M.Phil. Scholars collected their Award certificates in person.
- The Examination Department during the year under report had tried to have, to the

extent feasible, an open door policy to its stakeholders to sort out various issues that arose from time to time and, in its bid to do so, had organized several meetings with various stakeholders that included the students, the teachers and the Principals of various colleges and institutes.

The year under review was hectic as usual for the Examination Department. It, however, makes the people currently deployed here somewhat happy that it could attend to most of its call in a reasonable manner. Scope for improvements in a system that needs to attend to so many diverse and even divergent calls obviously are ample. Brief Statement of Academic Activities

The Bioinformatics Centre (BIC) at NEHU has been set up and funded by Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Ministry of Science & Technology under the Biotechnology Information System Network (BTIS) programme since November 1999 with a view to cater to the needs of the scientific community in the far-flung north-eastern region of the country and to augmenting their research activities through information inputs. As a part of National Bioinformatics Network, the Centre serves as an information base in various areas of Biosciences and conducts various training programmes and Workshops on Biodiversity Informatics. The Centre is part of the National Bioinformatics Network and functions as an information base in various areas of Biosciences and Biodiversity, being associated with *Information node of BTIS net*, for the entire north-east region. This Centre also serves as a nodal centre for NEBInet,

DBT, GOI, Biology teaching (BIF-BTBI) Centre's since 2008 for all the 8 states of North-East. This Centre has 2 DICs and 26 Bioinformatics Facilities. It is also a *Nodal centre for operating DBT-sponsored Online Access Facility of Library Resources (OA-FLR)* for 36 Secondary and Senior Secondary Schools in North Eastern States of India through 8 BIF-BTBI Coordinators.

- The Centre offers DBT e-Library Consortium (DeLCON) facility comprising of a total of 917 selective Journals and a Database (SCOPUS) for the University as one of the 18 nodal Centres in the North-Eastern Region.

Dressing Room: Dressings, injections and minor surgical procedures are carried out in the dressing room.

Observation Room: In the observation room, moderately sick patients are administered I. V. drips etc.

Referral : Patients requiring in-patient treatment are referred to the hospitals/ specialists within Shillong and thereafter outside Shillong depending upon the necessity.

Ambulance: Ambulance service is provided during emergency for transporting the severely sick patients from residence to Clinic/Hospitals.

Emergency Duty: The Resident Medical Officers and resident nurse in campus are doing emergency duty and attend to medical calls; outside duty hours whenever needed.

Credit Billing Facility: This facility is available for patients admitted to Nazareth and KJP Synod Robert's Hospitals in Shillong and CMC Hospital, Vellore (Tamil Nadu).

First Aid: First aid service is provided at various sport tournaments organized by the University.
